#### LETTER FROM MAYOR DIANE VELTRI BENDEKOVIC To: Residents of Plantation Date: Friday, September 22, 2017

With the uninvited guest, Irma, to Plantation, the landscape of Plantation dramatically changed from where the 'grass is greener' to mounds of brown debris. As Mayor of Plantation, I felt it was imperative to provide the residents with an explanation for the unprecedented problem that has occurred with disaster removal.

The city of Plantation has historically contracted with several FEMA-approved, debris management contractors for natural disaster debris removal. These contracts are negotiated far in advance of storm season. These prepositioned contracts provide Plantation with the ability to contact the individual contractor to begin the removal after the storm passes. Plantation currently has agreements with three entities. We contacted them to activate immediately after the storm passed process and requested 60 trucks to haul storm debris to the assigned landfill. Plantation's request wasn't honored, nor have the contractors honored other cities throughout Broward County. This posed a severe problem for most Broward cities.

The contractors have indicated that since Irma caused widespread damage statewide, they are unable to meet the demands of the contracted cities. To add insult to injury, the contractors are 'following the money' to other counties who negotiated and offered a higher price after the storm. Almost immediately after the storm passed, it was evident to Broward city officials that there would be a 'no show' on the part of the contractors to our individual cities. With that said, all impacted cities have made concentrated united effort during the past week to make local, state and federal officials aware of the severity of the problem. The communication with local, state and federal officials has been ongoing with pre and post storm conferencing. This conferencing will continue until many of the issues are resolved.

Broward cities have requested Governor Scott, Florida's Recovery Team, and the Attorney General's office to allow cities to re-negotiate their contracts to compete with other counties who are offering a higher price per cubic yard. Plus it is imperative having the re-negotiated price honored by FEMA for reimbursement to the cities, otherwise the cities will be 'on the hook' for an astronomical amount of millions of dollars. Plantation, as with other cities, can't afford the expense without knowing FEMA will provide reimbursement. Even if the cities would be allowed to negotiate a higher price, this creates bidding wars between cities, which none of them want and ultimately the increase would be passed on to the taxpayer.

The bottom line is the debris removal process should have started a week ago. It hasn't, and now lack of removal is creating other issues for cities and their residents.

Presently, all the cities are working together to resolve the FEMA reimbursement pricing issue; a 'stand-off' is unacceptable. Governor Scott and Attorney General need to 'step up to the plate' to request FEMA to determine a fair and equitable price per cubic yard, which would be reimbursable throughout the entire state. This would avoid pitting one city against another, would avoid a significant impact to the city's coffers and taxpayers, and would ultimately clear the 'mass of brown debris' from our cities. Plantation will continue to work together with other cities throughout Broward County to resolve the FEMA funding issue. Hopefully, a resolution will be forth-coming from FEMA and the Governor's office in this matter.

Plantation adhered to all procurement procedures and did our due diligence in advance to provide immediate debris removal service to our residents. Unfortunately, the contractors failed us. However, Team Plantation hasn't failed you. I can assure Plantation residents from pre- to post- storm, all our departments have worked to resolve storm issues as soon as possible.

There is some positive news for Plantation residents; bulk pickup starts October 2 according to the neighborhood' regularly scheduled pick up. Remember, it is only BULK not vegetation/tree debris. WASTE MANAGE-MENT WON'T PICK UP BULK ITEMS MIXED WITH STORM DEBRIS. Please separate tree debris/vegetation from bulk items.

Thank you for your understanding and patience throughout the storm clean up.

#### FYI SINGLE FAMILY HOME OWNERS

Have you had your outside electrical box checked by a licensed electrician lately? If your answer is no, you should. The original boxes used aluminum wiring when our houses were built. Many of these become frayed over the years, causing a possible fire hazard. Wiring, now, should be copper.

To be on the safe side, contact a licensed electrical contractor to check and update your outside electrical box.

#### **BLOOD PRESSURE**

Need your blood pressure checked? Come to the Main Clubhouse every Thursday from 9:30 - 10:30 a.m. If we don't use them, the paramedics will not provide this service.

