## HURRICANE READINESS

Hope for 3 days/plan for 7
These are the supplies you should already have in your house:

DRINKING WATER - Enough for one gallon per person per day for 3 – 5 days, preferably 2 weeks. Extra water is needed for food preparation and personal hygiene.

FOOD – Enough for 3 to 5 days, including non-perishable packaged or canned food, canned or shelf milk, cereal, tuna, peanut butter, snack food, etc.

MANUAL can opener/bottle opener

PAPER goods – plates, cups, eating utensils, towels, heavy duty aluminum foil

UNSCENTED household bleach and medicine dropper FIRST AID KIT and YOUR PERSONAL MEDICINES HAND sanitizer

FLASHLIGHTS, BATTERY-OPERATED RADIO and extra batteries

PET supplies

TOOL KIT - hammer, axe, wood nails, saw

PLASTIC trash bags and ties

EXTRA charcoal or propane for outdoor cooking – DO NOT cook inside your house

MATCHES IN WATERPROOF CONTAINER

MOSQUITO REPELLENT with DEET and SUNSCREEN PAPERWORK: Store originals in a safety deposit box but have copies of:

Birth certificate; property titles; social security cards; passports; insurance records; credit card numbers; medical records including prescription numbers; phone numbers of relatives and doctors; household inventory – place in a plastic baggie

ANY special items YOU may need!

IF YOU EVACUATE: bedding, blankets, clothing, rain gear, and good shoes/not flip flops

## **BULK PICKUP GUIDELINES**

(as per the City of Plantation Waste Disposal Department) Bulk Pick Up will **NOT** pick up the following:

Electronics, Glass, Mirrors, Paint cans, X-rays Any construction materials - including dry wall. You should not box anything – place in the clear City of Plantation bags.

You can put empty cardboard boxes out.

## GARBAGE PICK UP

Tuesday - blue bags and clear recycle bags
Friday - BLUE bags ONLY
Once a month - bulk pick up

#### BUYER BEWARE

When you need to hire someone to do work in your home, be sure to check the insurance and license of the person. The person/company needs to have a recent license by the City of Plantation if their business is in the City. Be sure to see a copy of their insurance to confirm they have coverage.

## HURRICANE PRECAUTION

We are in the hurricane season. If you have any outside pots, garden art, lights, umbrellas, hanging plants...please be sure to remove them if a hurricane warning is issued. These lovely artifacts can and will become dangerous projectiles during a storm and can cause serious damage. Just remember last year and Hurricane Irma which made landfall on September 10, 2017.

To prevent damage, please remove them when preparing the rest of your home should a storm threaten.

#### OFFICE PROTOCOL

## FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK....

From Joanne Hill and our Attorneys

#### The Amendment Process

As you know, the Board of Directors recently proposed 25 amendments to our community's governing documents. 14 of these amendments applied to the single family homes, and the remaining 11 applied to the plexes.

We were so pleased with the response to our efforts ... with 376 plex owners and 558 single family home owners participating, nearly 70% of all Lauderdale West owners voted in the amendment process! This is almost unheard of for a community our size, and it's definitely unprecedented for our community specifically. The Board would like to sincerely thank those owners who took the time to participate.

Surely, this has been an eye-opening experience for us. Every single amendment proposed by the Board received overwhelming support from those owners who participated in this process. In fact, of the 25 proposed amendments, 23 received the approval of more than 80% of the members who voted. More than 80%! Some of the amendments even received approval in excess of 90% of the members who voted. Again, this was an incredible response. The involvement of owners is so very important in keeping our community a wonderful place to live, and we sincerely appreciate your interest, your efforts, and your participation.

But that's the silver lining. Unfortunately, our documents have some outdated provisions that require the approval of two-thirds of ALL owners, not just those owners who participate in the amendment process by voting. The proposed amendments would have easily passed if our documents were modernized to reflect a more achievable vote of 60% of all owners, or even a simple majority (50% plus 1).

