NEW GYM OPENING SOON!

Early in 2020 there was a major roof leak in the main clubhouse gym. It provided us with the opportunity to rethink how we could upgrade and expand the gym as part of our renovation projects. The old gym was crowded, and residents had to wait for machines which were outdated and breaking down; the satellite clubhouse was not being used. The Board of Directors seized the opportunity to expand the gym and to increase the number of machines and equipment that would be available for our residents and guests by moving the gym. Use of the gym had increased significantly; so, when we did the budget for 2021, we added funds to upgrade the gym. The new gym is complete and within budget. There is new LED lighting, ceiling fans, a professional gym floor and custom wall to wall mirrors. We purchased additional professional equipment and we now have 2 elliptical machines, 5 treadmills, 3 incumbent bicycles, 2 Nordic Trac bicycles, 2 regular stationary bicycles, 2 weight benches, a complete set of free weights and a cable machine for weightlifting and rowing. This new gym has enough room to work out safely. There is plenty of parking and easy access. You will be required to sign the attendance book before each session, and all machines must be cleaned before and after use by the resident or guest. We hope to have a grand opening ceremony soon.

PRESIDENT

Thank you for your notes in appreciation of our Covid-19 Vaccine distribution. It was a great success due to the wonderful volunteers who worked to ensure everyone's safety. I also must thank the Board of Directors and our loyal volunteers for their help and dedication in coming into the Business Office every day and performing the work of the Association. The Board has been working diligently to develop the business office into a management platform by incorporating more technology into our daily operations. Our recent purchase of new computer software will enable the Association to work with increased efficiency.

Since the election, we have reorganized our Director responsibilities. These changes will utilize the strengths and experience of each Director. It is common practice for management to evaluate the efficiency of our policies and procedures so we can establish best practices. We are developing standards for future boards to follow. We are always looking for volunteers who have the time as well as the computer skills to help.

1. Renovations and Upgrade of the facilities:

We are continuing to upgrade and renovate all of our rooms in the main clubhouse. Due to flooding, the fitness room has been moved to the Satellite Clubhouse which was not being utilized. This enabled us to double the space and purchase additional professional gym equipment. The gym is ready for the grand opening and gym rules are published in this edition of the LW News. The library is being moved down to the area where it originated, in the former space of the gym. The ceiling and walls have been painted and all new LED lighting installed. The bookcases have been painted and the volunteers have started sorting the books. We hope this room will be ready for a grand opening when we get back into the clubhouse. The main pool renovation is complete, and the new landscaping installed. The new pool furniture is on order and should be here in about 2 weeks.

2. **Covid-19 Restrictions:** We are still operating under the Emergency Powers granted by Gov. DeSantis. Broward County restrictions remain in place, mask wearing, social distancing and sanitizing are still required of public places. The Broward County Department of Health has been regularly inspecting the pool as required and we have passed all inspections. At this time, all facilities including the pools, and other amenities at LW will remain closed for the health

and safety of our residents. We continue to monitor the CDC site, the Department of Health site and the Broward County site for any updates and changes. The latest information from Broward County Commissioners is that they voted to consider reducing some restrictions in Phase I if the following criteria are met. Increasing the rate of vaccinated persons in Broward County to 50%. At the present time we have only 29% persons vaccinated in the County. Reducing the rate of hospitalizations to under 5%. As of this writing (April 15, 2021), the rate remains over 7%. They anticipate that it may take at least 3 more weeks to reach those goals. We will keep you posted when the restrictions change. We have told you on several occasions that we do not have the funds or the personnel to comply with the restrictions. As we have done for the past year, we will continue to keep you informed about information related to the opening of our facilities.

We know that this has been terribly hard and inconvenient for everyone, including the members of the Board. However, the repeated phone calls, emails, and public and personal harassment of the Board to open the pool by a small, select group of about 25 people is disturbing. For every person who has chosen to behave disrespectfully and mean. we want them to know that we will not respond to mob rule or bullying. It is, and will be, the decision of the elected Board of Directors to decide what is the best for the Association. For every bitter person who called or emailed, we heard from more kind, patient and understanding residents who appreciate our diligence and they have encouraged us to continue to keep our pools and gym closed for the safety of everyone. They have told us that we are not the only pool in town and there are pools and gyms open outside our Community for residents that want to use them.

3. **Maintenance Fees:** There will be no refunds on maintenance fees. Your maintenance fee is determined by the budget that you received in the mail. Many of you have asked for a reduction due to the lack of use of the amenities. Please note that there is no budget item for use of any amenity. There are budget items for service and maintenance of all our facilities which require payment. We must comply with all Federal, State and Local laws as they relate to proper service and maintenance of all facilities. No one pays to use the pool, gym, or any other amenity. The salary line item in the budget is for our maintenance staff. The Board does not get paid. Everyone on the Board of Directors is an unpaid volunteer. We receive no salary or any other financial benefit. Board Members receive no compen-

sation, in any form, for the work that we do. We do not get a discount on our maintenance fee. Yes, we work for free. We work a minimum of 20 hours a week, many of us work 20-30 hours a week to meet our fiduciary duty. As amazing as that sounds, we work for the Association because we care about our Community and will always do our best to ensure that we can remain self-managed. It becomes more and more difficult each day, but we will continue to do our best to make the right decisions which sometimes are not popular.

