VETERANS' DAY

On November 11, 1919, U.S. president Woodrow Wilson issued a message to his countrymen on the first Armistice Day, in which he expressed what he felt the day meant to Americans:

A year ago today our enemies laid down their arms in accordance with an armistice which rendered them impotent to renew hostilities, and gave to the world an assured opportunity to reconstruct its shattered order and to work out in peace a new and more just set of international relations. The soldiers and people of the European Allies had fought and endured for more than four years to uphold the barrier of civilization against the aggressions of armed force. We ourselves had been in the conflict something more than a year and a half.

With splendid forgetfulness of mere personal concerns, we remodeled our industries, concentrated our financial resources, increased our agricultural output, and assembled a great army, so that at the last our power was a decisive factor in the victory. We were able to bring the vast resources, material and moral, of a great and free people to the assistance of our associates in Europe who had suffered and sacrificed without limit in the cause for which we fought.

Out of this victory there arose new possibilities of political freedom and economic concert. The war showed us the strength of great nations acting together for high purposes, and the victory of arms fore-tells the enduring conquests which can be made in peace when nations act justly and in furtherance of the common interests of men.

To us in America the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service, and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of nations.

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LAUDERDALE WEST NEWS

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PRESIDENT

Thank you: Thank you to all the residents who take the time to attend Board meetings. In exchange for giving up one hour, you have learned what is going on in Lauderdale West and how we manage your financial investment. That is important for all of us. We thank all the residents who have cooperated with our Beautification Project by taking care of the outside of their home when notified. Thank you to my fellow Board Members who donate their time and talent for free for the benefit of our neighbors.

Updating Association Files: We are a registered Over-55 Adult Community, and we are required by law to maintain updated records of all residents. At least one person living in the home must be at least 55 and no one under 18 can live in Lauderdale West. A volunteer is assisting us in reviewing files for missing or outdated information. If you receive a notice that something is missing, please cooperate and get that information to us as soon as possible.

Parking Stickers: We have noticed that there seems to be an increase in the number of cars in Lauderdale West, and many people are not following our parking restrictions. There is no public parking in Lauderdale West. At our Wednesday workshop meetings, we have been talking about issuing parking decals for residents to place on their cars. This would identify cars that belong on our private property. Cars that do not have a sticker may get towed at the owner's expense. We will keep you updated when that will begin.

Animal Accommodation: Lauderdale West is a pet-free community as per our Association Documents. All residents who need to have an animal in their home must make a request in writing. There is a form on our website for your convenience. A volunteer is assisting us in reviewing files for missing or outdated information on all existing animal approvals. We have reinstated enforcing the pet restriction at the Board of Directors' meeting on August 17, 2022. All approved animals will

receive an ID tag. If you received approval before July 2022, you will need to provide updated information now and on a regular basis if requested. All unregistered animals **must** be removed from the Community, or the owner will be in violation and may be fined. We will keep you updated when that will start.

Board Meetings and Minutes: All Board and Budget meetings are recorded and posted on the Lauderdale West channel 902. Minutes of Board and Budget meetings are posted to our Lauderdale West Website. The agenda for the next Board meeting is posted on the website and the Official Bulletin Board outside the clubhouse 48 hours in advance of the meeting.

For Your Safety: We continue to remind everyone that Lauderdale West is a property of almost three hundred uneven acres and walking on the grassy areas is dangerous. Unfortunately, due to iguana holes, tree roots and holes from fallen trees, the ground area is uneven, and holes may not be obvious. Please use the walkways, sidewalks and roadways when walking about. Walking on the grassy areas may not be safe and doing so is at your own risk.

It is so wonderful to have a pool where you live to enjoy swimming, exercising or going in the pool just to refresh yourself from a hot day while relaxing and talking with friends.

People who insist on applying suntan lotion and entering our pools or hot tubs **WITHOUT** first showering are a detriment to keeping our pools not only clean, but OPEN and AVAILABLE!

Because some residents have not abided by Lauderdale West regulations, we recently needed to service our pools at a cost of \$3,000 to remove suntan lotion gunk from the filtration system and the walls of the pool. We would have avoided this cost and an addition to our budget if residents would simply comply with showering before entering the pool.

Please be aware that cameras are always on in the pool areas. Violators must and will be held accountable. If someone from the Broward County Department of Health is onsite and observes such activity, our beautiful Lauderdale West pools will be shut down. Imagine one day, there are no pools at Lauderdale West. Imagine there is no longer water fun. It could happen. Please shower before entering our pools. Be vigilant and suggestive to those who are violating but may not be aware of our policy and that of Broward County.

