

Bulk Pick Up should not be put out until Monday afternoon, AFTER 5 pm, as LW does not need to look like a junk yard. Place bulk pick up AWAY from the mailboxes.

BULK PICKUP GUIDELINES

(as per the City of Plantation Waste Disposal Department)

Bulk Pick Up will **NOT** pick up the following: Electronics, Glass, Mirrors, Paint cans, X-rays

Any construction materials - including dry wall.

You should not box anything – place in the clear City of Plantation bags.

You can put empty cardboard boxes out.

GARBAGE PICK UP

Tuesday - blue bags and clear recycle bags

Friday - BLUE bags ONLY

Once a month - bulk pick up

FYI – by Plantation Code,

you need a permit to make any plumbing or electrical changes. LW is not responsible to fix a problem if you did not get a permit.

A permit assures a plumbing or electrical change is done properly – to code. It is for your protection.

MODIFICATION NEWS

If you are doing any modifications to your home, SFH or plex, you need to fill out the Lauderdale West paperwork and have it approved by the Board. If you are not available to come in during regular hours, 9 am – noon, you can call Kristi Woods, 954-473-8219, ext. 109, during the morning hours and set up an appointment.

Any resident doing any improvement, including hurricane modification, is asked to fill out a form BEFORE the modification so the information about your unit is up to date in the LW files and proper permits may be obtained.

If your modification causes a problem, such as a leak, you are responsible for the repairs.

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK....

Your Board of Directors are diligently working to complete our 2019 budget. While our meetings are open to all owners, sadly, only one or two people attend those meetings. Yes, I am aware that many residents work but many don't. I can only cull from this that our residents believe the Directors act with the best interests of the owners in mind – which we do. Our Annual Budget Meeting will be held on Monday, December 10th at 7:30 PM in the auditorium. Please attend.

Five director positions will be open in March. A First Notice will be in the mail to all owners in January outlining the process. As I'm sure you are aware, the Board is made up of all volunteers; we have no management company; and we work every day to run the business that is Lauderdale West. All owners are welcome to run. Just be aware that it is a commitment and you will work very hard for the present and future of our Community.

The showing of movies in the clubhouse has been cancelled due to the fact that we do not have a license to run them. It does not matter whether or not we charge residents to view them. We are looking into obtaining the appropriate license but the cost may be prohibitive for the number of people who attend. We will keep you posted.

As of this writing, we are still working with our insurance company to complete the Hurricane Irma settlement. We have received monies to replace over 100 plex roofs that were damaged and are working to settle the rest of our costs, such as cleanup; irrigation repairs; tarps; mailboxes and posts; light posts; air conditioners and the like. Our property insurance policies have a 2% deductible. We hired a private insurance adjuster to maximize our recovery with the insurance company. And, of course, there are always attorneys' fees involved. Therefore, whatever settlement we reach may not be enough to cover all our expenses. We do have a total of \$120,000 in our budget to offset some of those deductibles and costs.

Having said that, we may have a shortfall in our budget because of Hurricane Irma. I don't want to alarm anyone but I need you to be aware that an assessment may be required at some point in the future. One way to deal with that is, right now, check your insurance policy to be sure you have loss assessment coverage. This coverage may provide a portion of the funds for whatever assessment is needed. If you do not have loss assessment coverage, you can still obtain it but make the call to your insurance agent now. As long as you have the coverage before any assessment is levied, you will be covered.

Our Painting Chairman, George Hill, has submitted his painting plan for 2019. We will be painting 82 single family

homes; 10 duplexes and 9 fourplexes. Approximately 105 older tile roofs will be cleaned and 90 newer tile roofs. We will be treating a number of plex shingle roofs. I personally want to thank George for his hard work and dedication to Lauderdale West.

We have upgraded our telephone system in the clubhouses and maintenance building. As anyone who has tried to call us is aware, we have had many problems with the current system: you are not able to reach either maintenance or the main clubhouse; calls dropping; busy signals, just to name a few. We discovered the problem was new technology with old phones. We have purchased and installed new phones and we're up and running again!

If you use the fitness room, you will notice we have two new pieces of equipment. We purchased a Spirit CE800 recumbent cycle and a Spirit CR800 elliptical trainer. I hope this will encourage more people to utilize our fitness room and get healthy. Please use these with caution as with all other equipment in our fitness room.