4. **Exterior Home Maintenance:** For the past 2 years, the Board has been reporting on the exterior home maintenance project to upgrade the look of homes in our Community. It has been noted at quite a few Board meetings, on channel 901, on our website and even on the front page of the newsletter. We also published the entire home inspection report in the last issue of the LW News, so you would know exactly what we are looking at. We cannot understand how residents claim they were not made aware of home inspections. This continues to be an issue with residents who stubbornly refuse to take responsibility for their

plantings around their home. If you bought a home with a porch, patio, railing, planting bed, bushes, or trees close to your home it is your responsibility to maintain those. If you have written board approval, it requires you to maintain it regularly. We do not target anyone. We do not discriminate: we are not trying to punish or burden anyone. We simply want our Community to appear clean and neat. Everyone signed a contract to follow the rules, please stop trying to kill the messenger. It is time for each homeowner to walk around your home with the home inspection report in your hand. We have published on page 32 of this newsletter a copy of the report we use. We will give you time to get the work done but if you do not do it, our documents permit us to do the work at your expense. At the present time home inspections are done for painting, roof repair and replacement, termite fumigation, sales, rentals and when identified by our many volunteers that a home needs attention. We appreciate everyone's cooperation in helping us be proud of our Community.

COMMUNICATING WITH THE BOADD



With the increased use of the internet and text messaging, we often expect instant communication and responses. This is especially true of owner communications with the Lauderdale West Board. Because your communication to the Board may raise certain legal issues for not responding timely, and sometimes emails end up in spam filters, the Association must insist on certain formalities regarding communication.

Your first step should be to check our Website (www.lauderdalewest.org), as many of our governing documents are available to view or download from there. If you don't find what you are looking for, requests to inspect documents and written inquiries by owners must not be sent via email or text message to the Board. Instead, the request must be in writing on paper. If it is a request to view a document (e.g., I want to see the financials for December), it need not be sent via certified mail. The Board will set up an appointment within ten (10) business days of receipt of the letter. Please note: the Association is not obligated to provide you with copies, but merely to allow you to review the document(s). If you wish something copied, you will be charged twenty-five cents per page. If it is a written inquiry (e.g., Why did we choose Contractor A vs Contractor B for this project?), it needs to be sent to the Board via certified mail. The Board will respond within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt, unless one of the statutory extensions applies.

The Lauderdale West Board of Directors cannot take any action on information provided in a letter, voice mail or phone call without the name and LW address of the person making the report.

FROM THE EDITOR

I cannot tell you how proud I am of our President, Jennie Lipari, for her hard work in procuring the Covid-19 vaccinations for our Lauderdale West Community! We would like to remind all homeowner's that they are responsible for the exterior portion of their homes. If you purchased a home with existing hardscaping (porches, patios, and driveways) and/or existing landscaping (plants, borders, trees and bushes), you are responsible to maintain it on a regular basis. Lauderdale West has a process in place for Violations and Fines which are assessed against a homeowner for failure to maintain their home in a neat and clean manner. If you receive a Home Inspection Report, please make sure to take care of it before you are assessed a fine which may start at \$100 and increase rapidly. Fines may also be assessed for illegal parking, feeding ducks, unleashed dogs, failure to clean up after your animal, driving the wrong way in the parking lot and vandalism to LW property. We all need to work together to keep LW safe and to maintain our property values.

IMPORTANT NOTICE LW LANDSCAPING MAINTENANCE

We are presently dealing with old and overgrown plantings on common areas that were installed by homeowners without written Board approval and have not been maintained regularly. We have started to remove these plantings because they are in the pathway of the mowers and interfere with proper lawn maintenance such as fumigation, fertilization, irrigation, and grass trimming. These overgrown plantings on the common area provide a haven for snakes, rats and racoons which can pose danger in our Community. To replace these plantings, we plan to install lots of smaller flowering trees which will not pose a hazard during storms.

If you have written approval for these plantings, please contact the Board immediately to avoid removal of your plantings. This is the only notice you will receive before plantings are removed.


FYI-BYPLANTATION CODE

You need a City of Plantation permit to make any plumbing or electrical changes. Don't forget you also need to complete the paperwork with our Director in charge of modifications, Kristi Woods, for these and other modifictions such as doors, windows, gutters, driveways, etc. A permit ensures a plumbing or electrical change is done properly – to code. It is for your protection.

If you have sold your house in Lauderdale West and will be moving out, you may hold a one-day sale provided you receive permission from the Board President. Should you not get permission, you will be asked to shut the sale down immediately.



