### **BULK PICKUP GUIDELINES**

(as per the City of Plantation Waste Disposal Department)
Bulk Pick Up will **NOT** pick up the following:
Electronics, Glass, Mirrors, Paint cans, X-rays
Any construction materials - including dry wall.
You should not box anything – place in the clear City of Plantation bags.

You can put empty cardboard boxes out.

Tuesday - blue bags and clear recycle bags Friday - BLUE bags ONLY Once a month - bulk pick up

# **MODIFICATION NEWS**

If you are doing any modifications to your home or plex, you need to fill out the Lauderdale West paperwork and have it approved by the Board. # LAWNS, LANDSCAPING, FENCES, HEDGES

### Per our DOCs:

"All portions of a LOT not occupied by a building or other permanent structure shall begrassed and kept as a lawn. No trees, shrubbery, or other forms of landscaping shall beinstalled or maintained unless the same shall have been first approved in writing by the BOARD, which approval may be arbitrarily withheld. No fences or hedges shall be permitted anywhere within the SUBDIVISION except as approved by the BOARD, whichapproval may be arbitrarily withheld."PLEASE DO NOT PLANT OR PLACE ANYTHING IN YOUR FRONT, BACK OR SIDE YARD. THAT IS COMMON AREA.

### LOST AND FOUND

# **MAINTENANCE ISSUES**

There have been some issues over the last few months regarding our Maintenance department and what they will charge for certain services. Please read:

Regarding emergency calls: When you call Maintenance after hours, make sure you truly have an emergency and not a situation that can wait until the next business day. If one of our Maintenance staff goes to your home and it is NOT a true emergency, then the homeowner will be billed for the overtime expense. An example of this would be one toilet is clogged, but you still have another working toilet.

Regarding Excessive Maintenance calls dealing with the same problem: It is during the first visit that the resident is instructed what is needed to correct the problem. It is the second, third and sometimes the fourth call that shows the resident does not always comply but continues to call Maintenance.

The Board has discussed this and has decided to start fining residents who do not comply and fix the problem. After the second visit for the same problem, the resident will receive a letter stating the problem and the need to fix it. If there is a third call, the resident will then be fined \$50 for non-compliance as well as the cost of the maintenance call for the problem. An example of this would be if the resident keeps calling maintenance for a clogged toilet — it is found that the resident is flushing cleansing wipes into the toilet (even those stating they are flushable). After the second visit, the resident will receive a letter stating they should not flush anything except toilet tissue down the toilet. If there is a third call for a clogged toilet due to cleansing wipes, the resident will be fined \$50 plus \$300 for the repeat plumbing call.

# FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK....

By the time you read this I hope that our 2017 hurricane season is over. I must say this again: we are extremely lucky as a Community that Hurricane Irma did not wreak havoc more than she did. I went to a Plantation Common Council Meeting on October 25, 2017 and we were advised that the City obtained their FEMA declaration!!! This means that FEMA will reimburse the City some 75% of the cost of debris removal on our private roadways. We were also told that the State will contribute 12.5% of the cleanup cost. The City has made one pass on our public streets and will be making another pickup shortly which will include our private roadways. However, if there is anything other than tree branches or leaves on or within the debris pile, that pile will not be picked up. Hopefully these several sentences will be obsolete by the time you are reading this as all the debris will be gone! Please be patient!

Now is an appropriate time to review your homeowners insurance (HO3 for single family homes and HO6 for plexes). There were a small number of single family home roofs that were damaged. Several homeowners discovered that their hurricane and wind damage deductible was ten percent of their home value which on a value of \$200,000 is, of course, \$20,000, which they have to pay themselves to repair their roof and whatever interior damage was caused by Irma. While your yearly premium will be less with a higher deductible, you have to look at the big picture and whether you can afford a lump sum payment of some \$20,000 if we are hit with another hurricane. God forbid!

Just to reiterate: Lauderdale West is not responsible for damage to your single family home roof or interior damage caused by "acts of God" - hurricanes, wind, flood or the like. You are! You must carry the appropriate insurance!

