BULK PICKUP GUIDELINES

(as per the City of Plantation Waste Disposal Department)
Bulk Pick Up will NOT pick up the following:
Electronics, Glass, Mirrors, Paint cans, X-rays
Any construction materials - including dry wall.

You should not box anything – place in the clear City of Plantation bags.

You can put empty cardboard boxes out.

GARBAGE PICK UP

Tuesday - blue bags and clear recycle bags

Friday - BLUE bags ONLY

Once a month - bulk pick up

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

Many of us have large "brown spots" on our lawn from the hurricane debris laying there or mulch areas where trees were removed.

Do not do anything with those areas. Do not place anything on those areas. Those are common areas and Lauderdale West will take care of them. Eventually grass will grow there and be part of the lawn.

MODIFICATION NEWS

BLOOD PRESSURE

DON'T BLOCK THE WALK

There is a law in NYC for not blocking an intersection with your car called 'Don't Block the Box'. Here in LW, we ask that you don't Block the Walk (sidewalk) with your car.

We have walkers (some elderly), people in wheelchairs or using walkers who, when confronted with a car on the sidewalk, will need to go into the street to get around the car. This makes for not only an unsafe way to get around the blockage but also a very inconsiderate and often difficult way due to their walker or wheelchair.

Please, when parking your car, do not have it blocking the sidewalk. Think how you would feel if you were having difficulty walking and you had to move around a blocked walkway.

MOVING SALE PROTOCOL

If you have sold your house in Lauderdale West and will be moving out, you may hold a **one day** sale provided you get permission from the president. Should you not get permission, you will be asked to shut the sale down immediately. Please remember, you may not place any signs on Lauderdale West property. Thank you for your cooperation and best of luck in your new home.

LAWNS, LANDSCAPING, FENCES, HEDGES

Per our DOCs:

"All portions of a LOT not occupied by a building or other permanent structure shall be grassed and kept as a lawn. No trees, shrubbery, or other forms of landscaping shall be installed or maintained unless the same shall have been first approved in writing by the BOARD, which approval may be arbitrarily withheld. No fences or hedges shall be permitted anywhere within the SUBDIVISION except as approved by the BOARD, which approval may be arbitrarily withheld."

PLEASE DO NOT PLANT OR PLACE ANYTHING IN YOUR FRONT, BACK OR SIDE YARD. THAT IS COM-MON AREA.

MAINTENANCE PROCEDURE

If you have a situation which needs the Maintenance Department, you MUST contact Edna in the Maintenance Office directly at 954-473-2595 or by email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org. DO NOT ADDRESS OUR MAINTENANCE STAFF CONCERNING YOUR ISSUE.

When you call the Maintenance Office, you will receive a **work order number** which you will need to KEEP until your job is completed.

You will be given a time frame when Maintenance will come to your home. IF THE WORK TO BE DONE IS IN-SIDE YOUR HOME, please make sure you are home or your **work order** will be closed and you will need to call and make a new appointment. If the work to be done is outside your home, you do not need to be at home when the work is done.

Please do not address our Maintenance staff concerning your issue – this will only delay your job getting done. Remember – contact Edna in the Maintenance office at 954-473-2595, Monday – Friday 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. or email: maintenancedept@lauderdalewest.org and get a WORK ORDER NUM

MAINTENANCE ISSUES

There have been some issues over the last few months regarding our Maintenance department and what they will charge for certain services. Please read:

Regarding emergency calls: When you call Maintenance after hours, make sure you truly have an emergency and not a situation that can wait until the next business day. If one of our Maintenance staff goes to your home and it is NOT a true emergency, then the homeowner will be billed for the overtime expense. An example of this would be one toilet is clogged, but you still have another working toilet.

Regarding Excessive Maintenance calls dealing with the same problem: It is during the first visit that the resident is instructed what is needed to correct the problem. It is the second, third and sometimes the fourth call that shows the resident does not always comply but continues to call Maintenance.