Thanking everyone in advance for keeping our pools clean.

- **LW Channel 901** in slide presentation form, provides you with tips and updates on LW activities. Blue Stream allows you to fast forward, back up or pause as you view the slides.
- **LW Channel 902** Did you miss that last Budget or Board Meeting? Channel 902 provides the last meeting held in repeating format which you can watch in the comfort of your home.
- **LW Website** www.lauderdalewest.org is a one-stop shopping way to learn about LW activities, rules & regulations, clubs and view prior Board Meetings.

Stay informed the right way and be well!




Our Lauderdale West Community has established principles of conduct for the general good and welfare of all our owners, tenants, and guests. Every resident of our Lauderdale West Community has the right to live peacefully in their home and has the right to expect that the value of their property will be upheld in a reasonable manner.

The Board of Directors would like to remind everyone of the following:

- For the safety of everyone, we MUST follow all parking restrictions and the directional signs in the parking lots.
- Owners, tenants, and guests are required to follow our documents and rules and regulations.
- Owners are responsible to maintain the exterior of their homes (gutters, awnings, patios, land-scaping).

- Residents are not permitted to install any plants, shrubs, or trees without written Board approval.
- Owners (Landlords) must contact the Maintenance Department for all service requests for their property. Requests will not be accepted from tenants or guests.
- Owners, tenants, and guests are required to follow City ordinances regarding animals.
- Owners are required to seek approval for all home modifications in advance.
- Front pole lights and rear security lights must be kept on at night.
- Owners are responsible for their tenants and guests.
- Residents must respect quiet times from 10:00 PM to 8:00 AM.
- Non-adherence to the Lauderdale West documents and rules and regulations will result in the resident being fined accordingly.

DATABASE UPDATE! we need your help!

If you are receiving mail from Lauderdale West addressed to you and your deceased spouse, parent or significant other, please contact Joanne Hill either by phone or email. (Telephone: 954-473-8219 Ext. 114 or jhill@lauderdalewest. org). We require a copy of the death certificate to update our records. Please comply if appropriate. This is very important. Thank you.



ABOUT LIVING IN LAUDERDALE WEST

LANDLORDS Please remember that you cannot rent your property until you have owned it for one year. All tenants must complete an Application for Residency which is available on our website. All leases and lease renewals must be approved by the Board before the tenant can move in. Contact Director Marlene Newman for additional information.

MAILBOX SAFETY We recommend that you not place any outgoing mail in the mailbox in front of your home. In the past, individuals have been known to remove that mail. You can safely deposit your outgoing mail in the blue Postal Service Mailbox located at the end of the parking lot of the Main Clubhouse or take it directly to any US Post Office. Incoming mail should also be removed from your mailbox at your first opportunity.

MODIFICATIONS If you are planning to make any changes to your home, you must complete an Application for Modification. All modifications must be approved by the Board before any work is started. Modifications may include A/C, windows, doors, patios, enclosures, electrical, plumbing, and widening of driveways. The City of Plantation requires permits for most modifications which includes plumbing and electrical work. Contact Director Kristi Woods for additional information.

PARKING Overnight parking is not permitted on any street in Lauderdale West. Parking at the Main Clubhouse and the Annex (Satellite Clubhouse) is limited to those using the clubhouse facilities, the pools/spas, or the tennis courts. Other parking requires written Board approval, and a limited parking permit is available. There is no overnight parking in **ANY** of our parking lots without prior permission to do so. A notice will be placed on illegally parked vehicles before being towed at the vehicle owner's expense. Follow the directional arrows in all parking lots to avoid a fine.

SPEEDING The speed limit in Lauderdale West is **25 miles per hour**. All our walkers and bike riders have the right of way. Slow down when you see them. Stop at all stop signs. Signal for all turns. Follow the directional arrows in all parking lots and drive slowly. Driving through the parking lots as a short cut is not permitted. Violators will

be fined. Plantation police are asked to monitor our roadways.

WALKING There is traffic early morning and late evening hours in Lauderdale West. Residents need to be careful walking in the dark. You should wear reflective clothing, carry a flashlight, and remember to walk against the traffic if there is no sidewalk.

WIDENING OF DRIVEWAYS If sprinkler heads and pipes are destroyed during the widening process, they must be replaced by Gary Cox Irrigation and the resident will be charged for the replacement. Each job is priced differently depending on the part and labor. When that is complete, the resident is responsible for replacement of the sod.

