

### PRESIDENT

I hope this letter finds everyone safe and healthy. We have been hearing from many of you about re-opening the pools, Clubhouse and gym and appreciate your understanding and cooperation during this Covid-19 Pandemic. The Governor has started to open up South Florida, but Broward County restrictions remain in place. Those restrictions prevent us from re-opening our facilities and amenities at the present time. Our main concern has been the monitoring requirements imposed on businesses, community associations and any facility where there is the possibility of being exposed to Covid-19. The Board of Directors has a fiduciary duty to protect the Association and limit any liability that may arise because of a failure to comply with the law.

As I write this at the end of June, I do hope that things have returned to normal as you read this. At this moment, the CDC still restricts gatherings to less than 50 people so we cannot schedule our Annual Meeting. All social events and ticket sales are on hold until further notice. The Clubhouse remains closed to the public, but most Board Members have been coming in daily to complete the work of the Association. We are all very busy with building repairs, sales and rentals, modifications and landscaping improvements and monitoring our vendors. We are trying to stay safe and continue to follow all Federal, State and local laws. Everyone wears masks and we practice social distancing and frequent hand washing. Sam, Cindy and Henry have been disinfecting all surfaces daily to protect everyone. Access to the Clubhouse is restricted to appointments only. We still do not have volunteers to monitor the phones, so we suggest that you email the Directors if you need any assistance. Email addresses are listed in this newsletter.

And now for some Good News! We have been taking this time to continue our renovation of the main Clubhouse. We have power washed the pavers and sidewalks at the Club-

house and pools. We have finally received the insurance money from Hurricane Irma and will be replacing the Clubhouse roof. Years of leaks will soon be over. We can then move forward to finish all the other rooms in the Clubhouse that were damaged from roof leaks. The women's bathroom at the satellite Clubhouse is finished and looks beautiful. We also painted the satellite Clubhouse and the roof. The new landscaping at the main Clubhouse is almost complete and the back of the Clubhouse construction should be completed by the time you read this. The patio will be open with tables and benches for light snacking. The new curbs in the parking lot are finished. We are almost done renovating room #111 and will soon move on to Room #108 and the craft room. The business office has some room changes that we think will increase efficiency. We are moving forward with the main pool renovation project and we are in the beginning of the engineering process with the Department of Health. We do not plan to actually start the physical renovations of the pool until the fall because the permitting process is lengthy and will take a few months more. This process was delayed because we have such an aging pool structure and pumphouse that will need major updating. We plan to open the pool and all amenities as soon as all the restrictions are lifted.

More Good News! A few months ago, many residents and I went to a Plantation City Council meeting (Joanne drove the LW bus) and complained to the mayor and councilmen about the deplorable condition of our roads. Mayor Stoner, and Councilmen Horland and Sortal responded. We have just found out that the City will use some of its future funds from the County to repair some of our main roads, i.e., 85th Avenue, Phil Halle Blvd (11th St), and Campanelli, along with 10th Court, 12th Street and 17th Street that lead to Pine Island Road. We expect work to begin in the fall. We hope to resume attending these meetings when they are open to the public to bring other issues of importance to Lauderdale West. We invite all of you to join us.

### SPRINKLERS AND THE RAINY SEASON

Our Maintenance Dept. receives several telephone calls a day from residents complaining that the sprinklers have not gone on at the scheduled time. Please understand, with this new system we have something called a "RAIN GAUGE". If we have more than, 1 ½" of rain, the gauge is full and will automatically shut off the sprinklers. There is no need to water the lawn as mother nature is doing it for us.

Also, with the amount of rain we are getting, our swales are flooded. There is nothing we can do about that. The ground is saturated and it takes a little longer than normal for the rain water to evaporate as we are now in the rainy season here in South Florida.

Think about it: we water the lawns for approximately 10-15 minutes at a time. With the deluge we have experienced lately, it continues for hours. Be patient, the ground will absorb this rainwater.

### DIRECTORS' Corner

### **BY JOANNE HILL**

In April and May we met with three contractors to discuss proposals to repair and renovate the main pool. Your Board gained so much knowledge about pools, filters, chemicals, and the like.

The Board received three proposals for the repair and renovations to the pool at the main Clubhouse. These repairs and renovations include re-surfacing, retiling, upgrading the lights inside the pool in order to allow longer swimming hours, changing from a chlorine-based filter system to a salt-based filter system and more. We converted the spas to the salt-based filtration system several years ago. If you haven't tried a spa to feel the difference, you should. No more fading of swimsuits or caustic chemicals drying your skin.

As you may be aware, we have had many complaints regarding unclean tiles in the pool. That is caused by individuals not showering before entering the pool to remove sunscreen from the surface of their skin. We have what's called a gravity fed filtration system which cleans

the top of the pool. This was the norm back when the pool was installed. The system available today is suction based and much better at removing leaves and film from the water surface. Unfortunately, we cannot convert to the suction-based system as that would require removing and replacing the entire pool. That cost would be prohibitive.