The Board has discussed this and has decided to start charging residents who do not comply and fix the problem. After the second visit for the same problem, the resident will receive a letter stating the problem and the need to fix it. If there is a third call, the resident will then be charged \$50 for non-compliance as well as the cost of the maintenance call for the problem. An example of this would be if the resident keeps calling maintenance for a clogged toilet – it is found that the resident is flushing cleansing wipes into the toilet (even those stating they are flushable). After the second visit, the resident will receive a letter stating they should not flush anything except toilet tissue down the toilet. If there is a third call for a clogged toilet due to cleansing wipes, the resident will be charged \$50 plus \$300 for the repeat plumbing call.

MAINTENANCE EMERGENCY NUMBER

Call 954-473-2595. If this is a **true** emergency, you **must** dial (press) 1. Do not just leave a message.

EMERGENCY EXIT DOORS

In the Main Clubhouse there are double glass doors that are alarmed for security purposes. There is red signage on each door stating that it is an **Emergency Exit - Do Not Use.**

If you choose to ignore this signage, you will receive a letter stating not to use the doors and if you do it again, you will be fined \$50. Please - obey the signs.

REGARDING ROOFS

No one is permitted to hire anyone to do any work on the roof of a house. No one is permitted to go up onto a roof of a house. You will be fined.

FYI - CLUBHOUSES GET UPDATED

The Clubhouses and Maintenance office received a long needed update to the phone and internet systems. This update will not have any effect on your home cable or phone systems...just updating the Clubhouses and Maintenance offices.

BUYER BEWARE

When you need to hire someone to do work in your home, be sure to check the insurance and license of the person. The person/company needs to have a recent license by the City of Plantation if their business is in the City. Be sure to see a copy of their insurance to confirm they have coverage.

Whatever you do, **NEVER** hire someone who just knocks on your door and offers to do any/all work for you. This will cost you in the long run for poor workmanship and problems that will arise which they cannot pay for. They may also rip you off and cause more damage to your property.

Do not wait until there is a problem and wish you had hired a licensed/insured worker.

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

March 26, 2018

Well, we dodged an intense storm this year and her name was Irma. I am grateful that it was not worse! Many other areas of Florida are still recovering. Yes, we still have many plex roofs that are tarped and need to be repaired or replaced. Several single-family home roofs were damaged. We lost numerous trees, bushes and the like. We also lost 13 air conditioning compressors units. And, yes, we are still waiting on our insurance companies for a settlement which will allow us to replace or repair the plex roofs. Rest assured we are working diligently with those companies to obtain the best settlement we can.

Last year we replaced 7 fourplex roofs; 6 duplex roofs; 97 single family tile combination roof and flat decks; 10 tile roofs and 1 flat deck. We repaired 67 single family home roofs and 14 plex roofs. As I stated last year, we do have a problem with the single-family home roofs and our accountants are looking into financing for that. We did increase the reserves in this year's budget, but it is clearly not enough.

EDJ Services and Gary Cox Irrigation have completed the irrigation upgrade for Phase I, the plexes. Barbara Bucci and I went on a wet check in January for this Phase and the sprinklers are working as never before and certainly for the better. They are on a timer and work automatically. I am sure we have by now all seen the sprinklers on in Phase I. They are currently working on Phase II in the single-family homes.

We have removed more than 20 trees this year. The City of Plantation mandates that we plant 45 field grown trees in their place. Field Grown trees, as the name suggests, are trees grown directly in the soil and not in pots. Unfortunately, because of Hurricane Irma and the need for communities to replace damaged and destroyed trees, there are no field grown trees available and I am told by Rick from EDJ that we may not be able to obtain field grown trees for many months. I have been in contact with the Plantation Landscaping Department and we are working together to try to resolve this issue.

The red and white impatiens outside the main clubhouse look gorgeous.

We have had to replace the heaters at the satellite pool and spa. Granino Pools replaced the filtering systems for the two spas from chlorine based to salt based which is easier on skin and bathing suits and much healthier. They also re-surfaced both spas. We purchased new umbrellas for our pools.

Vinnie Sciabica is now the chairman of the Hurricane Committee. We need more volunteers so please see Vinnie to sign up to help your neighbors and your Community.

Dead Bug Edwards is performing all our exterminating needs and doing a great job. Last year we tented 49 houses and 11 plexes for termites. Dead Bug Edwards sprays around our homes once a month; tent for termites and remove critters from our homes.