It is clear from the overwhelmingly positive response from the community that our members were in favor of the proposed amendments, and the wording of our governing documents prevented the will of the owners from being implemented. With this in mind, the Board of Directors may consider an amendment to bring our documents current, so that the voting requirement to approve amendments would be reduced as mentioned above. We can then, once again, propose amendments to our governing documents with full faith that our members will continue to participate in this important process.

Again, thank you to everyone who participated in the recent amendment vote in an effort to improve all of our homes and investments. I also want to thank all those volunteers who made telephone calls, went door to door, helped organize the proxies. The Directors should not be forgotten as well. They worked tirelessly to bring this to fruition. I also want to send a special thank you to Steve Weinberg, Harry Mirabile and Michael Kassower and the paralegals and assistants at Frank, Weinberg and Black, our attorneys, who have been working on this project with us for several years. They were also instrumental in writing this article and providing the analysis here and the vote calculations presented in this issue. I cannot thank everyone enough!

Again, thank you to everyone who participated in the recent amendment vote in an effort to improve all of our homes and investments. We look forward to working with you again in the near future to keep making Lauderdale West the best possible place to live.

## MAINTENANCE PROCEDURE

If you have a situation which needs the Maintenance Department, you MUST contact Edna in the Maintenance Office **directly** at 954-473-2595 or by email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org. DO NOT ADDRESS OUR MAINTENANCE STAFF CONCERNING YOUR ISSUE.

When you call the Maintenance Office, you will receive a **work order number** which you will need to KEEP until your job is completed.

You will be given a time frame when Maintenance will come to your home. IF THE WORK TO BE DONE IS IN-SIDE YOUR HOME, please make sure you are home or your **work order** will be closed and you will need to call and make a new appointment. If the work to be done is outside your home, you do not need to be at home when the work is done.

Please do not address our Maintenance staff concerning your issue – this will only delay your job getting done. Remember – contact Edna in the Maintenance Office at 954-473-2595, Monday – Friday 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. or email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org and get a WORK ORDER NUMBER

# IN AN EFFORT TO AVOID PLUMBING PROBLEMS:

DO NOT FLUSH:

- · Flushable cleansing wipes
  - Cigarette butts
  - · Towels paper or cloth
    - · Diapers any size
- PLEASE ONLY FLUSH TOILET PAPER

## **EMERGENCY EXIT DOORS**

In the Main Clubhouse there are double glass doors that are alarmed for security purposes. There is red signage on each door stating that it is an **Emergency Exit - Do Not Use.** 

If you choose to ignore this signage, you will receive a letter stating not to use the doors and if you do it again, you will be fined \$50. Please - obey the signs.

## **VERY IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

We have been asked by the Waste Management Company to remind our residents NOT to put glass and/or mirrors out for pickup – regular garbage or bulk pick up. These create a hazardous situation due to the ease at which they break. Thank you for your cooperation.

## **MAINTENANCE ISSUES**

There have been some issues over the last few months regarding our Maintenance Department and what they will charge for certain services. Please read:

Regarding Emergency calls: When you call Maintenance after hours, make sure you truly have an emergency and not a situation that can wait until the next business day. If one of our Maintenance staff goes to your home and it is NOT a true emergency, then the homeowner will be billed for the overtime expense. An example of this would be one toilet is clogged, but you still have another working toilet.

Regarding Excessive Maintenance calls dealing with the same problem: It is during the first visit that the resident is instructed what is needed to correct the problem. It is the second, third and sometimes the fourth call that shows the resident does not always comply but continues to call Maintenance.

The Board has discussed this and has decided to start charging residents who do not comply and fix the problem. After the second visit for the same problem, the resident will receive a letter stating the problem and the need to fix it. If there is a third call, the resident will then be charged \$50 for non-compliance as well as the cost of the maintenance call for the problem. An example of this would be if the resident keeps calling maintenance for a clogged toilet – it is found that the resident is flushing cleansing wipes into the toilet (even those stating they are flushable). After the second visit, the resident will receive a letter stating they should not flush anything except toilet tissue down the toilet. If there is a third call for a clogged toilet due to cleansing wipes, the resident will be charged \$50 plus \$300 for the repeat plumbing call.