#### ALERT! ARE YOU COVERED?

There may be some confusion about what insurance coverage home owners in Lauderdale West need. The 'Plex" buildings, from the interior wall paint outward, are insured by the Lauderdale West Association. In case of total or partial destruction, the Association is responsible for repairing or replacing the building. Owners of Plexes should insure their personal belongings only, such as appliances, furniture, fixtures, etc.

The single family homes **ARE NOT INSURED** by the Association. Owners of SFHs should insure the structure as well as the contents, and must have hurricane insurance; flood insurance is an option to purchase.

The Association **WILL NOT** repair or replace a single-family home in case of flood or hurricane damage.

#### ATTENTION LW RESIDENTS SUSPECTED WATER LEAK

Have you received an unusually high water bill? If the answer is yes, you can double check your system to see if you have a leak.

Turn all water off

• Go outside - check your water meter - if running (with water turned off) you have a leak - if it is not running, you do not have a leak

If you are unsure, call the Maintenance department, 954 473-2595, and they will come and check.

#### **REGARDING ROOFS**

No one is permitted to hire anyone to do any work on the roof of a house. No one is permitted to go up onto a roof of a house. You will be fined.

#### LAWNS, LANDSCAPING, FENCES, HEDGES, CLOTHES POLES, HUR-RICANE SHUTTERS, PARKING Per our Documents:

"All portions of a LOT not occupied by a building or other permanent structure shall be grassed and kept as a lawn. No trees, shrubbery, or other forms of landscaping shall be installed or maintained unless the same shall have been first approved in writing by the BOARD, which approval may be arbitrarily withheld. No fences or hedges shall be permitted anywhere within the SUBDIVISION except as approved by the BOARD, which approval may be arbitrarily withheld."

#### AUGUST/SEPTEMBER ISSUE OMISSION

In our last issue, there were pictures showing incorrect parking of cars and arrows pointing to where the car should be parked. The LWNews failed to credit the pictures. These were from the December 2004 issue of the Lauderdale West News.

In our effort to insure that we maintain our properties, grass, sprinklers, mailboxes, etc., we ask everyone to try and park correctly. Being careful only improves our property values. Thank you.

#### PARKING REMINDER

To all LW residents whether you live in a plex or a single family home: Do not back into any parking place as it is stated in the "Guide to LW Living". Please advise your visitors, caretakers, or contractors. Thank you for your cooperation.

#### MAINTENANCE PROCEDURE

If you have a situation which needs the Maintenance Department, you MUST contact Edna in the Maintenance Office **directly** at 954-473-2595 or by email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org. DO NOT ADDRESS OUR MAINTENANCE STAFF CONCERNING YOUR ISSUE.

When you call the Maintenance Office, you will receive a **work order number** which you will need to KEEP until your job is completed.

You will be given a time frame when Maintenance will come to your home. IF THE WORK TO BE DONE IS IN-SIDE YOUR HOME, please make sure you are home or your **work order** will be closed and you will need to call and make a new appointment. If the work to be done is outside your home, you do not need to be at home when the work is done.

Please do not address our Maintenance staff concerning your issue – this will only delay your job getting done. Remember – contact Edna in the Maintenance office at 954-473-2595, Monday – Friday 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. or email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org and get a WORK ORDER NUMBER.

#### **MAINTENANCE ISSUES**

There have been some issues over the last few months regarding our Maintenance department and what they will charge for certain services. Please read:

**Regarding emergency calls:** When you call Maintenance after hours, make sure you truly have an emergency and not a situation that can wait until the next business day. If one of our Maintenance staff goes to your home and it is NOT a true emergency, then the homeowner will be billed for the overtime expense. An example of this would be one toilet is clogged, but you still have another working toilet.

**Regarding Excessive Maintenance calls dealing with the same problem:** It is during the first visit that the resident is instructed what is needed to correct the problem. It is the second, third and sometimes the fourth call that shows the resident does not always comply but continues to call Maintenance.

The Board has discussed this and has decided to start fining residents who do not comply and fix the problem. After the second visit for the same problem, the resident will receive a letter stating the problem and the need to fix it. If there is a third call, the resident will then be fined \$50 for non-compliance as well as the cost of the maintenance call for the problem. An example of this would be if the resident keeps calling maintenance for a clogged toilet – it is found that the resident is flushing cleansing wipes into the toilet (even those stating they are flushable). After the second visit, the resident will receive a letter stating they should not flush anything except toilet tissue down the toilet. If there is a third call for a clogged toilet due to cleansing wipes, the resident will be fined \$50 plus \$300 for the repeat plumbing call.

#### FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK....

I hope we all survived the dog days of Summer here in Lauderdale West with as little inconvenience as possible. This Summer seemed to me to be the hottest and wettest in a very long time. I am looking forward to Fall – such as it is here in Florida.

We have a new ADA bathroom at the Satellite pool and a much-needed storage area in the Satellite Clubhouse. Please feel free to take a look at the new bathroom. The Board originally discussed adding such a bathroom a couple of years ago but with budget constraints and other issues of importance, we had to put that on the back burner. Don't forget there are ADA bathrooms at the main pool for those that require them, thereby accommodating all our residents.

The other bathrooms at the Satellite Clubhouse will be refurbished in the near future. Our maintenance worker, Andre, has been cleaning and re-sealing the floors and they look like new! He did a fantastic job! We will be cleaning the walls, changing all the ceiling tiles, and replacing all fixtures (sinks, toilets, etc.) and stall dividers. You won't recognize the place when we're done!

We opened our new nine-hole putting green at the site of the former bocce ball court. Each hole has a flag which, when lifted, removes your ball so we don't have to bend down thereby saving our tired backs. Every morning golf balls are put out for your use but you must bring your own putter. Sam Normandia and the men of our maintenance department should be commended for their hard work in creating this for us.

The final plans for repairing the deck located outside the Main Clubhouse on the lake are in hand and we are obtaining bids from contractors for its repair. Once those are obtained and reviewed, we can begin its repair.

We have completed the 40-year inspections on the fourplex units – ahead of schedule! The Board is initiating a preventative maintenance program for the duplexes which will mirror the 40-year inspections on the fourplexes. This means that our electrician, Mark, will be entering every duplex to perform an electrical inspection. Mark or Edna, our administrative assistant at the maintenance office, will be calling you to schedule an appointment for this inspection. This is very important so please make yourself and your home available.

You should have received or will receive shortly the **document amendment** package. Please review this carefully. The Board recommends that you vote "yes" on all amendments but, of course, you are free to vote any way you wish. We would prefer that you mail your ballot to us or place it in the ballot box which will be in the lobby of the main clubhouse as opposed to voting in person at the final meeting. In doing so we will be able to keep a running total of the ballots received in reaching the necessary 66 2/3% required.

Regardless of whether or not the pet amendment is passed, we will be requiring all pet owners to register their pets and provide us with evidence of rabies vaccinations. We may also require evidence of flea, tic and heart worm treatments so now is the time to get your pet vaccinated and obtain the necessary paperwork.

If you have had a new roof installed on your single family home, you may wish to obtain a copy of the final building permit and invoice from Barbara Bucci and provide those to your insurance agent. You may be entitled to a credit on your homeowner's insurance premium. Your agent may require that you obtain a wind mitigation report. That report should cost in the \$100 to \$150 range but may well save you a few hundred dollars on your premium each year.

Speaking of insurance, while Lauderdale West is no longer in the flood plain and flood insurance may not be required by your bank or mortgage company, with the horrendous floods caused by Hurricanes Harvey and Irma, it may be worth the extra cost to carry flood insurance on your home. I'm not an insurance expert and the damage caused might be covered under the hurricane portion of an insurance policy, however, it's better to be safe than sorry.

My heart goes out to everyone affected in Texas and Puerto Rico and the surrounding areas. I'm sure we have all seen on television the devastation caused by the flooding. I can't imagine what the cost would be to replace all the furniture, electronics and furnishing, not to mention our homes, if that were to happen here!

We have been trying to clean up the look of Lauderdale West. Letters are being sent to those residents and owners with overgrown plants, bushes and shrubs; trees planted too close to homes and patios; unauthorized plantings and the like. If you do not comply with these letters and Lauderdale West must undertake to remove the offending violation, you will be charged a minimum \$200 fee for the cost of removal. If we must hire others to perform this service, that cost will be billed to you. Please, let's take care of our plantings and improve the overall character of Lauderdale West.