TRASH All trash must be placed in City of Plantation blue bags **at least 5 feet from your mailbox**. Trash pickup is on Tuesdays and Fridays. You are permitted to place trash out **after** 5 PM the night before.

RECYCLE All recycle items **MUST** be placed in City of Plantation clear bags or paper bags **at least 5 feet from your mailbox**. Recycle pickup is on Tuesday only. Boxes must be flattened first and placed alongside the clear bags.

BULK PICKUP You may put large bulk items at the curb. Please see the Newsletter for the exact date or refer to the Plantation Waste Management website. All items MUST be placed at least 5 feet from mailbox, trees, and street signs so as not to interfere with the grabber arm. Black bags will not be picked up.



MONTHLY MAINTENANCE PAY-MENTS are due on or before the first day of each month; NOT the 5th, NOT the 10th.

If not paid by the 10th, a late fee will be assessed, and you will receive a letter from the LW Board of Directors. If payment is not made within 30 days, expect to receive a collection letter from the Lauderdale West attorneys. Once your account is turned over to our attorneys for collection, you will also be responsible for their fees (\$195) for the preparation and service of that collection letter plus FedEx postage. Please remember, all fees are subject to increase.

OFFICE PROTOCOLS

For our Board to be more efficient in the handling of their responsibilities, a procedural policy continues to be in place.

- 1. Please make your first stop the Front Desk in the Lobby.
- 2. Provide your name, address, and the area of your concern.
- 3. The Lobby Assistant will then notify the Board Member overseeing that area that you are waiting in the Lobby.

Residents are discouraged from just walking into the President's or other Board Member's office with their concerns. Residents are discouraged from lingering around a Board Member's door. We ask that you wait in the Lobby - you will be called when it is your turn.

EVERYONE'S TIME IS IMPORTANT AND THIS WILL ENSURE THAT ALL RESIDENTS ARE SEEN IN A TIMELY MANNER.

We ask for your cooperation, which will enable the Board to budget their time to conduct the business of Lauderdale West. Thank you.



If you are planning on selling, please clean up the outside of your home. Any plants, trees or bushes on the common area must be removed; awnings cleaned and painted; flower beds weeded; and patios and driveways pressure washed. The most common holdup in processing the sale of your home is the seller's delay in cleaning up the outside of their home. Be proactive – avoid delays and clean up now!

If you have sold or are selling your house in Lauderdale West and will be moving out, you may hold a one-day sale provided you receive permission from the Board President. Should you not get permission, you will be asked to shut the sale down immediately.

Please remember, you may not place any signs on Lauderdale West property. Thank you for your cooperation and best of luck in your new home.

GUIDE FOR LIVING - REVISION

The following paragraph has been added to the Lauderdale West Guide for Living:

New Owners must provide the Association with a copy of their deed and settlement statement within 7 days of closing their purchase to ensure that they are registered as the owner of the property in Lauderdale West Community Association No. 1, Inc. We cannot update our records without this information and failure to do so may be a violation. Records must be updated before you can receive your Lauderdale West photo ID, door fobs and parking permit stickers for your vehicles. Parking permit stickers are required to avoid any vehicles being towed at the vehicle owner's expense.

LANDLORDS

- Landlords are responsible for the upkeep of their property.
- The Association will not accept service requests from tenants.
- Landlords must contact the Maintenance Department for all service requests for their property.
- Please advise your tenants that they must contact you and you will contact the Maintenance Department.

UOICEMAIL

When leaving a voice mail message for your Directors, the Maintenance Department, and/or other departments, please speak **slowly** and **clearly**. Provide your name,

address, telephone number and a **brief** description of your issue. Please repeat and spell your last name and repeat your telephone number. *Thank you.*



Have you discontinued your telephone land line? Are you using a cell phone instead? Do we have your correct contact information? If you have not already done so, please complete the Resident Contact Update Form on our Website: www.lauderdalewest.org. Just click on the "Resident Contact Update" tab to fill out the simple online form. The tab can be found on the main page, third tab on the left in light blue.

If you do not have access to a computer and the internet, you may obtain a form in the Main Clubhouse at the front desk.

It is vital that you complete the Resident Contact Update Form at your earliest opportunity to ensure your information is correct and current.



OR FAMILY REAL ESTATE TRANSFERS

Lauderdale West is required to maintain correct, up-to-date information on all homeowners. If you inherit a plex or single-family home in Lauderdale West, you must notify the Applications/Sales Office immediately @ (954) 473-8219 Ext. 127. Before we can change the name in our records, we will need information from you, such as a completed application which can be found on our website. We will also need a copy of the death certificate and a copy of the legal papers giving you rights to the property.