## **MAINTENANCE EMERGENCIES**

If you have a true maintenance emergency, you must call **954-473-2595** – press(dial) 1. Do not just leave a message.

When you call Maintenance after hours, make sure you truly have an emergency and not a situation that can wait until the next day. If one of our Maintenance staff goes to your home and it is NOT a true emergency, then the homeowner will be billed for the overtime expense.

## SHUT OFF VALVES

If you are remodeling a kitchen or bathroom and you are putting in a new sink counter or vanity, it is your contractor's responsibility to move the turn off valves for access to shut off the water.

## **REGARDING ROOFS**

No one is permitted to hire anyone to do any work on the roof of a house. No one is permitted to go up onto a roof of a house. You will be fined.

# FYI: UPDATE BAIT BOXES

Throughout our community there are rodent bait boxes set up by our pest control company, Dead Bug Edwards, to deter/kill rats. We live in a watered community and wherever you have water, you are more susceptible to rats.

Dead Bug Edwards has numbered each box as well as inventories, cleans, and fills each box on a regular basis. They have been put around the perimeter properties as well as on water properties behind the unit. You, our residents, have been asked not to touch the boxes. They are filled with poison. This poison is harmful to you and/or your pet. This poison is checked regularly and replenished as needed by authorized personnel wearing protective clothing. Again,



we ask you not to move the bait box for any reason. If you should develop a rodent problem and your designated box has been moved, you will be responsible for the costs of removing the rodent instead of LW.

Dead Bug Edwards evaluates the situation regularly. If a rodent problem shows up, boxes can be re-placed to be more effective. You do not need to call requesting a box. Dead Bug Edwards knows where each and every box is located as each box's placement is marked on a large LW map in their offices.

This is how the bait boxes work: These boxes are baited with poison which the rats take back to their nests, hopefully infecting the nest, thus killing more rats. As these boxes are throughout the community, placed against the houses and plexes, not in the bushes, AGAIN, we ask our residents **NOT** to touch or move these boxes. They are being checked regularly and replenished as needed.

Should you develop a rodent problem, please call Maintenance at 954 473-2595 and report it.

Unfortunately, in April, Dead Bug Edwards found that 113 boxes were either missing from its spot or broken. To insure correct protection for our Community, we must now replace them at \$22 a piece (\$2486).

Once again, DO NOT TOUCH these boxes or move them. Thank you.

## **SWIMMING POOL RULES**

This is just a reminder that everyone must follow the posted pool rules, especially:

- · Do not prop open a pool area gate
- Shower **BEFORE** entering the pool as this is a Health Department regulation
- Do allow residents who are swimming laps the right of way if you are just standing, walking or talking in the pool
- No diving allowed
- Children must be supervised by an adult, at all times, in the pool area, especially when they are in the water
- No jumping, running or loud noise in the pool area
- · No food or drink or glass in the pool area
- Vacate the pool **area** during rain, thunder or lightning sitting under the metal awnings is dangerous

The Lauderdale West Community Association reserves the right to deny the use of the pool or pool area to anyone at any time for just cause.

## ZIKA PREVENTION

Help prevent mosquitoes and Zika in our area by removing any standing water. Mosquitoes can develop in as much as a capful of water so please make sure your plants and plant saucers do not have standing water. Water in pet water dishes, as well as bird baths, should be changed several times a week.

Also, check your air conditioning drip pans for any standing water. If you cannot remove the water by yourself, contact maintenance for assistance in fixing the issue at 954-473-2595.

## **MOVING SALE PROTOCOL**

If you have sold your house in Lauderdale West and will be moving out, you may hold a **one day** sale provided you get permission from the President. Should you not get permission, you will be asked to shut the sale down immediately. Please remember, you may not place any signs on Lauderdale West property. Thank you for your cooperation and best of luck in your new home.