The Board is looking into trading in our current bus for a new, smaller bus. We do not have the need for such a large bus any longer. Ridership is down and we no longer have clubs or organizations that regularly use the bus. We will save money on gas and the driver will not need a special license to operate it. The new bus will, of course, be wheelchair and handicapped accessible. Basically the same design – only less seats.

Bushes, flowers, trees, statues and the like continue to appear on our common ground, which is any grass area. These plantings, etc., are not permitted without prior Board approval. Items such as these hamper the lawn cutting and irrigation repair, not to mention is contrary to our documents. We are beginning a campaign to clean up our common areas to restore the natural grass areas. When you receive a letter from the Association asking you to remove these items or paint your awnings, or whatever the case may be, please do so immediately to avoid further consequences.

Do not feed the wildlife! They become dependent on our generosity which is not good for their health and wellbeing. Not only that, their feces may contain the salmonella bacteria! This is not healthy for us!!! Please read this article: www.nsf.gov/discoveries/disc_summ.jsp?cntn_id=137557.

The on-going discussion today is the need to clean your gutters. Driving around the community, one can see leaves piling up and trees growing out of many gutters. As stated in the last issue, this causes damage to the fascia board. Excessive moisture also attracts termites. Now that residents are getting new roofs and then updating their gutters, which are now 6" wide, they are filling up even more. This is the owner's responsibility. If you are not able to do this yourself, you need to hire someone. Please heed this information – if not, you could be charged for replacing the rotted fascia in years to come.

Irrigation update: Hurricane Irma really put us back a whole year due to the amount of damage it caused. We are still working in Phase #3, the largest phase in LW. Unfortunately, everything takes longer than expected. The irrigation company needs to repair the breaks from the hurricane before they can address the irrigation project.

Once completed, Joanne and I will go on a wet check for the completion of that phase.

Trees: Currently, EDJ is waiting to install 48 trees. The City has marked where the trees go (need to be installed). We are now awaiting for the locate company to locate all the underground wires. This is where we are as we cannot plant any trees until we know where the wires are underground.

Maintenance: With the newly purchased water tank, we will start cleaning all the sidewalks around the clubhouse. After the first of the year, we will start cleaning the sidewalks around the plexes. The Maintenance department is still working on updating the men's and women's lavatories at the Satellite. Once done, it will be brand new, from the floors, to the stalls to the showers – new tiling, new toilets and new showers.

Happy Holidays from the Maintenance Department.

IMPORTANT IMFORMATION REGARDING YOUR NEW ROOF

Your new roof should not be pressure washed or painted for at least seven (7) years. You cannot paint or clean the flashing above the fascia board. It must remain in its original, white condition.

You, your agent or contractor should not walk on the roof.

If you have any leaks or concerns about your roof in the future, you should immediately contact our Maintenance Office at 954-473-2595.

If you, your agent or contractor walk on the roof, wash it, paint it or perform any maintenance or repairs, you, as owner, will be responsible for any and all costs of repairs or replacement of the roof in the future as you will void our contractor's warranty.

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me, Barbara Bucci or a member of your Board of Directors.

Thank you for your anticipated cooperation.

MAINTENANCE PROCEDURE

If you have a situation which needs the Maintenance Department, you MUST contact Edna in the Maintenance Office **directly** at 954-473-2595 or by email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org. DO NOT ADDRESS OUR MAIN-TENANCE STAFF CONCERNING YOUR ISSUE.

When you call the Maintenance Office, you will receive a **work order number** which you will need to KEEP until your job is completed.

You will be given a time frame when Maintenance will come to your home. IF THE WORK TO BE DONE IS IN-SIDE YOUR HOME, please make sure you are home or your **work order** will be closed and you will need to call and make a new appointment. If the work to be done is outside your home, you do not need to be at home when the work is done.

MAINTENANCE ISSUES

There have been some issues over the last few months regarding our Maintenance department and what they will charge for certain services. Please read:

REGARDING EMERGENCY CALLS: When you call Maintenance after hours, make sure you truly have an emergency and not a situation that can wait until the next business day. If one of our Maintenance staff goes to your home and it is NOT a true emergency, then the homeowner will be billed for the overtime expense. An example of this would be one toilet is clogged, but you still have another working toilet.

REGARDING EXCESSIVE MAINTENANCE CALLS DEALING WITH THE SAME PROBLEM: It is during the first visit that the resident is instructed what is needed to correct the problem. It is the second, third and sometimes the fourth call that shows the resident does not always comply but continues to call Maintenance.