Elections for six Director positions will be held in March of 2018. I urge you to run for the Board. You must file your Intent to Run with Arline Marcus, our Secretary, before noon on February 12, 2018, and, if you wish, you may submit a resume or information letter on one 8 & 1/2" by 11" sheet of paper to Arline by February 16, 2018. This will be included in the election mailing. Our First Notice will be mailed to you on or before January 25, 2018.

As you may know, your Directors run the business that is Lauderdale West. All Directors are volunteers and we have no management company. We are self-managed. Your Directors are in the clubhouse generally from 9 am to noon, Mondays through Fridays. This is a serious commitment and, therefore, we need individuals who are willing to work long and hard for the betterment of our Community. Having said that, however, I can tell you that we have a wonderful group of Directors and on occasion we may be heard laughing and just having a good time!

Our Painting Chairman, George Hill, will be overseeing the painting of 82 single family homes, ten duplexes and nine fourplexes and the cleaning of approximately 100 tiled roofs for the 2018 season. Weather permitting, cleaning of roofs should begin in December.

The Spectaculars will be performing for us on Sunday, December 17th at 2 pm. Sandy Spector and her dedicated singers always entertain us and those costumes! Fabulous!

Don't forget to get your tickets for the New Year's Eve Party!! DJ's and performers Marcel and Marcella will be entertaining us and they are fabulous! Put your dancing shoes on and join us. Tickets are now on sale.

When you need to hire someone to do work in your home, be sure to check the insurance and license of the person. The person/company needs to have a recent license by the City of Plantation if they live in the City. Be sure to see a copy of their insurance to confirm they have coverage.

Whatever you do, NEVER hire someone who just knocks on your door and offers to do any/all work for you. This will cost you in the long run for poor workmanship and problems that will arise which they cannot pay for. They may also rip you off and cause more damage to your property.

Do not wait until there is a problem and wish you had hired a licensed/insured worker.



# YOUR MAINTENANCE DOLLARS AT WORK

As you are reading this, the City of Plantation and FEMA should be finished collecting the hurricane debris by November 30.

EDJ has been hired to thin, clean and grind the stumps of all the trees in the front and back yards which were damaged by Irma. Because of all the rain, the ground was saturated so the trucks had to wait before beginning.

Regarding irrigation, we are unable to do any lawn watering due to the felled trees which uprooted many of the irrigation pipes throughout our entire community. Once the irrigation is up and running, we can then start to repair these damaged pipes. Hurricane Irma has set us back but at least Mother Nature is keeping our grass green with all of the rain. We have a target date of December 1 for Phase 1 to be completely automated – up and running. We will then be able to do wet checks in that Phase 1 area only. Phase 2 will begin immediately following this completion.

All the boring under the roads have been completed throughout the community. As they go into phase 2, they will be digging a trench to install the 2-wire system connecting to the valves. You will see many flags, the locators for AT&T and Comcast wiring. Please do NOT remove any flags.

We are moving ahead – the upgrade is coming along and we again, thank you, our Lauderdale West residents, for your patience.

# MAINTENANCE TIP OF THE MONTH

With the cooler season coming, now is the time to have that furnace checked out. Your heat is provided by your A/C unit outside, by a heat pump.

A good rule of thumb is to have your A/C company check the unit out. Also, remember that when turning it on for the first time, you may smell a burning odor. This is dust on the coils burning off. Keep warm!

# **FEMA SCAM**

People trying to represent themselves as being from FEMA are taking advantage of people with hurricane damage.

PLEASE NOTE: If you have had any damage from Hurricane Irma, YOU must initiate the first contact with FEMA. FEMA will NOT just come and ask you if you need anything. They will NOT knock on your door. Do not talk to these people. If you have a NO SOLICIATION sticker on your door, call the police.

Again, YOU must initiate the first contact with FEMA if you have hurricane damage.