## MODIFICATION NEWS

If you are doing any modifications to your home or plex, you need to fill out the Lauderdale West paperwork and have it approved by the Board. If you are not available to come in during regular hours, 9 am — noon, you can call Kristi Woods, 954-473-8219, ext. 109, during the morning hours and set up an appointment.

Any resident, doing any improvement, especially hurricane modification, is asked to fill out a form upon completion of the modification so the information about your unit is up to date in the LW files.

If your modification causes a problem, such as a leak, you are responsible for the repairs.

## SHARING THE POOL

Lauderdale West is very fortunate to have two swimming pools. Each and every day, many use these facilities - whether swimming, sunbathing, pool walking, water exercising or chit chatting, etc., it is busy.

Those residents who are swimming laps and have a momentum going DO have the right of way over those walking & talking.

Please - SHARE the pool. If you see a swimmer, move off to the side. They can keep swimming laps and you can keep walking and talking.

Thank you for your cooperation.

## REGARDING THE ANTS HERE IN LW

Itty bitty, brown, black, big headed, white footed...there are so many different types of ants and they all seem to be here in Lauderdale West. Our exterminating company, Dead Bug Edwards, sprays around every house/plex each month. While this spray will not deter the ants, the ants will walk through the sprayed area and the poison will stay on them. They then take it back to the other ants. Now, with all this rain, they want out of the water too, thus trying to find an opening, (they only need an opening the thickness of a piece of paper to get through) and enter our homes to die. You may try your own concoctions to get rid of them, but the bodies do seem to be endless during the summer, which is their spawning season.

Hopefully before our next issue of the LWNews, we will see less ants, alive or dead, in our homes. Hang in there – you live in the tropics! For severe infestations, call maintenance to have it checked – you are entitled to 2 cleanout sprays within a year as our spraying is working – it is killing them.

## NOTICE TO LANDLORDS

If you have purchased a property in Lauderdale West within the last year and you are thinking of renting it out before the 1 year waiting period, please be advised that you will be fined \$100 up to \$1000, and those to whom you rent, will be evicted. Please abide by our DOCs.



## ROOM RENTAL PROCEDURE

LW will only rent out room 113 for immediate family functions up to 70 people. The cost to rent room 113 is \$50; set up and cleanup is \$50; security deposit is \$500.

The paperwork needed to rent 113 is as follows: photo ID, Declaration page for your Homeowners/Renters Insurance; the 3 checks.

If you are interested, please call the clubhouse any morning from 9 am until noon and you will be directed to the room coordinator.

We all really need to pay special attention to our personal safety here in Lauderdale West and wherever we should travel. How, you may ask? Please follow the guidelines below and we will succeed:

- Let us not open the door to anyone we do not know and did not invite
- Let us double check with the utility company if a worker just knocks at your door. Call the company to verify the work order for your home (FPL; AT&T; Comcast; Plantation Utilities, etc.)
- Let us always lock our doors, in our home and in our cars
   ALL the time
- Let us not give anyone our personal information, especially our social security numbers or bank account numbers
- Let us not walk alone use the buddy system and walk during daylight
- Let us all post our No Solicitation signage and not be afraid to call the Police's nonemergency number (954-797-2100) it is good to be safe rather than sorry.

## **HELP US HELP OUR COMMUNITY!**

If you know someone in your community or have a friend or family member who may be vulnerable in the event of an emergency such as a hurricane, please encourage them to pre-register in the Vulnerable Population Registry on the Broward.org website. The Registry is for residents who are at risk due to a disability, frailty or health issue, regardless of age, who choose to shelter at home. The Vulnerable Population Registry is a tool that municipalities can use to help evaluate resident needs in their communities and assist in planning a response in an emergency. While registering in the database is not a guarantee that they will be provided services or placed on a priority list for responders, it will help responders be better prepared to meet their needs in a recovery. Emergency preparedness is a community effort!