After much consideration, we chose our current pool contractor, Joe Granino of Granino's Pool and Patio Service.

We must obtain the services of an electrician, aquatic engineer to prepare drawings for all work that must be done as well as an engineer to prepare a survey of the pool and the Clubhouse in order to apply to the City of Plantation and the Broward Health Department for the proper permits.

This is a long process, especially given that the City is somewhat shorthanded due to the Covid-19 pandemic and therefore acquiring permits is taking longer than usual.

Work on the pool will begin in early November. Mr. Granino urged us to wait until after the Summer to begin as the pool will be empty and the extreme heat can cause cracking of the concrete if left with no water. We anticipate the pool to be reopened before the 2020 Holiday Season.

### FROM THE TREASURER'S DESK

Effective immediately Lauderdale West will not accept cash payments for the Maintenance Dept., Newspaper Office and Applications & Approvals Office. Payment must be made by check or money order. As far as the Ticket Office is concerned, we would prefer all payments be made by check or money order. If you do not have a checking account and cannot obtain a money order, we will accommodate you.

The 2020 monthly assessment for the condo/plex units is \$327.00, for the SFH units is \$337.00. If you sent the wrong amount, you will receive a notice to send the missing amount immediately. Don't wait; send the payment now.

Avoid LATE FEES and COLLECTION CHARGES (\$115.00)! Pay the arrears today!

Automatic payment of your monthly assessment will avoid this problem. Get on board and fill out the form and get it back to us. The form is found on Page 10.

### COMMUNICATING WITH THE BOARD



With the proliferation of the internet and text messaging, we come to expect instant communication and responses. This is especially true of owner communications with the Lauderdale West Board. Because your communications to the Board may raise certain legal issues for not responding timely, and sometimes emails end up in spam filters, the Association must insist on certain formalities regarding communications with owners.

Requests to inspect documents and written inquiries by owners cannot be sent via email or text messages to the Board. Instead, the request must be in writing on paper. If it is a document request (e.g., I want to see the financials for December), it need not be sent via certified mail. The Board will set up an appointment within ten (10) business days of its receipt of the letter. Please note that the Association is not obligated to provide you with copies, but merely to allow you to review the document(s). If you wish something copied, you will be charged twenty-five cents per page. If it's a written inquiry (e.g., Why did we choose Contractor A vs Contractor B for this project?), it needs to be sent to the Board via certified mail. The Board will respond within thirty (30) calendar days of its receipt, unless one of the statutory extensions applies.

The Lauderdale West Board of Directors cannot take any action on information provided in a letter, voice mail or phone call without the name and LW address of the person making the report.

### information update needed!



In the course of our volunteers making wellness calls to residents during the Covid-19 Pandemic, it was discovered that our Database here at Lauderdale West is outdated. It is possible residents have discontinued their telephone land line and are using a cell phone instead. Therefore, we are asking all our residents to complete the Resident Contact Update Form on our website: www.lauderdalewest.org. Just click on the "Resident Contact Update" tab to fill out the simple online form. The tab can be found on the main page, in light blue and fourth from the bottom.

If you do not have access to a computer and the internet, you may obtain a form in the Administration Office at the Main Clubhouse.

It is vital that you complete the Resident Contact Update Form at your earliest opportunity in order that your information is correct and up-to-date.

### REOPENING UPDATE

The Association plans to open all the amenities including the pools and the tennis courts when Broward County lifts all its restrictions as a result of Covid-19. At the present time we are still maintaining all amenities in hopes of these restrictions being lifted in the near future. At present we cannot comply with the restrictions imposed by Broward County and the need to monitor them in our Community.

As you know, we are self-managed, and the members of the Board cannot monitor compliance with the restrictions.

Lauderdale West simply does not have the money nor personnel to monitor the use of facial coverings, social distancing and crowd limitations of 10 persons or less. We also cannot perform the intensive disinfection of surfaces that is required after each use. This being said, we do have a fiduciary duty to protect the financial status of our Association, and we cannot afford the consequences or liability should anyone contract Covid-19 as a result of our failure to comply with the present restrictions of Broward County as well as the required monitoring.

We all hope and pray the Clubhouse and all amenities will be open by the time you are reading this but unfortunately, we cannot guarantee that.

### POLITICAL SIGNAGE

- 1. No more than one (1) election sign per candidate or issue for any local, county, state, national or special district election shall be permitted on private property or common ground. No election sign shall be allowed to be located on a roadway median.
- 2. Election signs shall not be illuminated nor contain any three-dimensional objects.
- 3. Election signs shall not be placed upon any property more than ten (10) calendar days before the election date to which they relate.
- 4. All election signs shall be removed within seven (7) calendar days following the election date to which they relate.
- 5. Election signs in residential zoning districts shall not exceed two (2) feet in height and two (2) feet in width.
- 6. Election signs shall be located a maximum of five (5) feet from the front of the residence or on the front patio.
- 7. No person shall post an election sign(s) or sticker(s) in, on or outside of their windows, or on their mailbox at any time, including, but not limited to, signs or stickers posted for any local, county, state, national, or special district elections. Unpermitted signs or stickers shall be subject to immediate removal by the Association.
- 8. No political/election flags may be attached to any residence. Unpermitted flags shall be subject to immediate removal by the Association.