Please remember, you may not place any signs on Lauderdale West property. Thank you for your cooperation and best of luck in your new home.

If you are interested, please call the Clubhouse any morning from 9 AM until Noon and you will be directed to the room coordinator.


LOST & FOUND


Used needles must be placed into a Sharps container. A Sharps container can be purchased for minimal cost at:

Lauderdale West was sectioned off into four phases by the developer: Phase 1 consists of all the plexes; Phases 2, 3 and 4 are single family homes.

BULK & GARBAGE PICKUP



Bulk Pickup: Tuesday, June 15, 2021 **Tuesday, July 13, 2021**

Please DO NOT put Bulk Pickup items out until Monday afternoon AFTER 5 PM the day before Bulk Pickup is scheduled. LW does not need to look like a dumping ground. Place Bulk Pickup AWAY from the mailboxes, trees, and street signs. Thank you for your cooperation.

BULK PICKUP – Our next Bulk Pickups will be Tuesday, June 15 and Tuesday, July 13. The following items will not be accepted: batteries, black bags, chemicals, concrete including bricks or pavers, electronics, fencing, fluorescent bulbs, glass not properly wrapped, insecticides, oils and paints, paint cans, x-rays, construction materials, tires. (For disposal of these items, refer to the article on Household Hazardous Waste & Electronic Recycling on page 12). To ensure the safety of Waste Management drivers, mirrors, glass tabletops, windowpanes, plate glass, etc., will only be picked up if they are properly and safely placed in a rigid container. Any broken glass must be placed in a secure container and marked as glass. If items are small enough, they must be put in clear bags. Black bags will NOT be accepted. Empty cardboard boxes will be accepted.

GARBAGE PICKUP - On Tuesday - blue bags and clear recycle bags. On Friday - blue bags only. Bags should not be put out until **5 PM** the night before pickup.



Here are 7 rules to live by:

1. "EMPTY AND CLEAN IF YOU WANT TO BE GREEN" Do not contaminate other recycling materials with food particles and liquids. This can damage containers and make

them unfit to be recycled. 2. "DON'T BAG RÉCYCLABLES"

Only put loose items into recycling bag. The recycling facility does not have time to untie bags, so they will be sent to the landfill.

3. "COATED PAPER CAUSES PROBLEMS"

Waxy paper cups and shiny or sparkly gift bags are examples of coated paper. If they have been treated or coated, they cannot be recycled.

"GREASE IS GROSS"

Oil and water don't mix; when the grease from your recyclables transfers to other paper goods, it can spoil the batch of mulch at the paper mill. Parts soiled by grease should be cut out of paper materials. Toss only clean cardboard into recycling.

5. "IF IT TANGLES, THEN IT MANGLES"

Tanglers are items that can get stuck in the equipment at a recycling facility. Don't recycle ropes, strapping, zip-ties, hoses, wires, chains, cords.

6. "DON'T BE A DANGEROUS DUMPER"

Certain items can be dangerous when mixed with recycling: batteries, light bulbs, medications and lighter fluids are examples of unsafe items.

"IF IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT"

Do not add to the financial and environmental cost of trucking garbage from recycling facilities to landfills.



Helpful Information ABOUT LIVING IN LW

LANDLORDS Please remember that you cannot rent your property until you have owned it for one year. All tenants must complete an Application for Residency which is available on our Website. All leases and lease renewals must be approved by the Board before the tenant can move in. Contact Director Marlene Newman for additional information. MAILBOX SAFETY We recommend that you not place any outgoing mail in the mailbox in front of your home. We are aware of individuals removing that mail. You can safely deposit your outgoing mail in the blue Postal Service Mailbox located at the end of the parking lot of the Clubhouse or take it directly to any US Post Office. Incoming mail should be removed from your mailbox at your first opportunity.

MODIFICATIONS If you are planning to make any changes to your home, you must complete an Application for Modifications. All modifications must be approved by the Board before any work is started. Modifications may include A/C, windows, doors, patios, enclosures, electrical, plumbing, and widening of driveways. The City of Plantation requires permits for most modifications which includes plumbing and electrical work. Contact Director Kristi Woods for additional information.

PARKING Overnight parking is not permitted on any street in Lauderdale West. Parking at the Main Clubhouse and the Satellite Clubhouse is limited to those using the clubhouse facilities, the pools/spas, or the tennis courts. Other parking requires written Board approval, and a limited parking permit is available. There is no overnight parking in ANY of our parking lots without prior permission to do so. Follow the directional arrows in all parking lots to avoid a fine. A notice will be placed on illegally parked vehicles before being towed at the vehicle owner's expense.

SPEEDING The speed limit in Lauderdale West is 25 miles per hour. All our walkers and bike riders have the right of way. Slow down when you see them. Stop at all stop signs. Signal for all turns. Follow the directional arrows in all parking lots and drive slowly. Driving through the parking lots as a short cut is not permitted. Violators will be fined. Plantation police are asked to monitor our roadways.