In 2017, we pressure washed and painted 82 single family homes, 10 duplexes and 9 fourplexes. We cleaned over 120 single family home roofs. As you all know, George Hill has been doing an excellent job in organizing and overseeing the painting and cleaning of our homes. Thank you, George. Broward Boys Painters continue to do a fabulous job here in Lauderdale West. We continue our 10-year painting schedule. We anticipate painting 83 single family homes; 10 duplexes and 9 fourplexes this year as well as cleaning over 100 tile roofs.

We completed construction of an ADA bathroom at the Satellite pool.

We installed the new fob security system. If you haven't picked up your new fob, please do so. You must have your Lauderdale West ID card or photo ID to obtain the new fobs and must be an owner.

We traded in one billiard table in the pool room with a new pool table and resurfaced and repaired the remaining pool and billiard tables.

Our Maintenance Department is the absolute best. Our Maintenance Supervisor, Doug Fisher, and Administrative Assistant, Edna Roman, along with Pete, Junior, Mark, Rusty, Danny and our new employee, Sammi, are invaluable. Here are just a few of the jobs they performed this past year:

Repaired many sewer and water lines that have broken.

Pressure washed all plex sidewalks.

Repaired the fascia boards on numerous homes and plexes.

Repaired countless sidewalks.

Trimmed trees, bushes and ground tree roots

Installed two new Bocce ball courts alongside the shuffle board courts.

Installed a new putting green in the former Bocce ball court.

Painted the basketball court.

Of course, they worked very hard in cleaning up after Irma in replacing downed mailboxes and posts; cutting and removing downed trees; repairing pole lights, street sign posts; underground broken pipes; and numerous other repairs.

We completed the mandatory 40-year inspections of our fourplexes! As a safety issue and preventative maintenance, we are performing the same 40-year inspections on all duplexes. When Edna or Mark call to gain access to your unit, please respond promptly. This is in your best interest and the best interest of the Association.

Our maintenance workers went on almost 5,000 (4977 to be exact) service calls for electrical, plumbing, roofing, sprinkler, leaks, replaced shutters, fascia board and soffit repair, termite and pest issues, sign replacement, A/C issues, and handyman issues just to name a few. I want to thank each and every one of them for all their hard work throughout the year. I know that they also went above and beyond to assist our residents.

Our Wish-List for next year is this:

Resurface both parking lots

Resurface tennis courts

Install entry gates at the satellite pool

Replace dark blue tile borders at the main pool

Replace security camera system

Repair deck at main clubhouse lake

New telephone directory

New A/C unit for billiards and ping pong Rooms

New exercise bike for gym

Refurbish the entire satellite club house: bathrooms, ceilings and floors.

Onto our financial situation:

Based on the unaudited December 31, 2017 financial report, the Association ended the year with \$1,191,000 in operating cash; \$475,000 in plex insurance cash; \$1,214,000 in plex reserves and \$1,240,000 in single family home reserves. For the Association as a whole, operating revenues were \$4,863,000 against expense of \$5,023,000 leaving a loss of \$160,205 for the year. Our annual budget is \$5 million dollars.

The deficit is largely due to the fact that we are borrowing funds from our 'rainy day fund' which are funds we have on hand to complete the irrigation upgrade. Since we are paying some \$700,000 now for this work but collecting those funds to repay ourselves over a three-and-a-half-year period, that creates a deficit.

The document amendment package was mailed out on February 12th. It is imperative that you respond now if you haven't already done so. Thank you. This was a major undertaking for our Association and we need your support. I want to thank the following individuals who prepared the mailing for us: Rosemarie Demmons, Micki Gaughan, George Hill, Mark Katcher, Ermina Levy, Arline Marcus, Marlene Newman, Linda Owen, Arline Raschka, Sandy Spector, and Estelle Taylor. And some extra special thanks you to George Hill who went with me to the post office to mail the envelopes. Now onto the thank you's:

The editors and staff of The Lauderdale West News. The purpose of the newsletter is to disseminate pertinent information to our residents and that's exactly what it does. It's not all fun and games here at Lauderdale West. There are many critical issues that must be addressed but the newsletter does certainly entertain us as well.

Sadly, even prior to the price increase in February, attendance was down. We are having a much greater turnout for our party times. We are trying to serve our current population and keep up with the times in our changing Community.