### TICKET OFFICE PROCEDURES

- The ticket office is open Monday through Friday, 9:30 AM to 11:30 AM, four weeks prior to the show.
- The ticket office is open the night of the show from 6:30 PM to 7:30 PM.
- Reserved seat tickets MUST be picked up the first week of ticket sales or they will go into "general" sales the following week.
- Attendees arriving after the show has begun @ 8:00 must sit in the back so as not to disturb others.
- You must show your Lauderdale West ID or some form of picture ID showing your Lauderdale West address to purchase tickets at the resident price of \$10.
- Guest tickets may be purchased for \$17 each.
- We cannot put any tickets aside. We cannot refund or resell tickets.
- Tickets may be purchased with check or money order PREFERRED Cash will be accepted if check or money order is not available No credit cards accepted.
- A customer may pick up their neighbor's tickets for them, with their neighbor's ID.
- Proper attire should be worn to the shows, no shorts, no hats.
- No cameras or videos are permitted from any seat.
- Please follow the rules and enjoy the shows!

Our Lauderdale West Community has established principles of conduct for the general good and welfare of all our owners, tenants and guests. Every resident of our Lauderdale West Community has the right to live peacefully in their home and has the right to expect that the value of their property will be upheld in a reasonable manner.

The Board of Directors would like to remind everyone of the following:

- For our safety, we MUST follow parking restrictions and the directional signs in the parking lots.
- Owners are required to follow our documents and rules and regulations.
- Owners are responsible to maintain the exterior of their homes (gutters, awnings, patios, landscaping).
- Residents are not permitted to install any plants, shrubs or trees without written Board approval.
- Owners, tenants and guests are required to follow City ordinances regarding animals.
- Owners are required to seek approval for all home modifications in advance.
- Front pole lights and rear security lights must be kept on at night.
- Owners are responsible for their tenants and guests.
- Residents must respect quiet times from 10:00 PM to 8:00 AM.
- Non-adherence to the Lauderdale West documents and rules and regulations will result in the resident being fined accordingly.

### BUYER BEWARE OF UNLICENSED WORKERS

When you need to hire someone to do work in your home be sure to check the insurance and license of the person. The person/company needs to have a recent license issued by the City of Plantation if their business is in the City. Be sure to see a copy of their insurance to confirm they have coverage.

Many jobs require a permit from the City of Plantation. You should do your research. Call the City before work begins to ascertain if you need a permit. Don't rely on your contractor to inform you of that fact.

Whatever you do, **NEVER** hire someone who just knocks on your door and offers to do work for you. This may cost you in the long run for poor workmanship and problems that could arise for which they cannot fix/pay. They may also swindle you and cause more damage to your property.

Do not wait until there is a problem and wish you had hired a licensed/insured worker.

### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW) & ELECTRONIC RECYLING

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) includes paint, batteries, tires and similar materials. Electronic Materials include computers, computer monitors, televisions, printers, scanners and similar devices. Neither HHW nor Electronic Materials are collected as solid waste, recyclable, or bulk trash. The City of Planation offers four quarterly drop-off events, which allow residents to dispose of these materials. This is available for residents only; proof of residency is required. HHW dropoff events at City Public Works Compound, 750 NW 91st Avenue from 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM. Dates: August 15, November 21. The City of Plantation works in conjunction with the City of Sunrise and their site may also be used as an alternative. Located at 10500 NW 55 Street, Sunrise, their date is: October 24.

## ASSOCIATION FACTS Nid You Know

**LANDLORDS** - Please remember that you cannot lease your property within one year of its purchase. Landlords, don't forget, ALL rentals, including renewals, must be approved by the Lauderdale West Board of Directors prior to the commencement of the lease.

MAILBOX SAFETY - It is highly recommended that you do not place your outgoing mail in the mailbox in front of your home. We are aware of individuals removing that mail. The best way to protect yourself is to take your mail directly to the Post Office or put it in the blue mailbox outside the Main Clubhouse on 85th Terrace. This is the safest way to ensure your mail will arrive at its destination. Please be considerate of others and take packages to the Post Office to be mailed. Conversely, your incoming mail should be removed from your mailbox at your first opportunity.

**MODIFICATIONS** - If you are planning any modifications to your home or plex, you must complete our paperwork and the modification must be approved by the Board BEFORE ANY WORK IS STARTED. Modifications include but are not limited to A/C, windows, doors, garage door, gutters, patio, interior upgrades, electrical, plumbing, widening of driveways. Kristi Woods is the director who will assist you. Please call the Administration Office (954-473-8219) during our normal office hours and they will set up an appointment for you.