TRASH All trash must be placed in City of Plantation blue bags. Trash pickup is on Tuesdays and Fridays. You are permitted to place trash out after 5 PM the night before.

RECYCLE All recycle items must be placed in City of Plantation clear bags or paper bags. Recycle pickup is on Tuesdays only. Boxes must be flattened first and placed alongside the clear bags.

BULK PICKUP You may put large bulk items at the curb usually on the second Tuesday of the month. Please see the Newsletter for the exact date. Black bags will not be picked up.

PEST CONTROL,

IRRIGATION & LANDSCAPING

PEST CONTROL – Perimeter spraying of houses, duplexes and quads is performed every Wednesday. There are two (2) technicians working; one sprays the front and the other sprays the back and sides of each building. Each quadrant is complete before they start another one.

With the rainy season comes ANTS!! Beach Environmental is aware of this. They have adjusted the chemicals to compensate for this issue and work diligently to take care of it.

Prior to termite tenting, your property will be inspected, and you will be notified of issues surrounding your property that must be addressed.

Edna, in the maintenance department, is **NOT** the person to call if you have an interior pest issue. She continues to be inundated with service calls, as our residents call her for assistance with ant issues. Please, **DO NOT** call her. She cannot help you with interior pest problems!

Beach Environmental offers our residents a special price of \$12.00 per month if you would like interior spraying. Call them at (954) 458-1104. Of course, if you prefer to use another pest control company, you certainly can do that too, at your own expense.

IRRIGATION – If you are aware of brown spots or broken sprinkler heads that need to be repaired or replaced, please call Edna (954-473-2595) in our Maintenance Department and she will place a work order for the issue. During the rainy season, you may not notice the sprinklers working; that is because our system has a rain gauge. If this gauge has at least 1 ½ inches of water in it, the sprinklers will not turn on, by design.

LANDSCAPING – Please know that we are doing whatever is necessary to maintain the esthetic beauty of our Community and, of course, the value of our investments. If each owner takes care of their property, it will make it easier for everyone. Please understand, **PARKING IS NOT PERMITTED ON THE LAWNS.**



To avoid plumbing problems, **DO NOT** flush cigarette butts, flushable cleaning wipes, paper or cloth towels or diapers. Please, **ONLY** flush toilet paper.



NO ONE is permitted on your roof EXCEPT LW APPROVED contractors. If you hire a contractor to clean or repair your roof, and they damage your roof in any way, you are responsible for any and all repair costs.

RAIN GUTTERS

All gutters are the responsibility of the owner. They must be kept clean, both inside and out – meaning the owner must remove, on a regular basis, all leaves and trees that may be growing out of the gutters. If the debris in the gutter causes damage to your roof or fascia board, you will be held responsible for all repair costs.

Gutters should be cleaned every other month, especially if you have trees near your homes.



WE NEED YOUR HELP!

Our maintenance workers have found that most of our water spigots/fountains have been TWISTED to fill some type of containers or water bottles. This makes them loose and will ruin them eventually where they cannot be fixed or repaired. Please – DO NOT twist or turn the spigots for our water outlets.



WATER SHUT-OFF VALVES

If you are remodeling a kitchen or bathroom, it is your contractor's responsibility to move the water shut-off valves for easy access.

BLACK RODENT BAIT BOXES



We live in a water community and wherever you have water, you are more susceptible to rats. Throughout our Community, there are rodent bait boxes set up by our pest control company to deter/kill rats/rodents. Each box is numbered and has been strategically placed on the property against the house.

- Do not move the boxes. The boxes MUST remain where they have been placed. Each box is marked on a map and must remain in that spot.
- You will be **fined** if the box on your property is not in its designated position.
- Do not TOUCH the boxes. They are filled with poison.
- If a rodent problem occurs, call maintenance at 954-473-2595 and report it.
- Broken or missing bait box replacement cost is \$22. We will charge the resident when one is missing.

Lauderdale West is a **NO PET** Community. The Board continues to receive complaints about the increase in the number of animals on our property and residents who do not leash or clean up after their animals. Animal noise, i.e. barking, crowing, etc. has also become an issue and is creating a nuisance in the Community.

SERVICE AND EMOTIONAL SUPPORT ANIMALS

Service and emotional support animals are not considered pets, so restrictions that apply to pets do not necessarily apply to them. Emotional support animals are companion animals that provide therapeutic benefits for people with mental disabilities or medical issues. These animals do not have to be trained, unlike service animals that are trained individually to perform specific tasks to help a person who is disabled. You must not discriminate against someone with one of these animals any more than you would if someone were in a wheelchair.

OF A SUPPORT OR COMFORT ANIMAL

In Lauderdale West, there are obligations you must abide by in order to receive written Board approval to have the animal in your home. There are new laws in Florida for assistance animals. For each animal, you are required to sign and have notarized a Request for Animal Accommodation stating you understand your responsibility as an animal owner and to provide accompanying documentation such as:

- Register your animal with the Applications and Approvals office
- A doctor's letter stating your need for such an animal.
- · A current dog license.
- Proof that vaccinations/shots are up to date for your animal.
- A homeowner's insurance policy with liability coverage.
 All animals must be personally attended to and on a leash when outside the home. They may not be tethered to a tree, porch, or patio. If the animal becomes a nuisance or threat to the Community, it must be removed.