When we have updated our records, you will be able to live here or sell the home. This also applies if you are transferring the property to another family member or a trust. Written Board approval is required of all owners regardless of how you acquired the property. We cannot issue a Certificate of Approval if we do not have the complete and correct information that can be found in the application. Remember, you cannot rent the property for one year after acquisition of title. Thank you for your cooperation.



POLE LIGHTS

If your pole light is not working, make sure the switch inside your home is on. If it still does not work after dark or it stays on during the day, call the **Maintenance Department at 954-473-2595.** They can also replace any missing or damaged numbers on your globe.



WATER SHUT-OFFVALVES

If you are remodeling a kitchen or bathroom, it is your contractor's responsibility to move the water shut-off valves for easy access.

We Need Your Help

Our maintenance workers have found that many of our water spigots/ fountains have been TWISTED to fill some type of containers or water bottles. This makes them loose and will ruin them eventually where they cannot be fixed or repaired. Please – DO NOT twist or turn the spigots for our water outlets.



BEES AND WASPS

If there are beehives in your area, stay away from them. We have a beekeeper who will come to your location and remove the hives. Honeybees are not destroyed but moved to a safer environment. Africanized bees are destroyed as they are dangerous.

If you see a wasp nest, please contact Bernadette Brodmerkel @ 954-473-8219, Ext. 104. Someone will be sent to spray the nest and remove it.

MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES

If you have a situation which requires the Maintenance Department, you **MUST** contact Edna in the Maintenance Office directly at 954-473-2595 or by email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org. **DO NOT** address our maintenance staff concerning your issue as this will only delay your job getting done.

If the work to be done is outside your home, you do not need to be at home when the work is done.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES: Maintenance staff are not available for emergency calls after business hours or on weekends. If you have a plumbing or electrical emergency after business hours or on a weekend, you must call an outside contractor at your own expense. If you have a "medical emergency", please call 911 immediately.

REMEMBER: Contact Edna in the Maintenance Office at 954-473-2595, Monday – Friday 8 AM – 4 PM or email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org and get a work order number.



RAIN GUTTERS

All gutters are the responsibility of the owner. They must be kept clean, both inside and out – meaning the owner must remove, on a regular basis, all leaves and trees that may be growing out of the gutters. If the debris in the gutter causes damage to your roof or fascia board, you will be held responsible for all repair costs.

Gutters should be cleaned every other month, especially if you have trees near your homes.

ROOFS

NO ONE is permitted on your roof **EXCEPT LW APPROVED** contractors. If you hire a contractor to clean or repair your roof, and they damage your roof in any way, you are responsible for any and all repair costs.

If you have an active plumbing leak, turn off the water shutoff valve to that sink or toilet or at the main valve outside your home or plex. If you cannot physically turn off the valve, call a neighbor or friend to do it for you. Yelling and threatening our Maintenance Staff will not get your problem addressed any sooner.

Lauderdale West property, except during elections. Candidates' signs may be erected 10 days prior to an election and must be removed within 7 days after an election. Lauderdale West property includes all areas outside your home. This includes any grassy areas, your driveway, any public area, including stop signs, trees, and utility poles. Signs will be removed, and the owner will be subject to fines.

Recently on Channel 10 news, there was an article about giant RATS in Cape Coral, Florida. For those who are new to South Florida, Cape Coral is just an hour or so West, Northwest of Lauderdale West. My fear is that they will learn how fabulous it is to live here and they may find their way to our Community.

WE DON'T WANT THEM!!! Yes, there are bait boxes strategically placed behind our houses in our community. Unfortunately, these boxes are too small for these giant rats!!! When the bait boxes work, it only entices the smaller rats. Beach Environmental does its best to control them, but even at their best, these critters will find their way to our neighborhood, our attics, our houses!!

Areca palms were not planted by the board; residents planted them. Mango trees were not planted by the board; residents planted them. Avocado and Papaya trees were not planted by the board as well. OUR RESIDENTS PLANTED THEM!! All these trees or bushes attract RATS.

Barbara Bucci is contacting the City of Plantation to get approval to remove these fruit trees. The avocado trees are contracting a disease. The trees are dying, the fruit falls to the ground and then the rats come out of their hiding places to eat the fallen fruit. The mango trees are still viable. Rats climb trees to eat the mangoes and, of course, when the mangoes fall to the ground, it's a whole lot easier for the rats to eat. Please pick up any fallen fruit.