The City of Plantation requires permits for most modifications, including plumbing and electrical work. A permit ensures that the work is done properly and to City Code. This is for your protection.

**SPEEDING** - Driving in a parking lot should be at a very slow speed – 5 miles per hour. There are people walking in parking lots – be careful. The main parking lot should not be used as a cut through from 85 Avenue to 12 Street. This creates a dangerous situation.

**DIRECTIONAL SIGNAGE** - One Way signs DO mean one way for a reason – even in a parking lot. The arrows show you the direction you MUST go. One way means ALL vehicles MUST travel in the same direction as the arrows point. You wouldn't go the wrong way on Pine Island or University – do not go the wrong way in our parking lots even if it is a shorter distance for you.



- · Have a combined household adjusted gross income for 2019 not exceeding \$30,721.

### **Long-Term Residency Exemptions**

- An applicant must be 65 years of age or older as of January
- 1, 2020 and currently receiving Homestead Exemption.
- · Have a combined household adjusted gross income for 2019 not exceeding \$30,721
- Own a home with a just (market) value of less than \$250,000 for the initial year of application
- · Have permanently resided in the home for at least 25 years as of January 1 of the application year

### DECEPTIVE MAILERS BEING SENT TO BROWARD HOMES SUPERVISOR ANTONACCI RAISES CONCERNS

Broward County Supervisor of Elections, Peter Antonacci is calling attention to the insidious efforts of a shadow group, misleadingly calling themselves the Voter Participation Center (VPC) or the Center for Voter Information (CVI) which operates through the front of a Philadelphia-based law firm, BlankRome.

These deceptive mailers – many of these are being sent to voters who are already properly registered with an "official-looking" mailer (in many cases already filled in with personal information) – are made to appear to be from a governmental entity (which they are not) and use a purposefully deceptive Tallahassee mail drop return address. This not only confuses voters and unnecessarily frightens them (seniors in particular) it is counter-productive to ongoing voter registration and vote-by-mail efforts being undertaken by elections offices, the political parties, and other regulated, legitimate groups.

VPC/CVI just sent word that they plan to carpet bob Floridians with more of the same in the coming days. In the midst of what our state and nation are experiencing with the ongoing pandemic, this has risen to a level of serious unacceptability.

We are asking you to be mindful of this activity and to do what you can to help us call attention to this scam which is causing real harm to Florida voters.

### **HURRICANE SEASON MAY AFFECT INSURANCE RATES**

The start of hurricane season on June 1 is traditionally a good time for Florida homeowners to review their coverage – both for changes you might not have known about, and to ensure you have enough. However, it's never too late to do a review.

Some things you may want to consider:

- Roof coverage Does your policy cover roof replacement as opposed to "Actual Cash Value" (what the old roof is worth today)? That means to replace the roof, the homeowner must pay whatever the insurance company decides is not its responsibility. Not all companies have switched to "actual cash value" roof coverage, and some will reinstate full replacement value coverage if you agree to pay a higher premium. Make sure to read your policy.
- Limits on non-weather water damage Another potential surprise may be how much insurers will pay for non-weather-related water damage, resulting from prob-

lems inside your house. A ruptured pipe inside a wall or under a sink. A corroded connection to a water heater. A dishwasher hose comes loose, spewing water through your cabinetry. Most insurers now limit water damage coverage for homes built more than 30 years ago, while some companies offer no water damage coverage at all unless you pay extra.

• Make sure you can rebuild – Property owners should also check to ensure they have the right amount of coverage in case a catastrophe destroys your home completely. According to analytics firm, CoreLogic, three of five home in the US are insured for an average of 20% less than full value. You'll also want to determine whether your home's contents are insured for actual cash value, which is the depreciated value, or replacement cost, what it would cost to replace an older item with a new one.



The 2020 Atlantic hurricane season is predicted to be more active than usual, according to an outlook released by The Weather Company, an IBM Business.

The outlook created by Dr. Todd Crawford, chief meteorologist at The Weather Company, calls for 18 named storms, nine hurricanes and four major hurricanes – one that is Category 3 or higher (115-plus-mph winds) on the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale.

This forecast is significantly above the 30-year (1981-2010) normalized average of 13 named storms, seven hurricanes and three major hurricanes.

Though the official Atlantic hurricane season runs from June through November, storms can occasionally develop outside those months.