In addition to the foregoing, animal owners must:

- Be responsible for animals that reside in their home.
- Follow all City and County Ordinances.
- Clean up after their animal anywhere in Lauderdale West.
 Be advised, you must properly dispose of the bag of animal waste in your trash container, not in a Community trash can.
 Do not put it down a drainage grate or throw it in the lakes or canals. This becomes a bacterial hazard to our water system.

By following these guidelines, everyone benefits including your animal. Failure to register and meet the above requirements will result in fines. Thank you for your cooperation.



MAINTENANCE Procedure



Due to the current COVID-19 situation, our workers are not allowed to enter your homes or plexes. If you have a situation which requires the Maintenance Department, you MUST contact Edna in the Maintenance Office directly at 954-473-2595 or by email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org. **DO NOT** address our maintenance staff concerning your issue as this will only delay your job getting done.

If the work to be done is outside your home, you do not need to be at home when the work is done.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES: Maintenance staff will no longer be available for emergency calls after business hours or on weekends. If you have a plumbing or electrical emergency after business hours or on a weekend, you must call an outside contractor at your own expense. If you have a "medical emergency", please call 911 immediately.

FOR USE OF THE GYM



- 1. Wear proper attire. No swimsuits or flip flops are allowed in the gym.
- 2. No food or beverage, except water in plastic bottles, is allowed in the gym.
- 3. No one under the age of 18 is allowed in the gym.
- 4. The gym is for the exclusive use of Lauderdale West residents. Outside guests are not allowed.
- 5. Use of the equipment while alone is discouraged. Use the "buddy system" to be safe.
- 6. The gym is under camera surveillance. Disregard of any of these rules may result in a fine or removal of these privileges.
- 7. You will be required to sign the attendance book before each session.

PROPER GYM ETIQUETTE

SWIMMING POOL HOURS

The main pool will be open from 7 AM to 7 PM and you must leave the pool area by that time. However due to Covid-19 restrictions, check website and text blasts for possible pool hour changes. Satellite pool remains closed. Thank you for your understanding.

SWIMMING POOL RULES

This is just a reminder that when the pools open, everyone must follow the posted pool rules:

- There is no lifeguard on duty; use of the pool and pool area is at your own risk.
- Social distancing is required in and out of the water except for members of the same household.
- Only residents and their immediate family are allowed in the pool area.
- **NO** animals are allowed in the pool area or the Patio Plaza outside the pool area.
- Pool gate must remain closed. Do not prop open a pool area gate.
- Showering is required **BEFORE** entering the pool per the Broward Department of Health.
- Indoor showers and sauna are closed. Restrooms are open.
- Allow residents who are swimming laps the right of way.
- No diving is allowed.
- Children must be supervised by an adult, at all times, in the pool area, especially when they are in the water THERE IS NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY.
- No child under the age of 16 is allowed in the spa/hot tub.
- No jumping, running or loud noise in the pool area.
- No food, drink or glass is allowed in the pool area. Plastic water bottles are allowed.
- Vacate the pool area during rain, thunder, or lightning sitting under the metal awnings is dangerous.
- Incontinent or non-trained individuals must wear swim diapers.
- NO smoking or vaping is allowed in the pool area.

The Lauderdale West Community Association reserves the right to deny the use of the pool or pool area to anyone at any time for just cause.

If you fail to follow the above rules, you will be asked to leave the pool area and your pool privileges may be revoked. If the posted rules and the rules set forth above are violated, the pool will be closed.

2021 ATLANTIC HURRICANE SEASON

After years of early storms, forecasters consider moving start of hurricane season to May 15.

When Tropical Storm Arthur formed on May 16 last year, 2020 became the sixth hurricane season in a row to spawn a named storm before the official June 1 start of the season.

That's led the World Meteorological Organization to consider moving the hurricane season start date two weeks earlier – May 15. Discussions are under way, and any change wouldn't be made until at least 2022.

Despite the streak of pre-season storms, some high-profile meteorologists think it's still best to leave the official date as June 1.

The first outlook for the 2021 Atlantic hurricane season says that we might be in for another active year.

While it is much too early in preparation season to forecast the number of tropical storms and hurricanes, climatologists are able to look at some of the slow-motion drivers that may assist or hinder hurricane activity this summer and autumn.



The two such drivers that are key to figuring out how busy this season will be are both related to water – the status of El Nino Southern Oscillation (or ENSO) and how water temperatures in the northern Atlantic change in the next year.

Though the official Atlantic hurricane season runs from June through November, as you read above storms can occasionally develop outside those months.



IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR AGAIN HURRICANE SEASON

We need to prepare now! You must have a plan in place just in case. The rule of thumb is to plan for three days' worth of supplies, but the better choice is one week. It is better to be safe now than sorry later. Here are some suggestions:

- Check your water, food supplies and batteries. Buy early to avoid the rush.
- Be sure to have enough prescription medications on hand.
- Identify a safe room in your home with no windows for emergency use.
- Plan for your pet's needs food, medications.
- Document your assets and protect important documents. Have all identification papers, homeowner's insurance policies and other important paperwork in a zip-lock plastic bag.
- Fill your vehicle with gas; have extra cash on hand; charge phones and test your portable radio.
- Secure your home: shutter your windows and doors; remove all free-standing garden objects; bring outdoor furniture inside. Anything left outside can become a projectile.
- Notify family and friends of your evacuation plans.
- Be prepared for the worst and be safe!

CITY MANAGER DISCUSSION CONTINUES

Dan Kleman, who logged more than 50 years of public service in Florida, addressed the Plantation City Council April 14 on the pros and cons of converting to a city manager form of government.

Kleman noted that he was making himself available to the Council as a resource, without offering an endorsement either way.

"I'm not here to sell anything," he said. Kleman was city manager in Tallahassee for 20 years, and held related jobs in Hillsborough County, Jacksonville and Port St. Lucie. He is part of a group of retired city managers who are volunteer advisers throughout the state.

Of the 411 municipalities in Florida, 280 of them use a city manager form of government. Plantation is the lone major city in Broward that puts all final decisions in the hands of an elected mayor.

Kleman noted that most city managers have an MBA in public administration and often about 10 years of experience in city government before taking the reins.

For a change to occur, the City Council would have to approve a citywide vote, and then residents could decide which form of leadership they prefer. Council member Tim Fadgen spoke against the idea and the mayor has veto power if the vote should happen to be 3-2.

UPCOMING 2021 PROPERTY ASSESSMENTS

BCPA is currently working on the 2021 property assessments. The preliminary just values will be posted online by June 1 with the final values posted by July 1. It is important to remember Florida law requires the Property Appraiser to use January 1 as the assessment date each year for determining both value and exemption eligibility.

The 2021 assessments are based on the qualified sales of like properties which occurred during January 2, 2020 through January 1, 2021 (with the greatest weight given to sales from the final quarter of the year). Any increase or decrease in sale prices which occur in 2021 will affect the 2022 assessments (August 2022 TRIM Notice and November 2022 tax bill).

OWNER ALERT NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

The Broward County Property Appraiser's Office is pleased to announce Owner Alert – a FREE service designed to help you protect your property from scams or fraud by notifying you if a document is received by our office changing the ownership of your property. Property fraud is a very serious issue! Criminals can record fraudulent deeds transferring ownership and then try to mortgage, sell, or rent the property. Owner Alert helps stop these unlawful acts. Let's work

together to protect your home from possible fraud.

Subscribing to this service is quick and easy – simply visit our website at https://web.bcpa.net/owneralert to register your property. There is no fee for this service, and you can unsubscribe at any time.

Ownership records are changed based on deeds recorded with the Broward County Records Division and then provided to our office. BCPA has no legal authority to determine whether a deed is fraudulent. Once registered, Owner Alert will notify you if there is a change of ownership to your property and provide you with important information. Fraud Prevention Checklist

Keep your account(s) secure: What you can do now to help fight fraud.

1. Use your bank's mobile app

• The mobile app is the best way for you to stay on top of any suspicious account activity. You should be able to set up alerts, lock or unlock your card, dispute a transaction and more through your bank's mobile application.

2. Check your contact information

- You're not the only one protecting your account. Your bank and credit card company are working to protect you. If they spot an issue, they want to get in touch with you the quickest way possible..
- Provide your mobile number so they can alert you to potential fraud.

3. Create a strong unique password

- Strong passwords are 8 or more characters long and include a combination of numbers, symbols and upper- and lowercase letters.
- Use multifactor authentication when possible.

4. Protect your devices

• Keep your phone, tablet and computer up to date with the latest browser, operating system and antivirus software.

5. Keep your account information secure

- · Go paperless.
- Never write your PIN on the back of your card.
- Use trusted online payment methods, such as Bill Pay or Zelle ® instead of writing checks.

6. Know the red flags that signal a scam

- Scammers pressure people to send money, threaten law enforcement action or demand gift cards as a form of payment.
- Remember, if you provide your information or send money to a scammer, there is often little your financial institution can do to help get your money back.

7. Fight fraud with these quick tips

- **Do not share your information.** Your financial institution will never ask you to give personal information in an email, text, or non-secure website.
- Do not click on suspicious links. Be wary of unsolicited links from unknown sources.
- **Do not be intimidated.** Scams often try to create urgency or alarm by threatening to close or suspend your account if you don't take immediate action.
- **Do not be fooled.** Never transfer money to someone's account claiming that they need the money for urgent help or protection.