At this time, we are asking our residents to remove any and all Areca palms from your property. Whether you planted them yourselves or they came with the house you purchased, they need to be removed. Rats build their homes under these palms. They have their babies under the arecas and then their babies find their way to our homes. **Yes**, the HOA has bait boxes placed on our property and, **yes**, there are screens installed on the stacks of your homes. We do our part. Now we ask you to do yours.

During our home inspections, we will be looking out for these bushes and trees. You will be required to remove arecas quickly. We will need to wait for the City of Plantation to advise us what to do with Mango, Avocado and Papaya trees.

COMMUNICATION WITH THE BOARD

With the increased use of the internet and text messaging, we often expect instant communication and responses. Because your communication to the Board may raise certain legal issues for not responding timely, and sometimes emails end up in spam filters, the Association must insist on certain formalities regarding communication.

Your first step should be to check our Website (www.lauderdalewest.org), as many of our governing documents are available to view or download from there. If you don't find what you are looking for, please write your request to inspect documents and mail or deliver to the Lauderdale West Clubhouse. Do not send requests via email or text message. If it is a request to view a document (e.g., I want to see the financials for December), it need not be sent via Certified Mail. The Board will set up an appointment within ten (10) business days of receipt of the letter. Please note: the Association is not obligated to provide you with copies, but merely to allow you to review the document(s). If you wish something copied, you will be charged twenty-five cents per page. If it is a written inquiry (e.g., Why did we choose Contractor A vs Contractor B for this project?), it needs to be sent to the Board via Certified Mail. The Board will respond within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt, unless one of the statutory extensions applies.

The Lauderdale West Board of Directors cannot take any action on information provided in a letter, voice mail or phone call without the name and LW address of the person making the report.

BLACK RODENT BAIT BOXES



We live in a water community and wherever you have water, you are more susceptible to rats. Throughout our community, there are rodent bait boxes set up by our pest control company to deter/kill rats/rodents. Each box is numbered and has been strategically placed on the property against the house.

- Do not move the boxes. The boxes MUST remain where they have been placed. Each box is marked on a map and must remain in that spot.
- You will be **fined** if the box on your property is not in its designated position.
- Do not TOUCH the boxes. They are filled with poison.
- If a rodent problem occurs, call maintenance at 954-473-2595 and report it.
- Broken or missing bait box replacement cost is \$22. The resident will be charged when one is missing.

SWIMMING POOL HOURS

The main pool is open from 6:00 AM to 9:00 PM and you must leave the pool area by that time. The Annex/Satellite pool is open from dawn to dusk.

SWIMMING POOL RULES

This is just a reminder: Everyone must follow the posted pool rules.

- There is no lifeguard on duty; use of the pool and pool area is at your own risk.
- Only residents and their guests are allowed in the pool area.
- NO animals are allowed in the pool area or the Patio Plaza outside the pool area.
- The pool gate **MUST** remain closed. Do not prop open a pool area gate.
- Showering is required **BEFORE** entering the pool per the Broward Department of Health.
- · Allow residents who are swimming laps the right of way.
- No diving is allowed.
- Children must be supervised by an adult, at all times, in the pool area, especially when they are in the water – THERE IS NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY.
- No child under the age of 16 is allowed in the spa/hot tub.
- No jumping, running or loud noise in the pool area.
- No food, drink or glass is allowed in the pool area. Plastic water bottles are allowed.
- Vacate the pool area during rain, thunder, or lightning sitting under the metal awnings is dangerous.
- Incontinent or non-trained individuals must wear swim diapers.
- No smoking or vaping is allowed in the pool area.

The Lauderdale West Community Association reserves the right to deny the use of the pool or pool area to anyone at any time for just cause.

If you fail to follow the above rules, you will be asked to leave the pool area and your pool privileges may be revoked. If the posted rules and the rules set forth above are violated, the pool will be closed.



GYM RULES

BULK PICKUP – Our next Bulk Pickups will be Tuesday, October 11 and Tuesday, November 15 The following items will not be accepted: batteries, black bags, chemicals, concrete including bricks or pavers, electronics, fencing, fluorescent bulbs, glass not properly wrapped, insecticides, oils and paints, paint cans, x-rays, construction materials, tires. (For disposal of these items, refer to the article on Household Hazardous Waste & Electronic Recycling on page 14). To ensure the safety of Waste Management drivers, mirrors, glass tabletops, windowpanes, plate glass, etc., will only be picked up if they are properly and safely placed in a rigid container. Any broken glass must be placed into a secure container and marked as glass. If items are small enough, they must be put in clear bags. Black bags will not be accepted. Empty cardboard boxes will be accepted.