### **HURRICANE TRICKS**

### Be Prepared

- 1. Start running your ice makers now and bagging the ice in freezer bags. Fill as much space in between your freezer items as you can.
- 2. Freeze regular tap water for pets, cleaning or drinking in Tupperware-type containers or empty plastic bottles. REMEMBER: leave a small bit of space between the top of the water and lids so as the ice expands, it won't crack the container.
- 3. Start using up perishables to make more room for ice in the freezer.
- 4. Fill up all vehicles with gas and check tires and oil.
- 5. Get cash from ATM or bank (ATMs may not work after a storm), at least enough money to get you through tolls and gas out of town, should there be an evacuation. Call your bank if you plan on leaving the area so they don't freeze your card for out-of-area "suspicious" transactions.
- 6. Take a screenshot of all your important documents and send to your email. Take originals in sealed bags or plastic, waterproof bins.
- 7. Have sufficient pet food and supplies. Vet records are required in case you need to shelter your pet at a storm-safe facility.
- 8. Make an evacuation plan and share with family members so they know where you are headed.
- 9. Consider putting heirlooms and photos in plastic, waterproof bins in a high place (high shelf or safe room), if you don't plan to take them with you.
- 10. SECURE ALL FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION PROPERLY.
- 11. Place old rags and beach towels on your windowsills. Even with the best windows and shutters, water seepage from wind pressure happens. A few damp towels are better than soaked drywall or floors.
- 12. Shutter windows and doors and bring everything outside into your garage or house NOW. Do not wait until the day before. Better to get it done early and relax than wait until it is too late.
- 13. If you don't already have your hurricane supplies, get them now. Shelves may already be empty in many places.



### **SERVICE AND COMPANION SUPPORT ANIMALS**

Service and emotional support animals are not pets, so restrictions that apply to pets do not apply to them. Emotional support animals are companion animals that provide therapeutic benefits for people with mental disabilities or medical issues. These animals do not have to be trained, unlike service animals that are trained individually to perform specific tasks to help a person who is disabled. You should not discriminate against someone with one of these animals any more than someone with, for example, a wheelchair.

### IF YOU REQUIRE THE SERVICES OF A SUPPORT OR COMFORT ANIMAL

..... in Lauderdale West, you have obligations you must abide by to be in good standing:

- · A doctor's letter is required stating your need for an "emotional support dog".
- · You must register your pet with the Applications and Approvals office (formerly Sales and Rentals).
- You must show a current dog license and proof that vaccinations/shots are up to date for your ani-

By following these guidelines, everyone benefits including your pet. Failure to register and meet the above requirements will result in fines. Thank you for your cooperation.

### **GUTTERS**

All gutters are the responsibility of the owner. They must be kept clean both inside and out – meaning the owner must remove, on a regular basis, all leaves and trees that may be growing out of the gutters. If the debris in the gutter causes damage to your roof or fascia board, you will be held responsible for all repair costs.

Gutters should be cleaned every other month especially if you have trees near your homes.

### **WATER SHUT OFF VALVES**

your contractor's responsibility to move the water shutoff valves for easy access.

### **ANIMAL OWNERS** Take Note!



Lauderdale West is still a NO PET Community. The Board continues to receive complaints about the increase in the number of animals on our property and residents who do not leash or clean up after their animals. Animal noise ie barking, crowing etc. has also become an issue.

LW has several 'park like' areas throughout the Community. These are not areas where you can let your animal off leash - for several reasons:

- 1. Residents are responsible for animals that reside in their homes.
- 2. Owners of animals must follow all City and County Ordinances.
- 3. The City of Plantation has a Leash Law all animals MUST be on a leash and personally attended when they are out of the home.
- 4. There are alligators swimming in our lakes and canals dogs are one of their favorite meals.
- 5. There are foxes; coyotes and raccoons in the area and could be a danger to your animals.
- 6. Owners must clean up after their animal in these park areas, as well as anywhere in Lauderdale West. Be advised, you must properly dispose of the bag in your trash container. Do not put it down a drainage grate or throw it in the lakes or canals. This becomes a bacterial hazard to our water system.

### PLUMBING PROBLEMS

To avoid plumbing problems, do not flush cigarette butts, flushable cleaning wipes, paper or cloth towels or diapers. Please only flush toilet paper.

FYI — BY PLANTATION CODE

You need a City of Plantation permit to make any plumbing or electrical changes. Don't forget you also need to complete the paperwork with our Director in charge of modifications, Kristi Woods. LW is not responsible to fix a problem if you did not get approval and a permit.

A permit ensures a plumbing or electrical change is

done properly – to code. It is for your protection.

### IRRIGATION SYSTEM INFORMATION

Per the Broward County Watering Ordinance, lawns and landscapes may only be watered between the hours of 4 PM and 10 AM. Our sprinklers are on an automated system and are operating between the hours of 10 PM and 7 AM. During the dry season we may water beyond those hours but within the Broward County protocol. Each phase is watered three times a week.

Our irrigation company performs a "wet check" once a month. At that time, you may see the system on after 10 AM.

### PEST CONTROL POLICY





Beach Environmental is our exterminating contractor! They will not perform any inspections or work without a work order. Therefore, if you believe you have a pest problem, call Edna at the Maintenance Office, 954-473-2595, or email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org. You will be given a work order number. Edna will then contact our exterminator who will inspect your residence.