LEARN THE DO'S AND DON'TS OF DRIVING AT NIGHT

These tips from AAA can keep you safer on the road when the sun goes down.



Human eyes don't see well in the dark. Without light, our depth perception, color recognition, ability to see contrast, and peripheral vision can be compromised. All of which makes driving at night more dangerous than day driving. Keeping these do's and don'ts in mind can help you stay safer behind the wheel after dark.

DID YOU KNOW?

Using high beams can improve forward illumination by **28%**.
But **64%** of Americans say they don't regularly use them.

Don't follow too closely.

At night, your field of vision is limited to the area illuminated by your headlights. Even with your high-beam headlights on, that may only be about 500 feet (and only about 250 feet with low beams). To give yourself plenty of stopping time, slow down and increase the typical distance between you and the car you're following.

Don't look directly into oncoming headlights.

The glare from an approaching car can temporarily blind you—especially if the driver fails to turn down their high beams—and it could take several seconds for your eyes to readjust to the darkness. Look down toward the right side of the road and follow the lane marking to stay on course until the vehicle passes.

Do dim your dashboard lights.

The glow from your car's instrument panel and infotainment system can be distracting. The lights can also cause reflections on the windshield that make it tougher for your eyes to adjust to the darkness outside the car. Using the dimmer switch to tone these down can help.

DID YOU KNOW?

Only **25%** of all driving is done by night, but **more than half** of vehicle fatalities happens after dark.

Do wear the right glasses.

After driving on a sunny day, it takes time for your eyes to adjust to the low light when darkness falls. Wear a good pair of sunglasses when driving on bright days and take them off as soon as the sun goes down. If you wear prescription glasses, choose a pair with anti-reflective lenses to cut down

on the amount of light reflecting inside your specs. (Don't forget: AAA Members save up to 50% at LensCrafters!)

Don't ignore a streaky windshield.


Driving at night can reveal streaks in your windshield that weren't visible in the daylight. Be sure it's clean by wiping the inside of the glass with a microfiber cloth and glass cleaner. And never touch the inside of the glass with your bare hands; the oil from your skin can leave smears and smudges.

Do make sure your headlights are in good shape.

Even in new cars, headlights can sometimes be uneven or pointed too low. You can adjust them yourself using instructions in your owner's manual or take your car to your local Auto Repair facility for help. If you have an older car with plastic lens covers that have yellowed, use a polish kit to clear off the residue (AAA Members save 10% and earn reward points on most auto parts and accessories at NAPA).

Driving at night: Tips for older drivers

As you get older, your field of vision shrinks. Your eyes at age 60 need three times as much light to see as they did at age 20, because over time pupils get smaller and don't dilate as well. That can make driving at night even tougher. To compensate, an older driver should scan farther down the road and be certain to move their head, not just their eyes, to make up for reduced peripheral vision.



The American Optometric Association also offers this advice to senior drivers:

- Have annual eye exams to check for potential problems such as cataracts and degenerative eye diseases, and to make sure your prescription for any corrective eyewear is current.
- Take a driving course for seniors, which can help you learn to adjust for the physical changes that come with aging.
- Avoid glasses or sunglasses with wide temples (the arms on the sides that extend over the ears), as these can impede your side vision.
- Reduce your speed or even avoid driving at night, if necessary.



SMOKE ALARMS

The Florida Building Code, which has been the statewide standard since **March 1, 2002**, requires a smoke alarm in the hallway or area outside each sleeping room (bedroom), in each sleeping room, and a minimum of one on each level of the home (including basement).

There is an additional requirement in the Florida Existing Building Code for existing homes with battery-powered smoke alarms, that began on **January 1, 2015**. It requires that, when replacing any existing battery-powered smoke alarm that has a replaceable battery, or installing a new battery-powered smoke alarm, the new smoke alarm must only have a 10-year non-replaceable battery. No more smoke alarms with replaceable batteries are allowed. But it does not mean that every home is mandated to a smoke alarm.

Also, any new home, or addition to a home, permitted on or after **July 1, 2008**, that has a fossil-fuel burning heater or appliance, a fireplace, or attached garage shall have a carbon monoxide alarm installed within 10 feet of each sleeping room. The carbon monoxide alarm may be hard-wired (served by the home's electrical system) or battery- powered. A combination smoke and carbon monoxide alarm is allowed at the required locations, which is what most builders install in new homes.



HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

Disaster Plan for Your Family

Planning and preparing can make a big difference in safety in the wake of a hurricane.

Plan what to do in case you are separated during an emergency

- Choose two places to meet up:
 - o Right outside your home in case of a sudden emergency, such as a fire.
 - o Outside your neighborhood, in case you cannot return home.
- Choose an out-of-area emergency contact person. Everyone should carry emergency contact information in writing and saved on their cell phones.
- The most important precaution you can take to reduce damage to your home and property is to protect the areas where wind can enter.
 - o Bring loose, lightweight objects inside that could become projectiles in high winds.
 - o Cover all your home's windows. Permanent storm shutters offer the best protection for windows.