## IMPORTANT IMFORMATION REGARDING YOUR NEW ROOF

Your new roof should not be pressure washed or painted for at least seven (7) years. You cannot paint or clean the flashing above the fascia board. It must remain in its original, white condition.

You, your agent or contractor should not walk on the roof. If you have any leaks or concerns about your roof in the future, you should immediately contact our Maintenance Office at 954-473-2595.

If you, your agent or contractor walk on the roof, wash it, paint it or perform any maintenance or repairs, you, as owner, will be responsible for any and all costs of repairs or replacement of the roof in the future as you will void our contractor's warranty.

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me or a member of your Board of Directors.

## **PEST CONTROL POLICY**

If you think you have a pest problem, call Edna at the Maintenance Office, 954-473-2595 or email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org - You will be given a work order number. Dead Bug Edwards cannot do anything without a work order. Maintenance will then call the pest control company for you.

Dead Bug Edwards has been very generous in their spraying inside units for small ants. As per our contract, Dead Bug Edwards sprays around each and every unit every month. This spray will eliminate the need for inside spraying. There are some rare instances that do require inside spraying and Dead Bug Edwards will take care of these situations. Unfortunately, some of our residents expect monthly sprayings.

Effective immediately, if you have excessive repeat calls for spraying inside for the small ants, due to crumbs or food, etc., you will be allowed 2 inside sprays per year; anything more will be deemed excessive. You will be charged for the spraying, \$115 per spray. Please be sure you clean up and not leave food out or have crumbs which brings ants.

Failure to maintain outside of residence for aesthetics/ health compliance	\$50
Unapproved plantings of shrubs, bushes or trees on common grounds	\$100
Planting of trees on LW property plus cost of removal by our Maintenance Department	\$50
Feeding ducks Pet Nuisance complaints: unleashed dogs; not picking up after	\$50
Dog; excessive barking; unregistered dog	\$ 50
Vandalism to LW property	\$100

## The following are the violation fines per day:

Overnight parking of unauthorized vehicles/trailers, etc.	\$100
Overnight parking on swales, lawns, clubhouse parking lots, etc.	\$100
Unauthorized signage (political, for sale, etc.)	\$50
Unauthorized colors on fascia, shutters, etc.	\$50
Failure to illuminate: pole light per night; rear security light(plex)	\$20

The second notification for the same violation within 6 months automatically imposes a fine of \$100.

\*Allow to add to this list as need may arise.

# LAUDERDALE WEST VIOLATION PROCEDURES AND FINES

# When a resident violates a rule, the following is the procedure in the Fining Process:

#### Procedure:

- 1. A resident in violation will receive an initial letter regarding a maintenance/violation issue.
- 2. A recheck of the property will be performed and if necessary, a second letter is sent regarding incomplete issues.
- 3. If the incomplete issues are not corrected within 15 days from the date of the second letter, Board approval will be obtained and a Certified letter will be sent stating the fine which is to be paid within 30 days from the date of the Certified letter. You will be notified that the Board will discuss your issue. You can attend the Board meeting but you CANNOT speak at the LW Board meeting concerning your issue.

This letter will also state that Lauderdale West will proceed to do the work and charge the resident for the work in addition to the fine.

When a resident receives the Certified letter stating the levied fine(s), the resident has the right to a hearing before the LW Fining Committee, within 15 days of receiving the Certified letter.

If the resident would like to request a hearing, the resident needs to go to the Main Clubhouse, fill out the Right to Hearing Form and turn it in to the Board Director overseeing the Fining Committee within the 15 days. You will be allowed to speak to the Fining Committee concerning your issue.

The Fining Committee, which meets two(2) times a month, will make the ultimate decision to confirm or reverse the fine. The Fining Committee is comprised of owners from each of the four(4) phases in Lauderdale West and one additional owner, the Chairperson.

Second or subsequent offense of same violation within six(6) months— automatically doubles the fine.