The Board has discussed this and has decided to start charging residents who do not comply and fix the problem. After the second visit for the same problem, the resident will receive a letter stating the problem and the need to fix it. If there is a third call, the resident will then be charged \$50 for non-compliance as well as the cost of the maintenance call for the problem. An example of this would be if the resident keeps calling maintenance for a clogged toilet – it is found that the resident is flushing cleansing wipes into the toilet (even those stating they are flushable). After the second visit, the resident will receive a letter stating they should not flush anything except toilet tissue down the toilet. If there is a third call for a clogged toilet due to cleansing wipes, the resident will be charged \$50 plus \$300 for the repeat plumbing call.



BAIT BOXES – UPDATE

Throughout our community, there are rodent bait boxes set up by our pest control company, Dead Bug Edwards, to deter/kill rats/rodents. We live in a watered community and wherever you have water, you are more susceptible to rats.

Each box is numbered and has been specifically placed in the rear of the property against the house.

Each box is marked on a map.

The boxes are filled with **poison**.

Do not TOUCH the boxes.

Do not move the boxes.

You will be **fined** if the box on your property is not in its designated position.

If a rodent problem occurs, call maintenance at 954-473-2595 and report it.

Broken or missing bait box replacement cost is \$22. We will charge the resident when one is missing.

In January, we will begin upgrading the boxes to new, heavier ones as mandated by the State of Florida.

Again, please DO NOT TOUCH - POISON

ATTENTION SNOWBIRDS

Welcome back to sunny Florida and Lauderdale West. Before you get too settled in with all your activities, please take a moment to come into the LWNews office, room 121 in the Main Clubhouse, and change your address to receive the LWNews here. It only takes a minute so you will be all set to receive the paper and be up to date with all the activities and shows that are taking place. If you have changed your phone/cell number(s), please update with the Application/Approval office(former Sales/Rental).

SHUT OFF VALVES

If you are remodeling a kitchen or bathroom and you are putting in a new sink, counter or vanity, it is your contractor's responsibility to move the turn off valves for access to shut off the water.

NOTICE TO LANDLORDS

If you have purchased a property in Lauderdale West within the last year and you are thinking of renting it out before the 1 year waiting period, please be advised that you will be fined \$100 up to \$1000, and those to whom you rent, will be evicted. Please abide by our DOCs.

BUYER BEWARE

When you need to hire someone to do work in your home, be sure to check the insurance and license of the person. The person/company needs to have a current license issued from the City of Plantation if their business is within the City. Be sure to see a copy of their insurance to confirm they have coverage.

Whatever you do, **NEVER** hire someone who just knocks on your door and offers to do any/all work for you. This may cost you in the long run for poor workmanship and problems that could arise which they cannot pay for. They may also rip you off and cause more damage to your property.

Do not wait until there is a problem and wish you had hired a licensed/insured worker.

VERY IMPORTANT INFORMATION

We have been asked by the Waste Management Company to remind our residents NOT to put glass and/or mirrors out for pickup – regular garbage or bulk pick up. These create a hazardous situation due to the ease at which they break. Thank you for your cooperation.

• Let us not walk alone - use the buddy system and walk during daylight

• Let us all post our No Solicitation signage and not be afraid to call the Police's nonemergency number (954-797-2100) it is good to be safe rather than sorry.

OFFICE PROTOCOL

For our Board to be more efficient in the handling of their responsibilities (duties), a procedural policy has been instituted:

1. Please make your first stop the Administrative Office, room 108;

2. Let them know the area of your concern.

3. The Administrative Office will then let the Board member overseeing that area know you are waiting in the lobby.

4. All persons are discouraged to walk into the President's office or any other Board member's office with their concerns.

5. All persons are discouraged from lingering around a Board member's door waiting to be seen – Please wait in the lobby where you will be called when it is your turn.

EVERYONE'S TIME IS IMPORTANT AND THIS WILL HELP IN HAVING OUR RESIDENTS SEEN IN A TIMELY FASHION.

We ask for your cooperation to enable the Board to budget their time to conduct the business of Lauderdale West. Thank you.

EMERGENCY EXIT DOORS

In the Main Clubhouse there are double glass doors that are alarmed for security purposes. There is red signage on each door stating that it is an **Emergency Exit - Do Not Use**.

If you choose to ignore this signage, you will receive a letter stating not to use the doors and if you do it again, you will be fined \$50. Please - obey the signs.