Marlene Newman and the ladies and gentlemen on her committee who make our party times fabulous and Barbara Bucci for obtaining the entertainment – which only gets better.

The men and ladies who stuffed the 1359 election ballot mailings.

Linda Owen, Barbara, Haydee, Estelle, Donna, Connie, Lana, Charlotte, Lydia, Arlene, Joanne, Ron, Dotti, Linda and June who will be counting the ballots for our election.

Last and most importantly, your Board of Directors. You may get tired of hearing this, but it needs repeating: they are extremely hard-working and dedicated to our Community. They put in more hours than you know. We all receive phone calls 24 – 7 from residents and deal with complaints and rarely receive compliments. It is truly a selfless job.

And all the dedicated volunteers who come into the clubhouse each and every day and those that give their time and heart to LW. Without our volunteers, Lauderdale West would not be the community that it is and, honestly, your monthly maintenance would be twice the amount it is if we had paid management.

How about we turn over a new leaf for 2018 by being more neighborly; being more positive, friendly and just plain nice to each other! I am so very tired of all the negativity and complaining not to mention the rumor mill here in Lauderdale West. Let's keep the area around our homes neat and clean. Our patios are not for storage!

SAFETY DO'S

- Let us not give anyone our personal information, especially our social security numbers or bank account numbers
- Let us not walk alone use the buddy system and walk during daylight
- Let us all post our No Solicitation signage and not be afraid to call the Police's nonemergency number (954-797-2100) it is good to be safe rather than sorry.

SWIMMING POOL RULES

This is just a reminder that everyone must follow the posted pool rules, especially:

- Do not prop open a pool area gate
- Shower BEFORE entering the pool as this is a Health Department regulation
- Do allow residents who are swimming laps the right of way if you are just standing, walking or talking in the pool
- · No diving allowed
- Children must be supervised by an adult at all time in the pool area, especially in the water
- · No jumping, running or loud noise in the pool area
- · No food or drink or glass in the pool area
- Vacate the pool area during rain, thunder or lightning sitting under the metal awnings is dangerous

The Lauderdale West Community Association reserves the right to deny the use of the pool or pool area to anyone at any time for just cause.

PEST CONTROL POLICY CHANGE

Dead Bug Edwards has been very generous in their spraying inside units for small ants. As per our contract, Dead Bug Edwards sprays around each and every unit every month. This spray will eliminate the need for inside spraying. There are some rare instances that do require inside spraying and Dead Bug Edwards will take care of these situations. Unfortunately, some of our residents expect monthly sprayings.

Effective immediately, if you have excessive repeat calls for spraying inside for the small ants, due to crumbs or food, etc., you will be allowed 2 inside sprays per year; anything more will be deemed excessive. You will be charged for the spraying, \$115 per spray. Please be sure you clean up and not leave food out or have crumbs which brings ants. Thank you for your cooperation.

LAUDERDALE WEST VIOLATION PROCEDURES AND FINES

When a resident violates a rule, the following is the procedure in the Fining Process:

Procedure:

- 1. A resident in violation will receive an initial letter regarding a maintenance/violation issue.
- 2. A recheck of the property will be performed and if necessary, a second letter is sent regarding incomplete issues.
- 3. If the incomplete issues are not corrected within 15 days from the date of the second letter, Board approval will be obtained and a Certified letter will be sent stating the fine which is to be paid within 30 days from the date of the Certified letter.

This letter will also state that Lauderdale West will proceed to do the work and charge the resident for the work in addition to the fine.

When a resident receives the Certified letter stating the levied fine(s), the resident has the right to a hearing before the LW Fining Committee, within 15 days of receiving the Certified letter.

If the resident would like to request a hearing, the resident needs to go to the Main Clubhouse, fill out the Right to Hearing Form and turn it in to the Board Director overseeing the Fining Committee.

The Fining Committee, which meets two(2) times a month, will make the ultimate decision to confirm or reverse the fine. The Fining Committee is comprised of owners from each of the four(4) phases in Lauderdale West and one additional owner, the Chairperson.

Second or subsequent offense of same violation within six(6) months— automatically doubles the fine.