BULK PICKUP DATES REMAINDER OF YEAR

October 11 November 15 December 13 **GARBAGE PICKUP** – On Tuesday - blue bags and clear recycle bags should be placed **at least 5 feet AWAY** from your mailbox. On Friday – blue bags only, also 5 feet from your mailbox. Bags must not be put out until **5 PM** the night before pickup.



Here are 7 rules to live by:

1. <u>"EMPTY AND CLEAN IF YOU WANT TO BE</u> GREEN"

Do not contaminate other recycling materials with food particles and liquids. This can damage containers and make them unfit to be recycled.

2. "DON'T BAG RECYCLABLES"

Only put loose items into recycling bag. The recycling facility does not have time to until bags, so they will be sent to the landfill.

3. "COATED PAPER CAUSES PROBLEMS"

Waxy paper cups and shiny or sparkly gift bags are examples of coated paper. If they have been treated or coated, they cannot be recycled.

4. "GREASE IS GROSS"

Oil and water don't mix; when the grease from your recyclables transfers to other paper goods, it can spoil the batch of mulch at the paper mill. Parts soiled by grease should be cut out of paper materials. Toss only clean cardboard into recycling.

5. "IF IT TANGLES, THEN IT MANGLES"

Tanglers are items that can get stuck in the equipment at a recycling facility. Don't recycle ropes, strapping, zip-ties, hoses, wires, chains, cords.

6. "DON'T BE A DANGEROUS DUMPER"

Certain items can be dangerous when mixed with recycling: batteries, light bulbs, medications and lighter fluids are examples of unsafe items.

7. "IF IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT"

Do not add to the financial and environmental cost of trucking garbage from recycling facilities to landfills.



PLEASE READ: IMPORTANT MESSAGE ABOUT GARBAGE & TRASH PICKUP

The Post Office has asked that we **NOT** place trash and recycle bags against the mailbox posts. These bags should be **at least five feet away** from the mailbox post on the driveway or lawn. Bulk trash items should be even farther away and not close to any trees or other objects that may interfere with the grabber arm used to pick up the bulk trash.

ATTENTION ALL ANIMAL OWNERS!



Lauderdale West is a **NO PET** Community. We continue to receive complaints about the increase in the number of animals on our property and residents who do not leash or clean up after their animals. Animal noise, such as barking and whining, has also become an issue and is creating a nuisance in the Community.

SERVICE AND EMOTIONAL SUPPORT ANIMALS

Service and emotional support animals are not considered pets, so restrictions that apply to pets do not necessarily apply to them. Emotional support animals are companion animals that provide therapeutic benefits for people with mental disabilities or medical issues. These animals do not have to be trained, unlike service animals that are trained individually to perform specific tasks to help a person who is disabled. You must not discriminate against someone with one of these animals.

IF YOU REQUIRE THE SERVICES OF A SUPPORT OR COMFORT ANIMAL

In Lauderdale West, there are obligations you must abide by to receive written Board approval to have the animal in your home. There are laws in Florida for assistance animals. For each animal, you are required to sign and have notarized a Request for Animal Accommodation stating you understand your responsibility as an animal owner and to provide accompanying documentation such as:

- Register your animal with the Applications and Approvals office.
- A doctor's letter stating your need for such an animal.
- A current dog license.
- Proof that vaccinations/shots are up to date for your animal.
- A homeowner's insurance policy with liability coverage.

All animals must be personally attended to and on a leash when outside the home. They may not be tethered to a tree, porch, or patio. If the animal becomes a nuisance or threat to the Community, it must be removed.


In addition to the foregoing, animal owners **must**:

• Be responsible for animals that reside in their home.

- Follow all City and County Ordinances.
- Clean up after their animal anywhere in Lauderdale West.

Be advised, you must properly dispose of the bag of animal waste in **YOUR** trash container, not in a Community trash can. Do not put it down a drainage grate or throw it in the lakes or canals. This becomes a bacterial hazard to our water system

By following these guidelines, everyone benefits including your animal. Failure to register and meet the above requirements will result in fines. Thank you for your cooperation.

AT ĤÔME AND ON THE ROAD FROM AAA

You wouldn't leave your house unlocked when you go on vacation, but are you protecting your online identity when you travel? Here are some tips from AAA Chief Information Security Officer, Gopal Padinjaruveetil.