SWIMMING POOL RULES

This is just a reminder that everyone must follow the posted pool rules, especially:

- Do not prop open a pool area gate
- Shower **BEFORE** entering the pool as this is a Health Department regulation
- · Do allow residents who are swimming laps the right of way
- if you are just standing, walking or talking in the pool
- · No diving allowed

• Children must be supervised by an adult, at all times, in the pool area, especially when they are in the water

- · No jumping, running or loud noise in the pool area
- · No food or drink or glass in the pool area
- Vacate the pool area during rain, thunder or lightning sitting under the metal awnings is dangerous

The Lauderdale West Community Association reserves the right to deny the use of the pool or pool area to anyone at any time for just cause.

The following are the violation *fines per day*:

Overnight parking of unauthorized vehicles/trailers, etc.	\$100
Overnight parking on swales, lawns, clubhouse parking lots, etc.	\$100
Unauthorized signage (political, for sale, etc.)	\$50
Unauthorized colors on fascia, shutters, etc.	\$50
Failure to illuminate: pole light per night; rear security light(plex)	\$20

The second notification for the same violation within 6 months automatically imposes a fine of \$100.

*Allow to add to this list as need may arise.





LAUDERDALE WEST VIOLATION PROCEDURES AND FINES

When a resident violates a rule, the following is the procedure in the Fining Process:

Procedure:

1. A resident in violation will receive an initial letter regarding a maintenance/violation issue.

2. A recheck of the property will be performed and if necessary, a second letter is sent regarding incomplete issues.

3. If the incomplete issues are not corrected within 15 days from the date of the second letter, Board approval will be obtained and a Certified letter will be sent stating the fine which is to be paid within 30 days from the date of the Certified letter. You will be notified that the Board will discuss your issue. You can attend the Board meeting but you CANNOT speak at the LW Board meeting concerning your issue.

This letter will also state that Lauderdale West will proceed to do the work and charge the resident for the work **in addition to the fine.**

When a resident receives the Certified letter stating the levied fine(s), the resident has the right to a hearing before the LW Fining Committee, within 15 days of receiving the Certified letter.

If the resident would like to request a hearing, the resident needs to go to the Main Clubhouse, fill out the Right to Hearing Form and turn it in to the Board Director overseeing the Fining Committee within the 15 days. You will be allowed to speak to the Fining Committee concerning your issue.

The Fining Committee, which meets two(2) times a month, will make the ultimate decision to confirm or reverse the fine. The Fining Committee is comprised of owners from each of the four(4) phases in Lauderdale West and one additional owner, the Chairperson.

Second or subsequent offense of same violation within six(6) months– automatically doubles the fine.





COPING WHEN YOU LOSE THE LOVE OF YOUR LIFE

Recently, my beloved wife Christine passed away after a valiant fight with cancer. The death of a close loved one, puts you in a club that almost no one wants to belong to: a place of heartfelt sorrow, disappointment, sadness and "what ifs." The

death of your spouse is like no other because usually your spouse knows you better than anyone else on the planet your good points as well as all your warts and blemishes and they are your best friend who always has your back.

When grief strikes, even when you are prepared for it, the experience can still be surreal since you may not be able to tell what you're feeling as the experience begins to seep into every pore of your being. Many people initially feel numb or simply "out of it" while others may immediately go into denial.

The mental and emotional toll the death of a close loved one can have on you is often a heavy load to bear since there are so many unknowns within the grieving experience. For instance, you may begin to beat yourself up, wondering "Where did I go wrong?" "What if I had listened and done things differently?" When you are in such a heightened feeling state, it's important to be gentle with yourself and minimize self-blame.

With hindsight, many things could have been done differently. But, it's also important to acknowledge that most likely, since you had good intentions, you made the best decisions possible under the circumstances, based upon the information you had at the time.

Since the death of a close loved one can cause you to feel and experience deep emotions such as guilt, numbness, sadness, depression or regret all at once, here are a few tips you can use to steer your path through the grief maze:

Acknowledgement: You must move past denial that your loved one has died and that your life will never be the same. Although this may be a painful realization for you, the sooner you can do this, the more likely you'll be able to regain your equilibrium.

Grieving is Unique: There is no right way or wrong way to grieve. Don't allow others to tell you how or what you should

be feeling. There is no "normal" way to grieve, however, should you become depressed or experience complicated grieving, then you need to seek professional help.

Accept Support: Research studies demonstrate time and again that you'll have a better chance of recovering and being able to move on with your life when you have and use a social support system. Allow others to assist you at this difficult time since studies show that when you isolate yourself, you increase your risks for depression and anxiety disorders.