# MAINTENANCE PROCEDURE

If you have a situation which needs the Maintenance Department, you MUST contact Edna in the Maintenance Office **directly** at 954-473-2595 or by email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org. DO NOT ADDRESS OUR MAINTENANCE STAFF CONCERNING YOUR ISSUE.

When you call the Maintenance Office, you will receive a **work order number** which you will need to KEEP until your job is completed.

You will be given a time frame when Maintenance will come to your home. IF THE WORK TO BE DONE IS IN-SIDE YOUR HOME, please make sure you are home or your **work order** will be closed and you will need to call and make a new appointment. If the work to be done is outside your home, you do not need to be at home when the work is done.

Please do not address our Maintenance staff concerning your issue – this will only delay your job getting done.

LW will only rent out room 113 for immediate family functions up to 70 people. We will no longer be able to rent out the JBA. The cost to rent room 113 is \$50; set up and clean up is \$50; security deposit is \$500. ### **BLOOD PRESSURE**

Need your blood pressure checked? Come to the Main Clubhouse every Thursday from 9:30 – 10:30 a.m. If we don't use them, the paramedics will not provide this service.

# PEST CONTROL POLICY CHANGE

Dead Bug Edwards has been very generous in their spraying inside units for small ants. Unfortunately, some of our residents expect monthly sprayings.

Effective immediately, if you have excessive repeat calls for spraying inside for the small ants, due to crumbs or food, etc., you will be charged for the spraying, \$115 per spray. You will be allowed 2 inside sprays per year; anything more will be deemed excessive. Please be sure you clean up and not leave food out or have crumbs. Thank you for your cooperation.

# **MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD**

Many of us have large "brown spots" on our lawn from the hurricane debris laying there or mulch areas where trees were removed.

Do not do anything with those areas. Do not place anything on those areas. Those are common areas and lauderdale west will take care of them. Eventually grass will grow there and be part of the lawn.

# **SWIMMING POOL RULES**

This is just a reminder that everyone must follow the posted pool rules, especially:

- · Do not prop open a pool area gate
- · Shower BEFORE entering the pool
- · No diving allowed
- Children must be supervised by an adult at all time in the pool area, especially in the water
- · No jumping, running or loud noise in the pool area
- · No food or drink or glass in the pool area
- Vacate the pool area during rain, thunder or lightning sitting under the metal awnings is dangerous

The Lauderdale West Community Association reserves the right to deny the use of the pool or pool area to anyone at any time for just cause.

# POOL CLOSES EVERY EVENING AT 6:30 PM

You must vacate the pool area at 6:30 PM every evening. If you do not, you will be trespassing.

### **BAIT BOXES**

Throughout our community there are rodent bait boxes set up by our pest control company, Dead Bug Edwards, to deter/kill rats. We live in a watered community and whenever you have water, you are more susceptible to rats.

Dead Bug Edwards will be inventorying, cleaning, filling each box. They have been put around the perimeter properties as well as on water properties. You, our residents, have been asked not to touch the boxes. If boxes are missing, LW will need to replace them, an expense we hope we do not need.

Dead Bug Edwards is evaluating the situation regularly. If a rodent problem shows up, boxes can be re-placed to be more effective. We ask that you do not need to call requesting a box. Dead Bug Edwards knows where each and every box is located as each box's placement is marked on a large LW map.

These boxes are baited with poison which the rats take back to their nests, hopefully infecting the nest, thus killing more rats. As these boxes are throughout the community, around houses and plexes, AGAIN, we ask our residents **NOT** to touch or move these boxes. They are being checked regularly and replenished as needed.

Should you develop a rodent problem, please call Maintenance at 954 473-2595 and report it.

Once again, DO NOT TOUCH these boxes or move them. Thank you.

# FYI SINGLE FAMILY HOME OWNERS

Have you had your outside electrical box checked by a licensed electrician lately? If your answer is no, you should. The original boxes used aluminum wiring when our houses were built. Many of these become frayed over the years, causing a possible fire hazard. Wiring, now, should be copper.

To be on the safe side, contact a licensed electrical contractor to check and update your outside electrical box.