- **Use advanced protection:** Enable multifactor authentication such as a one-time logic code sent to your smartphone for accounts like Facebook, Google and Drop Box.
- Turn off Bluetooth when not in use: Bluetoothenabled accessories such as earpieces and external keyboards are convenient, but cybercriminals can pair with your phone's open Bluetooth connection and use it to steal personal information.
- Don't fall for phishing scams: Phishing scams use attractive offers to entice shoppers to click on links within emails. If you receive an email with a deal that looks too good to be true, or if it has a link or attachment that seems suspicious, don't

click on it.

- Avoid public Wi-Fi networks: Conducting personal business, like online banking or shopping on public networks, can allow attackers to intercept your information. To check your credit card statement or shop online while traveling, switch to your mobile device's data internet connection.
- Keep your device software updated: And while you're at it, make sure you have good antivirus and anti-malware software on your devices.
- Don't connect your mobile device: Connecting to any computer or charging station that you do not control, such as a charging station at an airport terminal or a shared computer in a library, with a USB cable can allow software running on that computer to access your sensitive data or install new software on your device.

Take precautions to make sure you always keep your online identity safe.



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Below are some of the latest scams you should be aware of and tips for how to protect yourself from becoming a victim.

The Package Delivery Scam

If you are contacted by phone, text, or in person regarding a delivery you do not expect, never provide any personal or financial information to anyone in connection with the delivery.

Scammers Exploit High Gas Prices

Fraudsters are posing as government officials offering help from a bogus "Fuel Relief Program", while other scammers are running ads on social media that offer a chance to win a \$500 gas card by taking a survey. There is no "Fuel Relief Program," and there is no "Free Gas Card", but victims who fill out the survey will wind up seeing unauthorized charges on their credit card or bank account.

What You Need to Know About Scam Texts

A new report from Robokiller says over 87 billion spam texts were reported in 2021. During the month of June alone, 12 billion spam texts were sent. That's nearly 44 spam texts for every person in the country.

Car Thefts on The Rise

NICB (National Insurance Crime Bureau) said that nearly 1 million vehicles were reported stolen in 2021. Make sure you lock your doors and never leave valuables in your vehicle. The NICB suggests that car owners use an immobilizing or tracking device in vehicle(s). Reporting a theft quickly also improves the chance of recovery.

988: The New Support Hotline

People struggling with issues related to depression, anxiety, financial stress, etc. can now use the official numbers to call for support and a suicide prevention hotline. However, if you receive a call from someone claiming to be from the new support hotline, hang up and call the hotline back yourself!

Postcard Claiming You May Be Eligible for Financial Death Benefits

Scammers are sending cards stating that Social Security provides a financial death benefit and that there is a state benefit also if you qualify. They ask you to fill out personal information and return the card. These cards are sent out by marketing firms and are designed to generate leads for insurance firms, medical supply companies and other companies looking to appeal to seniors who buy these lists.

Palm Beach County Arrest Scam

PBSO (Palm Beach Sheriff's Office) announced that there is an imposter claiming to be an employee of the PBC Sheriff's Office and is calling community members, advising the recipient of the call that a family member is in custody for a domestic related charge and they have a bond of \$ 10,000. The imposter goes on to say if you pay 10% of the bond the family member can be released.

PLEASE BE DILIGENT AND DON'T FALL FOR ANY OF THESE SCAMS.

3 things you can do to help protect your home network from cyber criminals



Use the highest security settings on your router and turn on encryption to make it harder for cyber criminals to get access.



Change default passwords on devices that connect to your network, such as a router, smart TV or video game console. The manufacturers' passwords may be available on the web.



Understand how your security cameras, connected appliances and media streaming devices collect and use your personal information.

The deadline to request that a vote-by-mail ballot be mailed is no later than 5:00 p.m. (local time) on the 10th day before the election. The deadline for 2022 is:

General Election: October 29

A vote-by-mail ballot **must** be returned and received by the Supervisor of Elections in the county of registration no later than 7:00 p.m. (local time) on election day for the respective election in order to be counted.



Owner Alert is a free service designed to help you protect your property from scams or fraud by notifying you if a document changing the ownership of your property is received by the Broward County Property Appraiser (BCPA). Subscribing to this service is quick and easy. Simply visit our website at web.bcpa.net/OwnerAlert to register your property. BCPA has no legal authority to determine whether a deed is fraudulent. If you believe a deed recorded on your property is fraudulent, this early notification allows you to notify law enforcement and stop scammers in their tracks. Let's work together to protect your property.

You need a City of Plantation permit to make any plumbing or electrical changes. You also need to complete the paperwork with our Director in charge of modifications, Kristi Woods. A permit ensures a plumbing or electrical change is done properly – to code. It is for your protection.

A SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM THE PLANTATION POLICE DEPARTMENT



There continues to be incidents in our area of people knocking on doors claiming to be various vendors seeking entry into our home. If allowed access to the home, they may rob or cause harm to the resident.

We are also aware of the theft of items left or stored on patios. Please **DO NOT** leave valuable items outside and make sure your home and vehicle are always locked. In these difficult times it is critical that we continually be aware of our person, surroundings, and valuables.

PLEASE DO NOT OPEN YOUR DOOR TO STRANGERS. AND CERTAINLY, DO NOT ALLOW THEM INTO YOUR HOME. DO NOT LEAVE VALUABLES UNSECURED.

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DISASTER PREPAREDNESS: BUILD AN EMERGENCY SUPPLY KIT

This guide walks you through the basic items so you can build a kit yourself--mostly with items you'll find around your home.

Water

- One gallon, per person, per day for three days (or a week, to be safe)
- Keep in air-tight, plastic containers that are easy to access

Food

- Three-day supply of non-perishable foods
- · Don't forget food for your pets

First Aid

In an emergency, you or a family member may be injured. An adequate First Aid kit can keep a minor injury from turning major. You may want to take a basic first aid class though the Red Cross or online through the National Safety Council.

Basic First Aid items in Your Kit:

- Sterile gloves
- Sterile dressings
- Soap and antibiotic towelettes
- Antibiotic ointment
- Adhesive bandages in a variety of sizes
- Eye wash solution
- Thermometer
- Prescription medications you take every day
- Prescribed medical supplies such as glucose and blood pressure monitoring equipment and supplies
- First Aid book
- Non-prescription drugs (aspirin or non-aspirin pain reliever, anti-diarrhea medication, antacid, laxative)

Sanitation

Adequate sanitation is a significant environmental concern after a disaster. When sewer pipes are damaged or the sanitation system goes off-line, entire communities, including people and habitats are at risk. Be prepared to take care of your waste for the same period of time as you've prepared food and water. A basic sanitation kit should include:

Toilet paper

- Soap
- Feminine supplies
- Plastic garbage bags & ties
- · Plastic bucket with tight lid
- Chlorine bleach
- Supplies for pet waste

Tools & Supplies

What you need can vary greatly based on where you live, the type of disaster you expect and your family unit. Talk with your family about items they wouldn't want to be without in an emergency. Here are some basic items that most people will need in a disaster:

- Wrench to turn off gas and water lines
- Cups, plates, and utensils (raid your camping gear to save money -- just don't forget to replace them after each trip)
- Light source (solar is best so you don't have to worry about batteries)
- Radio (get one that is USB powered or buy a battery-operated radio and extra batteries)
- Manual can opener or a utility knife
- Small fire extinguisher
- Pliers
- Duct tape
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Plastic storage container to keep everything in one place

Documents

In preparation, scan valuable documents and store them securely online so they can't be ruined by a disaster. It may be helpful to have copies of key items (like insurance cards, social security number, passwords, and insurance policies) in your kit as well. Take short videos to catalogue valuables in your home, such as vehicles, computers, furniture, and artwork, for insurance purposes. Key documents include:

- Will, insurance policies, contracts, deeds
- Passports, social security cards, immunization records
- · Bank account numbers
- Credit card account numbers and companies
- Family records (birth, marriage, death certificates)



FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

Widow, Widowers, Blind Persons, or Persons Totally and Permanently Disabled Exemption (CS/HB/7071)

Thousands of Broward County property owners qualify for these exemptions. Under previous law, these exemptions deducted only \$500 from the property's assessed value which equates to an annual savings of only \$10 in property taxes. Representative Michael Gottlieb and Senator Ana Maria Rodriguez secured language in CS/HB/7071 which increased this exemption amount to \$5,000 for an increased tax savings of approximately \$100 beginning in 2023. This change will not affect 2022 property taxes.

Important Information

With market values rising, property owners receiving Homestead Exemption are protected by the Save Our Homes cap. The cap limits increases to the assessed value of your property to no more than 3% each year beginning the year after you receive Homestead Exemption. Our office mailed the 2022 TRIM (proposed tax) Notices in August. This notice shows your 2022 just value, approved exemptions, and proposed taxes as set by the taxing authorities. With the significant increase in the real estate market, it is important property owners review this notice to ensure they are receiving all the tax-saving exemptions for which they may be eligible.

Both Homestead Exemption and the Low-Income Senior Exemption automatically renew each year provided the property owner resides at the same home and meets the income requirement for the Senior Exemption.