#### **MODIFICATION NEWS**

If you are doing any modifications to your home or plex, you need to fill out the Lauderdale West paperwork and have it approved by the Board. If you are not available to come in during regular hours, 9 am – noon, you can call Sam Normandia at 954- 473-8219, ext. 125, during the morning hours and set up an appointment.

If your modification causes a problem, such as a leak, you are responsible for the repairs.

#### PEST CONTROL POLICY CHANGE

Dead Bug Edwards has been very generous in their spraying inside units for small ants. Unfortunately, some of our residents expect monthly sprayings.

Effective immediately, if you have excessive repeat calls for spraying inside for the small ants, due to crumbs or food, etc., you will be charged for the spraying, \$115 per spray. You will be allowed 2 inside sprays per year; anything more will be deemed excessive. Please be sure you clean up and not leave food out or have crumbs. Thank you for your cooperation.

#### **ROOM RENTAL UPDATE**

LW will only rent out room 113 for family functions up to 70 people. We will no longer be able to rent out the JBA.

#### PEST PROBLEMS?

If you think you have a pest problem, call Edna at the Maintenance Office, 954 473-2595 or email: maintenancedept@ lauderdalewest.org. You will be given a work order number. Maintenance will then call the pest control company for you.

#### **EMERGENCY EXIT DOORS**

In the Main Clubhouse there are double glass doors that are alarmed for security purposes. There is green signage on each door stating that it is an **Emergency Exit - Do Not Use.** 

If you chose to ignore this signage, you will receive a letter stating not to use the doors and if you do it again, you will be fined \$50. Please - obey the signs.

#### DO NOT FEED THE BIRDS/ DUCKS/IGUANAS

You should not feed any wild life here in LW. What you think is a kind gesture will actually harm the animal. Our food is not compatible with their digestive systems and will cause life threatening deformities, especially bread and crackers.

Also, it is against the law to touch any eggs in a nest. If there is a problem, please contact our Maintenance department.

#### **BAIT BOXES**

Throughout our community there are rodent bait boxes set up by our pest control company, Dead Bug Edwards, to deter/kill rats. We live in a watered community and whenever you have water, you are more susceptible to rats.

Dead Bug Edwards will be inventorying, cleaning, filling each box. They have been put around the perimeter properties as well as on water properties. You, our residents, have been asked not to touch the boxes. If boxes are missing, LW will need to replace them, an expense we hope we do not need.

Dead Bug Edwards is evaluating the situation regularly. If a rodent problem shows up, boxes can be re-placed to be more effective. We ask that you do not need to call requesting a box. Dead Bug Edwards knows where each and every box is located as each box's placement is marked on a large LW map.

These boxes are baited with poison which the rats take back to their nests, hopefully infecting the nest, thus killing more rats. As these boxes are throughout the community, around houses and plexes, AGAIN, we ask our residents **NOT** to touch or move these boxes. They are being checked regularly and replenished as needed.

Should you develop a rodent problem, please call Maintenance at 954 473-2595 and report it.

Once again, DO NOT TOUCH these boxes or move them. Thank you.

#### **NEW OFFICE PROTOCOL**

For our Board to be more efficient in the handling of their responsibilities (duties), a new policy has been instituted:

1. Please make your first stop the Administrative Office.

2. Let them know the **area of your concern** (lawns, pest control, modification, etc.).

3. The Administrative Office will then let the Board member overseeing that area know you are waiting in the lobby.

Residents are discouraged from just walking into the President's office or any other Board member's office with their concerns. Residents are discouraged from lingering around a Board member's door waiting to be seen. Please wait in the lobby where you will be called from when it is your turn. Everyone's time is important and this will **help** in having our residents seen in a timely fashion.

We ask for your cooperation to enable the Board to budget their time to conduct the business of Lauderdale West. Thank you.

#### **BUYER BEWARE**

When you need to hire someone to do work in your home, be sure to check the insurance and license of the person. The person/company needs to have a recent license by the City of Plantation if they live in the City. Be sure to see a copy of their insurance to confirm they have coverage.

Do not wait until there is a problem and wish you had.