Now that Hurricane Irma has left Lauderdale West quite a while ago, it is time to take down all the hurricane shutters, plywood and any other hurricane precautions including tape on the windows. Thank you for your efforts - they worked!

# **ALERT! ARE YOU COVERED?**

There may be some confusion about what insurance coverage home owners in Lauderdale West need. The 'Plex" buildings, from the interior wall paint outward, are insured by the Lauderdale West Association. In case of total or partial destruction, the Association is responsible for repairing or replacing the building. Owners of Plexes should insure their personal belongings only, such as appliances, furniture, fixtures, etc.

The single family homes **ARE NOT INSURED** by the Association. Owners of SFHs should insure the structure as well as the contents, and must have hurricane insurance; flood insurance is an option to purchase.

The Association **WILL NOT** repair or replace a single-family home in case of flood or hurricane damage.

## ATTENTION PET OWNERS

If you are a pet owner in Lauderdale West you have obligations you must abide by to be in good standing:

- A doctor's letter is required stating your need for a "comfort dog"
- You must register your pet with the Applications and Approval office (Sales/Rental)
- · You must show a current license

By following these guidelines, everyone benefits, including your pet. Failure to register and show the above requirements will result in fines. Thank you for your cooperation.

# The following are the violation *fines* per day:

Overnight parking of unauthorized vehicles/trailers, etc.	\$100
Overnight parking on swales, lawns, clubhouse parking lots, etc.	\$100
Unauthorized signage (political, for sale, etc.)	\$50
Unauthorized colors on fascia, shutters, etc.	\$50
Failure to illuminate: pole light per night; rear security light(plex)	\$20

# The second notification for the same violation within 6 months automatically imposes a fine of \$100.

\*Allow to add to this list as need may arise.





# LAUDERDALE WEST VIOLATION PROCEDURES AND FINES

# When a resident violates a rule, the following is the procedure in the Fining Process:

### Procedure:

- 1. A resident in violation will receive an initial letter regarding a maintenance/violation issue.
- 2. A recheck of the property will be performed and if necessary, a second letter is sent regarding incomplete issues.
- 3. If the incomplete issues are not corrected within 15 days from the date of the second letter, Board approval will be obtained and a Certified letter will be sent stating the fine which is to be paid within 30 days from the date of the Certified letter.

This letter will also state that Lauderdale West will proceed to do the work and charge the resident for the work in addition to the fine.

When a resident receives the Certified letter stating the levied fine(s), the resident has the right to a hearing before the LW Fining Committee, within 15 days of receiving the Certified letter.

If the resident would like to request a hearing, the resident needs to go to the Main Clubhouse, fill out the Right to Hearing Form and turn it in to the Board Director overseeing the Fining Committee.

The Fining Committee, which meets two(2) times a month, will make the ultimate decision to confirm or reverse the fine. The Fining Committee is comprised of owners from each of the four(4) phases in Lauderdale West and one additional owner, the Chairperson.

Second or subsequent offense of same violation within six(6) months— automatically doubles the fine.

- "Ding Dong School" with Miss Francis (why couldn't my teachers be like her?).
- · "Captain Video", starring Al Hodge, was TV's first ad-

venture space show. Flash Gordon, Tom Corbett "Space Cadet" and Rocky Jones "Space Ranger" protected Earth and saved our universe.

- · "Rootie Kazootie" with Polka Dottie and Gala Poochie.
- "Robin Hood" with Richard Greene as the legendary Prince of Thieves.
- "Sea Hunt" with Lloyd Bridges.
- "The Mickey Mouse Club" with Annette, Jimmy Dodd, The Mouseketeers and the unforgettable M-I-C-K-E-Y theme.
- The action-packed TV westerns Hoppy, Roy and Dale, Paladin, Zorro, Cheyenne, Matt Dillon and the great Lone Ranger starring Clayton Moore and Jay Silverheels (Tonto) taught us that justice and fairness were always the best policy in the Old West.
- "American Bandstand" with Rock and Roll's pied piper,
   Dick Clark.