If someone is having a stroke, the sooner you get them medical help, the better the chance of survival. There is a three hour window so time is of the essence:


Here are the 4 signs if someone is having a stroke:



With today's movies, TV and the internet, the Burlesque shows of the 30s, 40s and 50s seem basically harmless and innocent.

It all started in France in the late 1800s with The Follies Bergere and Moulin Rouge. At the same time, Lydia Thompson, appearing in tights with her scantily clad British Blondes, introduced Burlesque to America.

In 1893, Little Egypt's Hootchie Kootchie caused a sensation at the Chicago World's Fair. \*Stay Positive: since most people prefer positive words and expressions, use positive language whenever possible. Not only will you feel better but so will whomever you're talking too. Watch out since doing so may make you more popular than ever!

\*Make Friends: recent studies show that the happiest people have strong social networks and that shared laughter among friends can be contagious and beneficial.

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## **BROWARD COUNTY PROPERTY APPRAISER**

#### 2018 TRIM Notices

The Broward County Property Appraiser's Office mails the TRIM (proposed tax) Notices in mid-August each year. The proposed property tax notice will show your 2018 property assessment, exemptions and the proposed taxes along with dates and times for the various taxing authorities' public budget hearings. The TRIM Notice is your opportunity to review your property assessment and ensure you are receiving all the tax-saving exemptions you are entitled to. Our office's contact information will be listed on the newsletter enclosed with the TRIM Notice giving you the opportunity to contact us directly should you have any questions. The absolute deadline to apply for any 2018 exemption or to appeal your property assessment is September 18, 2018.

Many property owners ignore their TRIM Notice until it is too late to appeal an assessment, question the proposed tax rates or file for exemptions. If you wait until you receive your tax bill in November to inquire about your assessment, you will lose your right to appeal. The first thing to know is your taxes are calculated using this formula:

## TAXABLE VALUE x TAX MILLAGE RATES + SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS = TAX BILL

The Property Appraiser determines the market and assessed/Save Our Homes value of your property. Your tax rates and non-ad valorem fees are set by the various taxing authorities (school board, county commission, city commission, hospital district board, water management district, and so on) listed on your TRIM Notice. If you want to question your proposed tax rates, non-ad valorem fees, special assessments or services, you should contact the elected of-

ficials who serve on the taxing authorities and attend the public hearings in September 2018.

Important: The Property Appraiser does not set your tax rates or collect your taxes. Your tax rates are set by the city & county commissions, school board, and other taxing authorities. Additionally, any PACE (Property Assessed Clean Energy) assessments are not included on the TRIM Notice but will appear on the November tax bill sent by the Broward County Tax Collector.

## Why Are My Property Taxes Higher than the Prior Owner's Last Year?

Florida law requires property be reassessed at market value as of January 1 the year following a change in ownership and/or the year the property receives/loses the Homestead Exemption. After this reset in value occurs, the property will be protected by an assessment cap starting the following year. For Homesteaded property, the Assessed/Save Our Homes (SOH) Value can increase by no more than 3% above last year's Assessed/SOH Value (or the consumer price index, whichever is less), regardless of the increase in just value. For tax year 2018, the assessment increase is capped at 2.1% for all Homesteaded properties. For non-Homesteaded property, the assessed value can increase by no more than 10% above last year's assessed value. The 10% cap does not apply to the School Board taxes.

## TICKET OFFICE PROCEDURES

- 1. The Ticket Office is now open all month between shows.
- 2. Reserved seats as well as general seats go on sale the Monday following the last show.
- 3. If reserved seats are not picked up by the following Friday, they will go back into the pool for general purchase. Working residents may pick up their reserved tickets on the Monday evening of the 1st week of ticket sales for the coming show.

- 8. You may pick up your neighbor's tickets for them, with their ID.
- 9. Proper attire should be worn to the shows.
- 10. If you wish to have a reserved seat, please contact Micki at the ticket office. Reserved seats will be assigned based upon availability.

The Ticket Office is open Monday thru Friday, 9:30 – 11:30 am and Monday evening 7 – 8 pm on the 1st Monday evening of sales. We are also open from 6:30 - 7:30 pm the night of the show.