#### **IRMA BE DAMNED!**

Barbara Bucci and I were at the maintenance office each day to assist Edna in dealing with residents' issues and concerns. Barbara also coordinated the efforts of our contractors – SCI, GLIG and EDJ.

Rosemarie Demmons, Barbara and I met on Wednesday with our private insurance adjuster to discuss insurance claims and inspect the clubhouse for damage caused by Irma.

Sam, Cindy and Henry were here right after the hurricane went by to get our clubhouse in order.

Jeff Fleisch called me to ask what he could do for the Community. He has been gathering and piling downed limbs and brush and, knowing Jeff, probably cutting up trees as well! Gina Saggio went door to door to many of our residents without power to check in on them.

While I know the hurricane force winds blew off many shingles on plex roofs and trees and tree limbs fell on roofs causing damage to fascia boards, gutters and tiles to break, not one roof - plex or single family home - was completely destroyed. I know several single family home flat decks were torn off and many residents have roof leaks. SCI, our roofers, and especially Scott Biederman, owner of SCI and Elisio, its foreman, were here on Monday morning assessing damage and repairing or tarping where needed.

Our regular GLIG crew was here beginning Tuesday morning bringing fallen tree branches and brush to the edge of the roadways for future pickup.

The men from EDJ, who are upgrading our irrigation system, were cutting and removing large trees from our property.

I saw many neighbors and friends assisting each other whether it be helping to remove small tree limbs and brush from yards, opening shutters, and some offering comfort and encouragement. My neighbors, Jerry and Bruce, were cutting up a tree that fell on Bruce's front lawn and onto the street. I am sure there are numerous other neighbor helping neighbor stories because I know we have many absolutely wonderful, caring and giving people in our Community.

As of this writing (Thursday, September 14th), we have many homes without power. Some areas of the main clubhouse are without power and the pump house at the main pool is also without power. Again, neighbors and friends were bringing ice and hot coffee to those in need; were allowing friends to store food in their freezers and refrigerators; were bringing gas to those with generators when gas stations were closed or to those unable to venture out.

I spoke with Mayor Bendekovic to muster any assistance I could from her regarding our power outages and debris removal. She told me that FP&L was not communicating with local City officials She tried to contact them without success. She has the same information we all have which is that power would be restored to South Florida by Sunday the 17th. Her home was still without power when I spoke with her. As far as communicating with FEMA is concerned, as of this writing, she was waiting to hear from them.

I am grateful to the above-mentioned individuals and for the good people here at Lauderdale West! A heartfelt thanks goes out to each and every one! We are incredibly lucky that Irma chose a more westerly path for her destruction otherwise the damage could have been far worse.

I could not be more proud of our Lauderdale West employees, contractors and residents! We came together in a time of need to help our neighbors and friends. To me, this is what a community is all about.

Irma be damned!!

#### SWIMMING POOL RULES

## LAUDERDALE WEST VIOLATION PROCEDURES AND FINES

LWNews feels the need to inform our residents of fines that are on the books to prevent problems. We do not see it as being negative but informative.

#### The following are the violation fines *per occurrence:*

Exiting Main Clubhouse thru Emergency Exits	\$50
Entering/leaving parking lots in wrong direction	\$50
Unregistered cars/trucks/vehicles	\$100
Failure to maintain, via painting or power washing, of awnings,	
patio, or driveways	\$50
Failure to maintain outside of residence for aesthetics/	
health compliance	\$50
Unapproved plantings of shrubs, bushes or trees on	
common grounds	\$100
Planting of trees on LW property plus cost of removal	
by our Maintenance Department	\$50
Feeding ducks	\$50
Unleashed dogs	\$50
Vandalism to LW property	\$100

#### The following are the violation fines per day:

Overnight parking of unauthorized vehicles/trailers, etc.	\$100
Overnight parking on swales, lawns, clubhouse parking lots, etc.	\$100
Unauthorized signage (political, for sale, etc.)	\$50
Unauthorized colors on fascia, shutters, etc.	\$50
Failure to illuminate pole light per night	\$20

## The second notification for the same violation within 6 months automatically imposes a fine of \$100.

\*Allow to add to this list as need may arise.