Re-Engage with Life: A key aspect of healing grief is to start re-engaging with people and activities that make you come alive. Perhaps you used to dance; so, start shopping for some new dancing shoes and go dancing! The fact that you lost your close loved one should create a new awareness that putting things off "until I retire" may not be the best strategy for living a full life.

Seek Professional Help: For most of us, negotiating the territory of grief is not an easy experience. Consider reaching out to your medical doctor, therapist or other health practitioner for advice should you feel "stuck" or unusually despondent. Remember, getting professional help when grieving is not a sign of weakness but of strength!

Remember to Celebrate: This may seem counter-intuitive but the more you focus on the good times and fond memories you have of your dearly departed love one, you may find yourself chuckling unexpectedly and smiling more often as you clearly recall the good times you had together. Consider placing a few favorite photos in your purse or briefcase to look at regularly. Perhaps you'll experience what I felt: a lifting of a gloomy cloud of sadness to one of joy and relief that my sweetie pie is now resting peacefully without pain and that the world is a better place because of her generous actions just like in the movie "It's A Wonderful Life" starring Jimmy Stewart and Donna Reed.

Let's turn our thoughts to America's number one sport, professional football. The debate with sports fans always rages over who's the best quarterback. I made a list of the greatest pro football quarterbacks in history. With apologies to the others who didn't make the final cut, here are the best field generals in pro football history:

Johnny Unitas (Louisville): The Colts got him for \$7,000 after he was cut by the Steelers in 1955. With his high-top shoes and crewcut hair, he was the General Patton of pro football. Throwing to Ray Berry and Lenny Moore, Unitas led the Colts to victory in football's greatest game, the '58 overtime Championship Game. He was simply the best.

Roger Staubach (Navy): Drafted in 1964 in the tenth round, clean-cut Roger "the Dodger" made Tom Landry's Cowboys

into "America's Team". With his insane desire to win, he became the greatest complete come-from-behind quarterback in history.

Terry Bradshaw (Louisiana Tech): The tough, free spirited number one pick in 1970 overcame a rocky start to become the heart of Pittsburgh's dynasty, leading them to four Super Bowl victories.

Joe Montana (Notre Dame): The perfect leader for Bill Walsh's San Francisco 80s offense, he was a three- time Super Bowl MVP. When the game was on the line, he was the greatest two-minute master. He was also good the other 58 minutes.

Dan Marino (Pittsburgh): It's hard to believe 26 players were chosen before him in the 1983 draft. The best quarterback who never won the Super Bowl was the driving force for Don Shula's Dolphins in the 80s and was the finest pure passer of the modern era.

John Elway (Stanford): The first player taken in 1983, he was also drafted by the N.Y. Yankees. Winning two Super Bowls, Elway was a human highlight film and always excited the fans in the stands.

Brett Favre (Southern Mississippi): Top gun of the 90s, smart, accurate, physically tough and competitively confident, he brought Green Bay to the top.

Peyton Manning (Tennessee): The first pick in 1998, he lifted the Colts teammates and franchise to new heights with his masterful touch and gallant leadership.

Tom Brady (Michigan): Drafted in the sixth round, Brady never lost a big game, time just ran out. A five-time Super Bowl champion and MVP before he was 28, in 2007, he broke every major single season passing record.

LAUDERDALE WEST NEWS

The Poinsettia, also known as Christmas Star, is an important plant species of the diverse spurge family (Euphorbiaceae). It is particularly well known for its red and green foliage and is widely used in Christmas/Holiday floral displays. Poinsettias received their name in honor of Joel Roberts Poinsett, who introduced the plant to the United States in 1828. Poinsett was a botanist, physician and the first United States Ambassador to Mexico. This species is indigenous to Mexico.

The colored bracts, which are often mistaken for the flower, are most often flaming red, but can also be found in pink, white, yellow, purple, salmon and multi-colors are actually leaves. The colors of the bracts are created through photoperiodism, meaning that they require 12 hours of complete darkness for at least 40 days to change color. Any incidental light during these nights (like from a nearby television set or from under a door frame) will hamper bract production. At the same time, the plants require abundant light during the day for the brightest color.

In the US there is a common misconception that the poinsettia is highly toxic but are only mildly toxic to cats and dogs. Among children it would be mildly irritating to the skin or stomach if eaten. More recently, because of the influx of iguanas, the Poinsettias that are planted or placed outdoors will be at their mercy. It is a plant that the iguanas love to eat.