The outside of your residence will be sprayed every month. This spraying should eliminate interior problems. Therefore, Lauderdale West will no longer pay for interior spraying. Most insects in your home are brought in with your groceries, shopping bags and cardboard boxes. Be sure to put food away immediately after eating and clean counters of any waste and crumbs. Neglecting to do this may result in ants inside your residence.


The insecticide sprayed outside your home dries within 30 minutes. As required by Florida regulation, Beach Environmental will place small signs throughout the neighborhood on the edge of the property when the insecticide is applied. These signs may be removed after 30 minutes. You may throw away the paper part of the sign and take the plastic holder/stick to the main Clubhouse at your convenience.

Please note: Beach Environmental is pest control for our homes only; not our lawns. EDJ services our lawns

If you feel the need for interior pest control, Beach Environmental is offering our residents a rate of \$12.00 per month for monthly interior exterminating or \$23.00 for every other month interior extermination. With this service, you will need to contact Beach Environmental directly @ 954-458-1104. Please do not call Edna for this service.

Termite inspection will also be performed by Beach Environmental. The procedure is to contact Edna at the Maintenance Office if you suspect infestation.

We are confident you will be pleased with the professional way Beach Environmental cares for our property.

### **MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES**

If you have a situation which needs the Maintenance Department, you MUST contact Edna in the Maintenance Office **directly** at 954-473-2595 or by email: maintenanced-ept@lauderdalewest.org. DO NOT ADDRESS OUR MAINTENANCE STAFF CONCERNING YOUR ISSUE as this will only delay your job getting done.

When you call the Maintenance Office, you will receive a **work order** number which you will need to KEEP until your job is completed.

You will be given a time frame when Maintenance will come to your home. IF THE WORK TO BE DONE IS INSIDE YOUR HOME, please make sure you are home, or your **work order** will be closed, and you will need to call and make a new appointment. If the work to be done is outside your home, you do not need to be at home when the work is done.

Remember – contact Edna in the Maintenance Office at 954-473-2595, Monday – Friday 8 AM – 4 PM or email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org and get a WORK ORDER NUMBER.

**EMERGENCY PROCEDURES:** We will no longer have our maintenance staff available for emergency calls after business hours or on weekends. If you have a plumbing or electrical emergency after business hours or on a weekend, you must call an outside contractor at your own expense. If you have a "medical emergency", please call 911 immediately.

**EXCESSIVE CALLS:** We have discovered that our maintenance staff may make repeated calls to a residence for the same problem. During their first visit the resident is instructed as to what is needed to correct the problem. If repeated calls are necessary for the same situation, it is apparent that the resident is not complying with those instructions.

Therefore, we have started charging residents who do not comply and fix the problem. After the second visit for the same problem, the resident will receive a letter stating the problem and the need to fix it. If there is a third call, the resident will then be charged \$50 for non-compliance as well as the cost of the maintenance call for the problem. An example of this would be if the resident keeps calling maintenance for a clogged toilet and it is found that the resident is flushing cleansing wipes into the toilet (even those stating they are flushable should never be flushed). After the second visit, the resident will receive a letter stating they should not flush anything except toilet tissue down the toilet. If there is a third call for a clogged toilet due to cleansing wipes, the resident will be charged \$50 plus \$300 for the repeat plumbing call.

### ROOFS

### NO ONE IS PERMITTED ON YOUR ROOF EXCEPT LW APPROVED CONTRACTORS.

If you hire a contractor to clean or repair your roof, and they damage your roof in any way, you are responsible for any and all repair costs.



### WE NEED YOUR HELP!

Our maintenance workers have found that most of our water spigots/fountains have been TWISTED to fill some type of containers or water bottles. This makes them loose and will ruin them eventually where they cannot be fixed or repaired. Please – DO NOT twist or turn the spigots for our water outlets.

### DO NOT TOUCH THE LITTLE BLACK BOXES



We live in a water community and wherever you have water, you are more susceptible to rats. Throughout our Community, there are rodent bait boxes set up by our pest control company to deter/kill rats/rodents. Each box is numbered and has been specifically placed on the property against the house.

- **Do not move the boxes.** The boxes MUST remain where they have been placed. Each box is marked on a map and must remain at that spot.
- You will be **fined** if the box on your property is not in its designated position.
- Do not TOUCH the boxes. They are filled with poison.
- If a rodent problem occurs, call maintenance at 954-473-2595 and report it.
- Broken or missing bait box replacement cost is \$22. We will charge the resident when one is missing.

### DIGITAL DEFENSE AT HOME AND ON THE ROAD

AAA May/June 2020

You wouldn't leave your house unlocked when you go on vacation, but are you protecting your online identity when you travel? Here are some tips from AAA Chief Information Security Officer, Gopal Padinjaruveetil.