## LAUDERDALE WEST VIOLATION PROCEDURES AND FINES

LWNews feels the need to inform our residents of fines that are on the books to prevent problems. We do not see it as being negative but informative.

## When a resident violates a rule, the following is the procedure for the Fining Process:

#### **Procedure:**

1. A resident in violation will receive an initial letter regarding a maintenance/violation issue.

2. A recheck of the property will be performed and if necessary, a second letter is sent regarding incomplete issues.

3. If the incomplete issues are not corrected within 15 days from the date of the second letter, Board approval will be obtained and a Certified letter will be sent stating the fine which is to be paid within 30 days from the date of the Certified letter.

This letter will also state that Lauderdale West will proceed to do the work and charge the resident for the work **in addition to the fine.** 

When a resident receives the Certified letter stating the levied fine(s), the resident has the right to a hearing before the LW Fining Committee, within 15 days of receiving the Certified letter.

If the resident would like to request a hearing, the resident needs to go to the Main Clubhouse, fill out the Right to Hearing Form and turn it in to the Board Director overseeing the Fining Committee.

The Fining Committee, which meets two(2) times a month, will make the ultimate decision to confirm or reverse the fine. The Fining Committee is comprised of owners from each of the four(4) phases in Lauderdale West and one additional owner, the Chairperson.

Second or subsequent offense of same violation within six(6) months– automatically doubles the fine.

#### STAYING STRESS FREE WHEN YOU HAVE TO FLY

Whether you're a frequent flyer or only fly occasionally, most likely you've noticed that the experience of flying no longer conjures up excitement or relaxed calm. Instead, any thoughts of relaxation may instill feel-

ings of frustration and dread or actually increase your anxiety.

Why? Unless you are one of the select few who can afford to fly private, then your thoughts may turn to the very long lines to check in or check your bag; then to the even longer lines to clear security. Or you may start to remember when your ticket got you two free checked bags instead of having to pay additional for each piece of your luggage. Plus, you may fondly recall receiving a free meal with a cheerful smile from your stewardess or steward on longer flights.

But those days are long gone for most flyers since today you're lucky if your airline seat reclines or if you don't have to pay for your carry-on luggage. Ouch!

Since today even elite frequent fliers and hardened road warriors can grumble about the decline of services that made flying enjoyable, here are some practical things you can do to lower your stress when you need to fly:

**Pack as light as possible:** Consider taking only necessary items on your trip. Can you make do with just an overnight bag? If so you'll lower your stress by paying less and be thankful that you're not dragging large suitcases through the terminal over long distances.

**Arrive Early:** One sure way to lower your travel related stress is getting to the airport early. Even though most of us have at least one story of just barely making a flight, as a rule you're sure to increase your stress by running late to catch a flight; especially when there are many things that can go wrong that are outside of your control. For example, you may miss your flight if you cut things close and your taxi gets a flat tire or the battery of your rental car goes dead.

**Refundable Ticket:** Sometimes the most unbelievable thing can happen and you won't be able to take your trip as planned. Knowing you must cancel your trip when you've

purchased non-refundable tickets is a surefire way to elevate your blood pressure or increase your anxiety. At a minimum, you should consider fully refundable tickets or at least have the option to change travel dates for a reasonable fee.

**Pack Power Cords:** One sure way to keep your travel stress at bay is to be 100% sure you can keep your phone and laptop charged during your trip. Test each cord before the start of your trip. Then double check that you have packed them for each device. Few things can ruin a trip faster than a dead smart phone or laptop.

It all began when Giovanni Verrazano and Henry Hudson, two historic explorers trying to find a shorter trade route to the Orient from Europe, ventured into New York Bay over 400 years ago and discovered a brand new world. By 1624, the Dutch settled here calling it New Amsterdam. Dutchman Peter Minuit paid \$24.00 in trinkets to the Indians for the island of Manhattan (what a deal). Forty years later the British took over and named the new land after the Duke of York.