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TRAVEL SITES THAT SAVE YOU \$\$\$\$

Did you know that according to recent surveys, a majority of Americans would like to take more time off to vacation and travel? If you're like most people, thinking about a family trip or dream destination trip can immediately put a smile on your face.

* Priceline: this site allows you to bid on your hotel room based upon area and star level. To be honest, it used to be much easier to hook a winning bid on Priceline.com and it can be particularly frustrating to spend hours bidding and rebidding. But the good news is sometimes you can luck up.

FLORIDA SOFTSHELL TURTLES

Florida softshell turtles are native to the State of Florida. They have a long neck and an elongated head with a long snorkel-like nose. These turtles also have webbed feet, and huge dark-brown oval shells which are camouflaged to match the bottom of a lake. They can remain hidden under water for hours because of their ability to absorb oxygen. This turtle is the largest softshell turtle in North America reaching over 2 feet in length. The life span is 20 years. Like all softshells, they are very fast-moving in water and on land. This species is carnivorous, consuming fish and insects.

They are mostly aquatic and not often seen on dry land, except when laying eggs or basking in the sun. A female can nest 2-7 times in one season and produce more than 225 eggs per year, more than almost any other reptile species. If the nest survives, in two to three months tiny 1.25 inch hatchlings emerge.

You can easily spot these softshell turtles with their long heads or snouts exposed from the water. Especially during this time of year, they can also be seen out of the water on a sunny day.

BAIT BOXES

Throughout our community there are rodent bait boxes set up by our pest control company, Dead Bug Edwards, to deter/kill rats. We live in a watered community and whenever you have water, you are more susceptible to rats.

Dead Bug Edwards has numbered each box as well as inventories, cleans, and fills each box on a regular basis. They have been put around the perimeter properties as well as on water properties. You, our residents, have been asked not to touch the boxes. If boxes are missing, LW will need to replace them, an expense we hope we do not need.

Dead Bug Edwards is evaluating the situation regularly. If a rodent problem shows up, boxes can be re-placed to be more effective. We ask that you do not need to call requesting a box. Dead Bug Edwards knows where each and every box is located as each box's placement is marked on a large LW map.

These boxes are baited with poison which the rats take back to their nests, hopefully infecting the nest, thus killing more rats. This poison is deadly to your pets, too, if they get into the boxes. As these boxes are throughout the community, around houses and plexes, AGAIN, we ask our residents **NOT** to touch or move these boxes. They are being checked regularly and replenished as needed.

Should you develop a rodent problem, please call Maintenance at 954 473-2595 and report it.

Once again, DO NOT TOUCH these boxes or move them. Thank you.

TOWN HALL MEETING

On Friday, March 2, Debbie Wasserman Schultz, US Representative of Florida's 23rd District, held a Town Hall Meeting here at Lauderdale West, to a group of around 50 people, as a way of giving an update on the status of Social Security and Medicare. She brought with her, Max Richtman, CEO of the National Committee to Preserve Social Security and Medicare. This Committee, along with AARP, are the 2 largest lobbying groups for Seniors; Florida having the largest senior population.

In her introduction, Wasserman-Schultz briefly touched upon the sadness in Parkland and told how she met with a number of the students from Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School and listened to them; their sadness and their suggestions, trying to ensure that a massacre like this won't happen again. These high school students are our future leaders.

Max Richtman, a foremost national expert in the field, elaborated on the steps already taken in Washington to dismantle the Social Security and Medicare programs. Some of the steps mentioned were having their office hours cut; cutting staff, closing offices. Instead of receiving an annual statement, you will now receive one every 5 years and only to those seniors over 60. These things make it harder for seniors and those who are disabled to get the benefits they are entitled to receive. It puts the Meals-on-Wheels program in jeopardy, for some, the only hot meal they receive.

In summing up, Max offered if you have trouble getting through to the Social Security office and were put on hold for a couple of hours, call Debbie Wasserman-Schultz's office at 954-845-1179 for help in making that connection.