Disaster Supply Kit

At a minimum, you should have the basic supplies listed below stored in plastic containers with lids.

- Water: one gallon per person, per day (3-day supply for evacuation, 2-week supply for home)
- Food: non-perishable, easy-to-prepare items (3-day supply for evacuation, 2-week supply for home).
 - o Suggestions you may be without power so don't rely on cooking/microwaving (Pop top canned foods, peanut butter, nuts, granola bars
- Flashlight
- Battery-powered or hand-crank flashlight with radio (NOAA Weather Radio, if possible)
- Extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Medications (7-day supply) and medical items
 - o Hearing aids with extra batteries, glasses, contact lenses, syringes, etc
- Sanitation and personal hygiene items
- Copies of personal documents inside a plastic zip lock bag (medication list and pertinent medical information, proof of address, deed/lease to home, passports, birth certificates, insurance policies)
- Cell phone with chargers
- Family and emergency contact information
- Extra cash
- Map(s) of the area
- Manual can opener
- Pet supplies
- Extra set of car keys and house keys

Evacuation - Have a Place to Go - Prepare NOW

- Based on your location and community plans, make your own plans for evacuation or sheltering in place. Let a friend or family member located outside of the disaster area know what your evacuation plan is.
- Become familiar with your evacuation zone, the evacuation route, and shelter locations.
- Review insurance policies. Do you have flood insurance?

Broward County Evacuation Shelters:

The shelters for Broward County **may not all open** during a state of emergency. **They are opened as needed.** Do not go to a shelter until you have verified the shelter is open and has available space. Monitor the Broward County website, local television stations or call the Emergency Hotline at 311 or 954-831-4000 for actual shelter openings.

Please note which shelters are pet-friendly. Do not bring pets to shelters not listed as pet-friendly.

Emergency shelters are a service of the Broward County Commission and the Broward County School Board.

HURRICANE TIPS & TRICKS

Be Prepared

- 1. Start running your ice makers now and bagging the ice in freezer bags. Fill as much space in between your freezer items as you can.
- 2. Freeze regular tap water for pets, cleaning or drinking in Tupperware-type containers or empty plastic bottles. RE-MEMBER: leave a small bit of space between the top of the water and lids so as the ice expands, it won't crack the container.
- 3. Start using up perishables to make more room for ice in the freezer.
- 4. Fill up all vehicles with gas and check tires and oil.
- 5. Get cash from ATM or bank (ATMs may not work after a storm), at least enough money to get you through tolls and gas out of town, should there be an evacuation. Call your bank if you plan on leaving the area so they don't freeze your card for out-of-area "suspicious" transactions.
- 6. Take a screenshot of all your important documents and send to your email. Take originals in sealed bags or plastic, waterproof bins.
- 7. Have sufficient pet food and supplies. Vet records are required in case you need to shelter your pet at a storm-safe facility.

- 8. Make an evacuation plan and share with family members so they know where you are headed.
- 9. Consider putting heirlooms and photos in plastic, waterproof bins in a high place (high shelf or safe room), if you don't plan to take them with you.
- 10. SECURE ALL FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION PROP-ERLY.
- 11. Place old rags and beach towels on your windowsills. Even with the best windows and shutters, water seepage from wind pressure happens. A few damp towels are better than soaked drywall or floors.
- 12. Shutter windows and doors and bring everything outside into your garage or house NOW. Do not wait until the day before. Better to get it done early and relax than wait until it is too late.
- 13. If you don't already have your hurricane supplies, get them now. Shelves may already be empty in many places.



AT HOME AND ON THE ROAD FROM AAA

You wouldn't leave your house unlocked when you go on vacation, but are you protecting your online identity when you travel? Here are some tips from AAA Chief Information Security Officer, Gopal Padinjaruveetil.

- **Use advanced protection:** Enable multifactor authentication such as a one-time logic code sent to your smartphone for accounts like Facebook, Google and Drop Box.
- Turn off Bluetooth when not in use: Bluetooth-enabled accessories such as earpieces and external keyboards are convenient, but cybercriminals can pair with your phone's open Bluetooth connection and use it to steal personal information.
- **Don't fall for phishing scams:** Phishing scams use attractive offers to entice shoppers to click on links within emails. If you receive an email with a deal that looks too good to be true, or if it has a link or attachment that seems suspicious, don't click on it.

- Avoid public Wi-Fi networks: Conducting personal business, like online banking or shopping on public networks, can allow attackers to intercept your information. To check your credit card statement or shop online while traveling, switch to your mobile device's data internet connection.
- **Keep your device software updated:** And while you're at it, make sure you have good anti-virus and anti-malware software on your devices.
- Don't connect your mobile device: Connecting to any computer or charging station that you do not control, such as a charging station at an airport terminal or a shared computer in a library, with a USB cable can allow software running on that computer to access your sensitive data or install new software on your device.

Take precautions to make sure you always keep your online identity safe.