- **Use advanced protection:** Enable multifactor authentication such as a one-time logic code sent to your smartphone for accounts like Facebook, Google and Drop box.
- Turn off Bluetooth when not in use: Bluetooth-enabled accessories such as earpieces and external keyboards are convenient, but cybercriminals can pair with your phone's open Bluetooth connection and use it to steal personal information.
- **Don't fall for phishing scams:** Phishing scams use attractive offers to entice shoppers to click on links within emails. If you receive an email with a deal that looks too good to be true, or if it has a link or attachment that seems suspicious, don't click on it.
- Avoid public Wi-Fi networks: Conducting personal business, like online banking or shopping on public networks, can allow attackers to intercept your information. To check your credit card statement or shop online while traveling, switch to your mobile device's data internet connection.
- **Keep your device software updated:** And while you're at it, make sure you have good anti-virus and anti-malware software on your devices.
- **Don't connect your mobile device:** Connecting to any computer or charging station that you do not control, such as a charging station at an airport terminal or a shared computer in a library, with a USB cable can allow software running on that computer to access your sensitive data or install new software on your device.

Take precautions to make sure you keep your online identity safe at all times.

### ROAD RESURFACING SET FOR COMMUNITY

The main roads in Lauderdale West will be repayed in the next 12 months.

Campanelli Drive, as well as roads circling the main lake and those leading to Pine Island Road, are scheduled to be improved. Cleary Blvd. between University Drive and Pine Island Road is also on the list.

The Plantation City Council passed a necessary resolution June 10 that clears the way for the city to obtain \$2.7 million via the Broward County Penny for Transportation Surtax that voters approved in 2018. The county oversight board approved the plan on June 5, the council passed its resolution, then the Broward Board of Commissioners gave final approval on June 16.

Other repaving is located along: Commodore Drive (the very western part of Plantation) and an area between University Drive and Pine Island Road that includes SW Sixth Street, SW 78th Avenue and Southwest 10th Street.

According to the proposal, the roads approved are often frequented by buses and transit vehicles. That detail allows work on those roads to be placed at a higher priority.

The document approved by the city council has the work being performed from Nov. 1 through May 31.

As you might know, other roads, mostly in east Plantation, were improved using bond money that Plantation voters approved in 2017.

### **SOLID WASTE, RECYCLING & BULK PICKUP**

When Plantation and the surrounding area is under the threat of a hurricane, there is basic information you should remember regarding your trash collection.

### **Solid Waste/Trash & Recycling Collection**

Residential and commercial/multi-family solid waste and recycling collections will be suspended in the event a Hurricane Watch has been posted.

Once debris collection begins, debris must be placed along at the curbside/right-of-way (ROW) and must be separated by debris type.

- **Vegetative Debris** includes shrubs, palm fronds, tree trimmings, grass and leaves, twigs or cut up branches
- Construction & Demolition Debris (C&D) materials relating directly to construction or demolition of buildings, such as cement, dry-wall, glass, insulation, concrete blocks, etc

- White Goods Debris appliances, including refrigerators, ranges, washing machines, clothes dryers, freezers, microwave ovens, air conditioners, etc
- **E-Goods Debris** Electronics, including TVs, computers, stereos, phones, DVD players, etc.

### **Bulk Pickup**

Waste Management will also suspend bulk trash pickup once a Hurricane Watch has been posted.

### Make sure you follow these rules to ensure your debris is collected:

- All storm related landscaping debris should be placed in a pile on your property's swale adjacent to, but not blocking, the roadway.
- Tree debris such as branches and tree trunks should be cut into sections and piled neatly together.
- Place vegetative debris away from mailboxes, water meters, street signs, light poles, and fire hydrants to allow room for heavy machinery to pick up debris.
- Do not place debris in the roadway, where it can fall into the roadway, or on top of storm drains.
- UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES should bulk pickup items be comingled with landscape/vegetation. Mixed loads WILL NOT be picked up.

### 7 Items to Leave at Home Not in Your Wallet

Protecting your personal information helps stop identity theft, experts say.

In times when cybercriminals are mining for personal data of all types, losing your wallet or purse can make their job easier. So, experts say, leave at home documents and information that could make you a target for identity theft or worse. "If you don't need it, don't keep it in your wallet," says Charity Lacey, vice president, communications for the Identity Theft Resource Center. Carrying unnecessary items, such as your Social Security card, "gives someone access to who you are," Lacey says, and among the biggest risks is identity theft. Whether your wallet or purse is lost or stolen, the person who ends up with it "can create a whole identity around what is in it," she says.

One single item lost or stolen doesn't necessarily lead to identity theft, but a combination of these items increases the risk.

### 1. Social Security Card

Avoid carrying your card. If you suspect your Social Security number is being used, report it to the Social Security Administration Fraud Hotline, 800-269-0271.