The Erie Canal was built across New York State in 1820, making New York the top trading center in the world. Since then, boat loads of immigrants from Europe and around the world landed on Ellis Island, sailing past the Statue of Liberty to find peace, freedom, prosperity and happiness. Manhattan is only twenty three square miles. That's why there are so many tall structures. I have some very fond memories living at 238 Clinton Street in a lower east side six story tenement. Our apartment door was always open and my mom was friends with all of our neighbors. We had a party line phone which we shared, making sure our neighbors weren't on the line before we called. I loved playing baseball at Cherry Street Park overlooking the East River.

My dad was a tailor in mid Manhattan and my mom worked as a cook at the Educational Alliance on East Broadway. At the Edgies, I met George Jessel, Red Buttons, Eddie Cantor and other notable showmen who usually frequented there. I also remember walking along Delancy Street as a child, seeing all the wonderful sights.

I moved to Flushing Queens (Pomonok) when I was seven (that's another story), it was then that I realized the beauty of New York is that it's truly a city of neighborhoods with diverse people and cultures, who all were starting new lives together and that's the true pride and passion and spirit of America.

The Northern Mockingbird By Ingrid Mofetta

The mockingbird is a common bird in South Florida. It is a superb songster with many beautiful melodies of its own and the ability to imitate the songs of many other birds. Many experts consider the mockingbird to be the finest songbird in the world. It regularly sings at night. They can sing up to 200 songs including the songs of other birds and insects. Mockingbirds dine on both meat and vegetation. They consume bugs, bees, worms, lizards, butterflies, fruits and seeds. This makes the bird useful to humans by keeping bugs to a minimum.

In 1927 the legislature of the State of Florida adopted the Northern Mockingbird as the Florida State Bird. The mockingbird has also been featured in literature and song.

In 1960, Harper Lee published her beloved book, To Kill a Mockingbird. In an excerpt from her book she writes: "Mockingbirds don't do one thing but make music for us to enjoy. They don't eat up people's gardens, don't nest in corncribs, they don't do one thing but sing their hearts out for us. That's why it's a sin to kill a mockingbird."

The fame of the mockingbird continued in 1962 with the lullaby lyrics from Hush, Little Baby. "Hush little baby, don't say a word, Papa's gonna buy you a mockingbird. And if that mockingbird won't sing, Papa's gonna buy you a diamond ring."





#### LETTER TO THE EDITORS: BEHIND THE SCENE OF THE SOCK HOP

The sock hop concept was born back in February 2017 to Jeff Fleisch after he saw his dad, Joseph Fleisch, wearing a World War II veteran cap with much pride. It was then that the fundraiser idea for our beloved veterans took shape.

Jeff had the ability and experience to plan out all the details step by step, which he did and did it well. He worked relentlessly putting in hundreds of hours and lots of energy. His devotion to this charity was 100% resulting in 15 sponsorships and 40 retailers.

What I noticed was that the purpose of the concert was totally missed. It was a fundraiser, a charity event for our veterans. The cost of the ticket was purposely set at \$3 instead of \$5 to encourage participation. The hope was that people would buy a ticket even if they weren't able to attend – again it was a fundraiser for our veterans.

This event was something new and different for Lauderdale West residents. It was not the same activity that has been done year after year for decades, not that there is anything wrong with that either.

There was some concerns because there were no tables which might have kept some people away. Well, guess what, you missed a great show. It was a triumphant success that residents will remember for quite some time.

The Wall of Honor had memorabilia from the different wars,

which were donated by our residents. It was so moving to see letters, uniforms, pictures and more. I wish we could have had more and covered the entire wall.

We are on the edge of change as to how we can do things in our community. We need to be more open minded and available for residents to give input and share ideas instead of stopping them. We could have given the Bill Kling VA Clinic a bigger check if more people had participated.

FYI, there were 14 musicians that arrived Thursday, who played for us for free and at their own expense; they stayed in 5 hotel rooms for 3 days, paid for their meals and gas. It cost them approximately \$500 per person for each of the ones traveling from out of town to the event. The cost of feeding the 14 for the day before set up, rehearsal plus day of was \$250. This activity was created with just 10 volunteers.

Kudos to Cindy and Sam for never letting go of the vision Jeff had. 600 tickets were printed, 507 sold and over 400 attended.

I shared all of this so that you all know what was behind the scene of the fabulous Sock Hop. We all need to work together as a community so that we can have a more joyous and effective Lauderdale West.