## SCAMS IN LW AND S. FLORIDA

Believe it or not, people are falling victim to scams everyday right here in Lauderdale West – no matter how many times we tell you to CHECK IT OUT before giving information or money. Here are just a couple. Hopefully, we will all become proactive and not fall victim in the future.

GIFT CARDS – someone (friend or family) calls or emails and asks you to buy gift cards for them (maybe they are traveling or sick and can't get out). They will use a name that you will know giving them plausibility. This person will be specific as to how they want it done, ie.: 4 - \$100 cards. You will be asked to scrape off the back of the card where the PIN number is, take a picture on your phone and send this picture to them. That's it! Easy, right? If you called that person, he/she would have told you it was not them doing the asking. By scratching off and getting the PIN number and sending it to the person who called, that person can now use the card, even though they do not have it in their possession and BANG! You are out \$400 or whatever the amount they tell you. There is nothing that can be done to retrieve your money.

YOUR CREDIT CARD HAS BEEN USED IN SOME COUNTRY – someone sounding like he/she is from the bank or credit card company saying that someone has used your card in some foreign country. They tell you they have the last 4 digits but need you to 'verify' the rest of the number so the bank or credit card company can retrieve your card information. If a bank or credit card company has the last 4 digits, they have the whole number. By you giving them the rest of the numbers, they can now go ahead and use your card.

Remember – if you did not initiate the call – do not give out any information, just hang up. If you don't recognize the phone number, do not answer. If you are not sure about anything, verify the information by checking with the person supposedly calling about the gift cards; YOU contact your bank or credit card company and ask if there are charges from another country.

REAL deals will not come to you via the phone or computer. YOU must do the work and then you will know it is not a scam.

## PROTECT YOURSELF FROM FRAUD

On June 5, Kevin M. Gilpin, Director of the National Crime STOP Program, spoke to the Women of Lauderdale West, Inc. South Florida is the worst area for senior fraud in the United States. It is not IF you become a victim of fraud, but WHEN.

Today, hackers just need the internet or to walk by you and using technology, gather your information without you even knowing it was happening.

One of the worse places for fraud to occur is in a restaurant. It is here where we are willing to give our card to someone (servers). We believe they are just going to run it for our bill – but – if they are not on the up-and-up, they can take a picture of your card to use at another time; they can run someone else's bill on your card – are you getting the picture? There are restaurants, such as the Olive Garden and Chili's where they will either bring the swiper to the table for you to watch them or have the swiper already on the table. Your card never leaves your sight. You can ask at any restaurant to see what accommodations they may have. Take note here, you should not be so willing to just hand over your card. Tell the server you want to see your transaction – nothing personal to the server – your protection.

Even companies that oversee our credit get compromised and our personal information is breached. What does it mean 'your personal information has been breached' you might ask? Someone other than you may apply for a loan in your name – they get the money, you get to pay. They may open credit cards in your name – they get the goods – you receive the bills. Your credit rating can be ruined! Mr. Gilpin strongly suggested that you put a CREDIT or SECURITY FREEZE on your credit files. There are phone numbers and internet sites for you in Identity Theft Tips to do this. What this means is that when a third party wants to have your credit checked (a bank or store when opening a new charge card) – the credit company will call you and check to see if you are the one authorizing the check. If you are not authorizing the check, they will not send out your credit report. This will stop a transaction and save your credit rating from being ruined. Hackers can steal your ID and get cards in your name and you won't even know about it until you want to do something yourself or you get bills for items you did not purchase.

Simple things you can do: getting gas – go to the pumps closest to the front door of the building – hardest to put a skimmer on. Stop using the Credit function on your Debit card. Easier to get your information using the Credit – for Debit, your information goes in as XXXX – can't be read.

It is very easy but takes a few minutes to put a Credit/Security Freeze on the 3 credit report bureaus. Do it – it will help keep you from fraud.