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LETTER TO THE EDITOR

In my opinion, last April when as a fait accompli the Board of Directors decided to increase our maintenance I argued that it should be been an assessment. The increase was for \$12 and was supposed to be for only six months, more or less. It was due to the fact that the contract for new sprinklers had not taken into consideration that the sprinkler heads were old and therefore were constantly being damaged and new sprinkler heads were necessary. When something specific occurs (I won't mention why this wasn't included in the original contract) it should be an assessment and in this case would have been approximately \$500 or less per household. But no, not only was it "flushed" through as an increase burt at that Board Meeting which I attended we were told that it would last perhaps six months, we would have no further increase and perhaps even, our HOA maintenance would revert to \$275.00.

I knew otherwise.

Now, of courses, we have "only" a \$13.00 increase and of course we are now paying \$300.00 per month. Has anyone a calculator? Doesn't anyone think that \$25.00 in six months is a "little excessive" especially since we were promised otherwise.

In my opinion, since I have moved here and long since I paid under \$200.00 for my maintenance, the monthly spraying for ants indoors and outdoors has ceased, we have fewer workers cleaning and maintaining the grounds, we are told that if we have so much as more than a couple of times a year for the same "inside the home issue" we will be "charged", we have a newsletter that is replete with "NO" and "NO" and fines and fines for a myriad of minor issues, our houses are no longer painted every five but every seven years (and no it is not lasting with "special paint). And the list is on and on. In sum, we are paying for more and getting far less "bang for the buck". Oh, and I am not even mentioning that years ago of course you were able to pick up your blue garbage bags For Free at the Clubhouse.

In my opinion, I think that the Board might wish to have real input from their fellow owners BEFORE they make financial changes to our community. As a reminder for anyone on Social Security, when was the last time you saw a cost of living increase?

EDITORIAL

LWNews wishes to thank Ms. Waxman for her Letter to the Editor. However, the letter was fact-checked, it was found to have several inaccuracies which are addressed below. What is important to remember, this community is now 45 years old and has age-related needs:

- It was stated at the special budget meeting on April 3, 2017, that the proposed \$12 monthly increase for the upgrading of the irrigation system would continue for 3 ½ years from our 'rainy day fund' and it would take that period of time to repay ourselves. It was for the entire contract, not just new sprinkler heads. We are replacing all the current wiring with a two-wire system, installing four variable frequency drive control panels, replacing over 200 valves and hundreds of sprinkler heads, not to mention repairing and replacing any damaged water lines.
- We cannot predict with accuracy in April what our budget will be for the following year nor can we promise to decrease the maintenance. We certainly did not state that the maintenance payments would revert back to an earlier amount. As we are all aware with our own budgets, just about everything we pay and budget for increases yearly. While the Board tightens the budget for some accounts, others increase and we have no control over that. We know residents are concerned about the cost of our monthly maintenance and the budget, as is each and every member of the Board. Attending our budget meetings, which are open to all and are noticed in the Clubhouse and on our in-house channel 8001, would certainly help people to understand the process and allow residents to give input.
- Dead Bug Edwards, our exterminator, sprays the outside of every home and plex every month. It was determined that we do not need to spray the interior of the homes because of this monthly exterior spraying as opposed to the quarterly spraying of years ago.
- Sadly, there are residents that require multiple interior spraying because some may not be able to notice food particles and the like, left out, which do attract insects into the home; or need multiple drains unplugged. Since these instances could be avoided with careful cleanup, or not disposing of items down a drain or toilet, excessive sprayings and plumbing calls inside eat away at our budget when they could/should be unnecessary.
- We now have a 10 year painting schedule and the paint is lasting longer due to scientific advancements. If not, the painter is obligated per our contract to correct any defects or deficiencies that occur even if that means repainting each and every home in LW again!

- As in any community, either private or civil, there are residents who do not comply with the rules and regulations and we need to fine for these violations. By publishing the violations and their fines in the LWNews, we are hoping to deter residents from incurring a violation thus needing to be fined. On that note, one of the LWNews' purposes is to inform and educate everyone of important issues and concerns and updates within our Community since it is distributed to each and every resident (owner or renter). In each issue, there is a balance of entertainment, also.
- It has been over 14 years since the Association gave away the blue bags. To do so again, it would only increase your maintenance payments accordingly. By purchasing blue bags independently, each resident is paying for only those that he/she uses and the size needed, and not for everyone in the Community.
- Obviously, we have no control over Social Security increases, or lack thereof. Thankfully, we did get a cost of living increase in 2018.

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