### 2. Birth Certificate

It's a critical piece of personal data that can be used to obtain a replacement Social Security card, a passport, or a driver's license. In short, you don't want to lose it, misplace it or have it stolen. Once it gets into a thief's hands, there is little you can do, according to the Identity Theft Resource Center.

### 3. Medicare and Health Insurance Cards

Criminals can use your cards to access your account numbers, and obtain medical care that will be charged to your account or to send fake bills to your health insurer on your record.

### 4. Passports

It's best not to carry your passport with you, but to make a copy of it and leave it in a hotel safe while traveling. To report your passport lost or stolen contact the U.S. Department of State at 877-487-2778

### 5. Checkbook or Blank Checks

Stop carrying a blank check in your wallet or your checkbook in your purse. One blank check with your account number and bank routing number printed on it gives criminals access to every cent in that account.

### 6. Password Cheat Sheet

While this might seem innocent enough, it actually presents a major risk. It "might just be the worst thing to lose," says Drew Paik, business development director for Authentic8, an internet software company focused on security in Mountain View, California.

### 7. Work Identification Badge

An employee identification badge can include encoded information about an individual by using barcodes, magnetic stripes, radio-frequency identification (RFID) tags, and smart chips. Some companies use first name only to protect the employee. Report a lost or stolen identification badge to your employer as soon as possible.

### If you lose your wallet, take these steps:

- Place a fraud alert on your credit reports. A fraud alert, which lasts for one year, can make it more difficult for thieves to open accounts in your name, according to the Federal Trade Commission.
- o You can ask one of the three nationwide credit bureaus to place a fraud alert, and it must tell the other two credit bureaus to do so as well.
- Report suspected identity theft to IdentityTheft.gov or the FTC hotline at 877-438-4338.

#### Keep your account(s) secure:

What you can do now to help fight fraud

#### 1. Use your bank's mobile app

• The mobile app is the best way for you to stay on top of any suspicious account activity.

#### 2. Check your contact information

- You're not the only one protecting your account. Your bank and credit card company are working to protect you. If they spot an issue, they want to get in touch with you the quickest way possible.
- Provide your mobile number so they can alert you to potential fraud.

#### 3. Create a strong unique password

- Strong passwords are 8 or more characters long and include a combination of numbers, symbols and upper- and lowercase letters.
- Use multifactor authentication when possible.

#### 4. Protect your devices

• Keep your phone, tablet and computer up to date with the latest browser, operating system and antivirus software.

#### 5. Keep your account information secure

- · Go paperless.
- Never write your PIN on the back of your card.
- Use trusted online payment methods, such as Bill Pay or Zelle ® instead of writing checks.

#### 6. Know the red flags that signal a scam

- Scammers pressure people to send money, threaten law enforcement action or demand gift cards as a form of payment

- No child under the age of 16 is allowed in the spa/hot tub
- · No jumping, running or loud noise in the pool area
- No food, drink or glass is allowed in the pool area
- Vacate the pool area during rain, thunder or lightning sitting under the metal awnings is dangerous
- Incontinent or non-trained individuals must wear swim diapers
- No smoking or vaping is allowed in the pool area

#### THE 1935 LABOR DAY HURRICANE

The storm had no name and later became known as the "1935 Labor Day Hurricane". It was the most intense hurricane ever to affect the United States the evening of Labor Day, September 2, 1935 with maximum sustained winds of 185 mph and a storm surge of approximately 18 to 20 feet. It was one of four Category 5 hurricanes on record to strike the contiguous United States, along with Hurricane Andrew in 1992, Hurricane Camille in 1969, and Hurricane Michael in 2018.

# BROWARD COUNTY PARTNERSHIP

Launched in October 2011, the Broward Water Partnership (BWP) is a coalition of 18 Broward County municipalities and water utilities created to educate residents and businesses about water resources and the importance of conserving water for current and future sustainability. The BWP has promoted water conservation throughout Broward County through various forms of media. It has awarded rebates to participating residents and businesses.

#### What are some basic water conservation tips and practices?

- Replace aerators in kitchen and bathroom sinks with low-flow models rated for 1.5 gallons per minute or less.
- Replace old, pre-1994 toilets with high-efficiency toilets. 1.28 gallons per flush with a MaP rated 800-1000 grams for best conservation measures.
- Install low-flow water showerheads, shorten your shower time to five minutes, and use only 10-25 gallons of water. Filling a bathtub can take up to 70 gallons of water; take showers instead.
- Turn off the faucets while shaving, brushing your teeth, lathering your hands or face.
- Install low-flow, energy efficient dishwashers and clothes washers. Only run full loads of dishes and laundry.
- Follow the County's year-round landscape irrigation water conservation measures and local ordinances.
- Fix all leaks: toilets, all indoor faucets and outdoor spigots. Even the smallest leaks are wasteful and expensive; fixing leaks will reduce your bill.
- Use a broom, not the hose, to clean the sidewalk, patio, or driveway.


